The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 6 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance of the Department of Marine Resources for the fiscal 8 9 year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... \$ 2,704,452.00. 10 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special 13 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Marine Resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and 14 ending June 30, 2000.....\$ 15 3,476,649.00. Of the funds appropriated in this section, Eight Hundred 16 Thousand Dollars (\$800,000.00) is derived from the state excise 17 taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products. 18 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 19 20 Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall be expended for the respective major objects or purpose of 21 22 expenditure: MAJOR OBJECTS OF EXPENDITURE: 23 24 Personal Services: Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits.. \$ 3,113,084.00 25 Travel and Subsistence..... 59,039.00 26

59	salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall

be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase effective the date of the rating.

It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

78 SECTION 4. In addition to all other sums heretofore appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 79 80 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Tidelands Fund No. 3450, to the 81 82 Department of Marine Resources for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Tidelands projects for the fiscal year beginning 83 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... \$ 4,700,000.00. 84 85 Tidelands Projects:

110 December 31 and June 30 to the Commission on Marine Resources on 111 how funds authorized in this section were expended.

It is the intention of the Legislature that any political subdivision seeking to qualify for Tidelands Funds for the subsequent fiscal year shall submit a proposal to the Commission on Marine Resources no later than July 1, 1999.

116 It is the intention of the Legislature that if the amount of 117 Tidelands Funds appropriated in this act exceed the actual amount 118 of Tidelands Funds available, the available funds shall be 119 allocated on a pro rata basis between projects listed in this 120 section.

121 SECTION 5. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 122 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 123 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 124 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 125 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the

126 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 127 SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from 128 and after July 1, 1999.
