The following sum, or so much thereof as may be б necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for 8 9 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000 10\$ 15,673,937.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special 13 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source 14 funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for 15 the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year 16 beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 17\$ 44,359,922.00. 18 The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated 19 20 above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to 21 the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 22 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... \$5,750,000.00. 23 24 The State Tax Commission is hereby directed to set aside the 25 amount of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it sees fit, out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and 26 27 other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside

However, provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund, as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of 1972.

Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as authorized by law during Fiscal Year 2000.

SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 36 Section 2 and allocated in Section 5 to the Bureau of Wildlife and 37 Fisheries, funds in the amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand 38 Three Hundred Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived 39 40 from the Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose 41 of defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2000. 42 SECTION 4. Employees who subsequently 173 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase 174 effective the date of the rating. 175

176 It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds 177 required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal 178 Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for 179 that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the 180 agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

The board of supervisors of any county or any 198 group or combination of counties are hereby authorized and 199 empowered to enter into cooperative agreements with each other and 200 with the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the 201 purpose of creating, improving or restoring public game and fish 202 No. 1625

The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 221 SECTION 7. 222 is hereby directed to keep an exact accounting of the funds 223 received during each fiscal year by fund and source and an exact 224 accounting of how these funds were expended by fund and 225 program/division. Such information shall be provided to the House and Senate Appropriations Chairmen, Chairman of the House Game and 226 227 Fish Committee and Chairmen of the Senate Wildlife and Fisheries 228 and Senate Ports and Marine Resources Committee no later than October 1 following the end of the fiscal year. 229

230 SECTION 8. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 231 is authorized to enter into an agreement with the Pearl River 232 Valley Water Supply District to provide for financial support of 233 an additional conservation officer on and around the Ross Barnett 234 Reservoir.
