HOUSE BILL NO. 1635 (As Passed the House)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND 2 MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS FOR 3 THE FISCAL YEAR 2000.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be б necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for 8 9 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000. 10 .....\$ 15,643,937.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special 13 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source 14 funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for 15 the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year 16 beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 17 .....\$ 43,209,922.00. 18 The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated 19 20 above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to 21 the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning 22 July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... \$6,000,000.00. 23 The State Tax Commission is hereby directed to set aside the 24 25 amount of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it sees fit, out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and 26 27 other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside

from such funds before making distribution thereof. However, provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund, as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of 1972.

Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as authorized by law during Fiscal Year 2000.

SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 36 Section 2 and allocated in Section 5 to the Bureau of Wildlife and 37 Fisheries, funds in the amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand 38 Three Hundred Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived 39 40 from the Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose 41 of defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2000. 42 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 43 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the 44 45 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Three Hundred Fifty 46 47 Thousand Dollars (\$350,000.00) for the purpose of preservation, protection, conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and 48 49 wildlife of this state.

50 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 51 Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall 52 be expended for the respective major objects of such divisions:

To be eligible for any 169 170 increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the 171 172 effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently 173 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase 174 effective the date of the rating. 175

176 It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds 177 required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal 178 Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for 179 that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the 180 agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.

It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive 181 182 Director of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may 183 transfer between the various divisions authorized herein both 184 funds and positions not to exceed five percent (5%) of the 185 authorized budgets in the aggregate. The Executive Director of 186 the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget 187 Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or 188 before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of 189 190 the transfer.

191Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with192the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

197 SECTION 6. The board of supervisors of any county or any 198 group or combination of counties are hereby authorized and 199 empowered to enter into cooperative agreements with each other and 200 with the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the 201 purpose of creating, improving or restoring public game and fish 202 No. 1625

No. 1635 99\HR05\A473CS PAGE 6 202 habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within such 203 county or in an adjoining county; and each county is empowered and 204 authorized, in its discretion, to expend a sum not exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) from the general county 205 206 fund for such purposes from which fund they shall reimburse to the 207 Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the actual cost of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by the Department of 208 209 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental thereto. Such boards of 210 supervisors are further authorized and empowered, in their 211 discretion, to enter into agreements necessary to carry out the 212 purposes of this act with any other county, the United States 213 Forest Service or any other agency if same should be necessary for 214 the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for such purposes. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to 215 216 lease all woodlands now existing on the O'Keefe Division of the 217 Department of Corrections for use of a game preserve and refuge, 218 upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks and the Department 219 220 of Corrections.

The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 221 SECTION 7. 222 is hereby directed to keep an exact accounting of the funds 223 received during each fiscal year by fund and source and an exact 224 accounting of how these funds were expended by fund and 225 program/division. Such information shall be provided to the House and Senate Appropriations Chairmen, Chairman of the House Game and 226 227 Fish Committee and Chairmen of the Senate Wildlife and Fisheries 228 and Senate Ports and Marine Resources Committee no later than October 1 following the end of the fiscal year. 229

230 SECTION 8. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 231 is authorized to enter into an agreement with the Pearl River 232 Valley Water Supply District to provide for financial support of 233 an additional conservation officer on and around the Ross Barnett 234 Reservoir.

235 The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to H. B. No. 1635 99\HR05\A473CS PAGE 7 236 escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and 237 Parks for this purpose.

SECTION 9. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.

244 It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles 245 authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972. 246 247 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the 248 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source, not 249 250 to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00), that may 251 become available to the department in accordance with the rules 252 and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration. None of the funds authorized in this section shall be used to 253 254 increase the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and 255 Fringe Benefits."

SECTION 11. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

SECTION 14. Of the funds provided herein, Two Hundred Fifty 309 Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is provided to the Department of 310 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks above the FY99 level to be expended 311 312 on Wildlife Management Areas, with Fifty Thousand Dollars 313 (\$50,000.00) of this amount for Caney Creek Wildlife Management Area equipment building and pavilion and Fifty Thousand Dollars 314 315 (\$50,000.00) for Hell's Creek Wildlife Management Area creek 316 crossing on the field trail courses, and Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) for Black Prairie Wildlife Management Area 317 creek crossings on the field trail courses. 318

319 SECTION 15. Of the funds provided herein, One Million Fifty 320 Thousand Dollars (\$1,050,000.00) is provided to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for infrastructure at state parks, 321 322 with Two Hundred Thousand (\$200,000.00) of this amount for repairs 323 and renovations to Carver's Point Lodge at Hugh White State Park. 324 SECTION 16. Of the funds provided herein, One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) is provided to the Department of 325 326 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the enhancement of marketing of 327 state parks.

328 SECTION 17. Of the funds provided herein, Sixty Thousand 329 Dollars (\$60,000.00) is provided to the Department of Wildlife, 330 Fisheries and Parks for a facilities coordinator at Roosevelt 331 State Park.

332 SECTION 18. Of the funds provided herein, Two Hundred 333 Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) is provided to the Department of 334 Wildlife, Fisheries and parks for transfer to the Mississippi 335 Authority for Educational Television for a mobile digital 336 production vehicle.

337 SECTION 19. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by H. B. No. 1635 99\HR05\A473CS PAGE 10 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. SECTION 20. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1999.
