The following sum, or so much thereof as may be б necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department of Health for the 8 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 9 10 \$ 43,467,358.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special 13 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department of Health which is comprised of special source funds collected by 14 or otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of 15 defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal year 16 beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 17 159,060,219.00.\$ 18 SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 19 20 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 21 Treasury to the credit of the Health Care Expendable Fund, created under House Bill No. 519, 1999 Regular Session, for the purpose of 22 defraying the expenses of the State Board of Health for the fiscal 23 year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 24 25 \$ 11,400,000.00. 72 If an employee is currently at or above the end (C) 73 salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall 74 be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any 75 increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the 76 77 effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently 78 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase 79 80 effective the date of the rating.

It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 176 177 State Department of Health may escalate any special funds and 178 positions not to exceed Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00). Such 179 escalation shall be submitted to and approved by the Department of 180 Finance and Administration in the manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds. 181 182 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

Department of Health shall have the authority to expend any special funds collected or otherwise available, notwithstanding any restrictions in the general law or statutes earmarking said funds for a particular use, that are in excess of the amounts needed for the purpose of such fund, for the purpose of providing maternal and child health, family planning and disease control services.

190 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that with 191 the funds provided herein, the State Department of Health may 192 provide and administer without charge, Hepatitis B vaccinations to 193 Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel who are in need of such 194 vaccinations through job related exposure.

195 SECTION 10. In addition to all other sums heretofore 196 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 197 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State H. B. No. 1616 99\HR03\A301SG PAGE 6 198 Treasury to the credit of the Local Governments and Rural Water Systems Emergency Loan Fund, and the Local Governments and Rural 199 200 Water System Improvements Revolving Loan Fund as authorized in Chapter 521, Laws of 1995, to the State Department of Health for 201 202 the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Local Governments and 203 Rural Water Systems Improvements Board, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 204 205 \$ 14,585,860.00

SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that in the event that there are insufficient Child Care Development Block Grant Funds, then the Department of Health shall maintain the Child Care Licensure Program at the same level that the program was in Fiscal Year 1993 using any other funds.

SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One 211 212 Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall come from the Department of 213 Human Services, Child Care Development Fund or other appropriate 214 special funds for the purpose of child care licensure. These 215 funds are to be transferred to the State Department of Health no 216 later than July 31, 1999. The State Department of Health shall make a complete accounting of the uses of these funds to the 217 Department of Human Services. 218

219 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 220 State Department of Health shall expend not more than Fifty 221 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and allocated in Section 3 for providing the oil known as 222 223 "Lorenzo's Oil" for the treatment of the genetic disorder adrenoleukodystrophy (ALD), to children and Mississippi residents 224 over the age of twenty-one (21) who have the genetic disorder 225 226 adrenoleukodystrophy and for whom Medicaid does not reimburse the 227 cost of providing the oil. The department may also provide needed 228 pathology and biannual MRI exams.

229 SECTION 14. In addition to all other funds heretofore 230 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 231 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money deposited in H. B. No. 1616 99\HR03\A301SG

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232 the State Treasury from the Mississippi Tobacco Pilot Program as 233 authorized in the case Mike Moore Attorney General ex rel. State 234 of Mississippi v. The American Tobacco Company et al. (Chancery Court of Jackson County, Mississippi, Cause No. 94-1429) to the 235 236 State Department of Health for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... \$ 8,000,000.00. 237 SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Seven 238 239 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00) are provided for the 240 purpose of purchasing AIDS drugs only and not for educational 241 purposes.

SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated herein, Fifty Thousand 242 243 Dollars (\$50,000.00) is provided for the Osteoporosis Program. 244 SECTION 17. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 245 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 246 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 247 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 248 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 249 250 SECTION 18. This act shall take effect and be in force from 251 and after July 1, 1999.
