HOUSE BILL NO. 1618 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND 1 2 MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 3 2000. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year 8 9 beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 10 \$ 23,998,895.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special 13 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by 14 or otherwise available to the commission, for the support and 15 maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning 16 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 17\$ 10,233,328.00. 18 Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty 19 20 Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund 21 created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State 22 Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth 23 improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of 24 25 the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby, 26 Columbia Training School and colleges and universities.

27 Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work. 28 Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into 29 30 the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such 31 money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund." 32 SECTION 3. Subsidies, Loans and Grants..... 4,500,000.00 45 46 Total.....\$ 34,232,223.00 47 FUNDING: 23,998,895.00 48 General Funds.....\$ 49 Special Funds..... 10,233,328.00 50 34,232,223.00 Total.....\$ AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 51 52 Permanent: Full Time. 649 53 Part Time. 74 54 Time-Limited: Full Time. 0 Part Time. 55 0 56 From the funds provided in the budget category "Personal Services: Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits, " funds may be 57 58 expended for the following purposes, in compliance with the policies established by the State Personnel Board and any 59 60 conditions placed on such expenditures: 61 (a) The components of the Variable Compensation Plan shall be maintained within the constraints of the funds 62 appropriated herein. 63

(b) Funds are provided to adjust the Variable
Compensation Plan, including realignment, to ensure that all
full-time employees with at least six (6) months of continuous
current service, as of June 30, 1999, receive an increase of One
Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). Funds are provided to
adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand
Dollars (\$1,000.00).

(c) If an employee is currently at or above the end 71 72 salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall 73 be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a 74 75 current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the 76 effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently 77 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase 78 79 effective the date of the rating.

It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

91 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 92 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the 93 Capital Outlay: Equipment major object of expenditure, with funds 94 generated from the Forest Acreage Tax in an amount not to exceed 95 Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00), and with funds 96 generated from the sale of old equipment and lease of tower sites

97 an amount not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars

(\$500,000.00). It is further the intention of the Legislature 98 99 that the State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the Subsidies, Loans and Grants major object of 100 101 expenditure, with funds generated from the Severance Tax to fund 102 the Forest Resource Development Program in an amount not to exceed 103 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00). The receipt of these 104 funds is hereby authorized and approved, provided such receipts 105 and expenditures are reported and otherwise accounted for in 106 accordance with Section 27-103-101 et seq. and Section 27-104-1 et 107 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
Committee for Fiscal Year 2001.

137 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 138 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate part-time 139 positions up to one hundred (100) and expend funds not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any source of 140 141 funds that become available to the commission. This escalation shall be in accordance with rules and regulations of the 142 Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent 143 144 with the escalation of federal funds. These positions may be used 145 to protect life and property during extended periods of extreme 146 wildfire occurrences of a minimum of fifty (50) fires per day. The escalation of positions and the expenditure of these funds 147 148 shall be at the discretion of the State Forester, with written notification to the State Personnel Board and the State Fiscal 149 150 Officer.

151 SECTION 7. The Forestry Commission has the authority to 152 purchase from the "General Services Adminsitration" Fire Fighter 153 Catalog.

SECTION 8. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 154 155 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 156 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 157 158 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 159 160 SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1999. 161
