4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:	
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be	
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State	
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and	
8	maintenance of the Department of Environmental Quality for the	
9	fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000	
10	\$ 17,414,882.00.	
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be	
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special	
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of	
14	Environmental Quality which is comprised of special source funds	
15	collected by or otherwise available to the department, for the	
16	support of the various offices of the department for the fiscal	
17	year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000

19	SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions

73	following purposes, in compliance with the policies established by		
74	the State Personnel Board and any conditions placed on such		
75	expenditures:		
76	(a) The components of the Variable Compensation Plan		
77	shall be maintained within the constraints of the funds		
78	appropriated herein.		
79	(b) Funds are provided to adjust the Variable		
80	Compensation Plan, including realignment, to ensure that all		
81	full-time employees with at least six (6) months of continuous		
82	current service, as of June 30, 1999, receive an increase of One		
83	Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). Funds are provided to		
84	adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand		
85	Dollars (\$1,000.00).		
86	(c) If an employee is currently at or above the end		
87	salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall		
88	be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any		
89	increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a		
90	current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the		
91	effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently		
92	receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above		
93	during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase		
94	effective the date of the rating.		
95	It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds		

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- 96 required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal
- 97 Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for
- 98 that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the
- 99 agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 101 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 102 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 103 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 104 Unless expressly authorized herein by the Legislature, no
- 105 funds appropriated shall be expended to pay expenses incurred by
- 106 more than four (4) employees or other representatives of the
- 107 agency for attending the same conference, seminar or workshop,
- 108 either in-state or out-of-state; however, such funds may be
- 109 expended for expenses incurred by more than four (4) employees or
- 110 other representatives for attendance at the same conference,
- 111 seminar or workshop (a) if attendance is required in order to
- 112 maintain professional certification or licensure, which
- 113 certification or licensure is required by the employees' job
- 114 descriptions or by law, or (b) if such expenditure has received
- 115 the prior written approval of the Department of Finance and
- 116 Administration.
- 117 SECTION 4. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 118 Department of Environmental Quality shall have authority to
- 119 escalate the various budgets in both funds and positions, with the
- 120 approval of the State Fiscal Officer, from any special funds
- 121 collected or available, in the current fiscal year or any prior
- 122 fiscal year, not to exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00),
- 123 to the agency for expenditure. Upon such approval, the Department
- 124 of Environmental Quality may expend such funds in the manner
- 125 authorized by law.
- 126 The Executive Director of the Department of Environmental
- 127 Quality shall submit to the Department of Finance and
- 128 Administration a certified statement providing a detailed
- 129 explanation for any escalation, including a justification for the

establishment of any new positions or reclassification of existing positions and the existence of any required matching funds for those positions, and an assessment of the impact on the agency's general fund budget for the three (3) fiscal years following the fiscal year in which the escalation is requested.

SECTION 5. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.

It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 6. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

- SECTION 9. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 204 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 205 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 206 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 207 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 208 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 209 SECTION 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 210 and after July 1, 1999.
