1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING  
2 THE EXPENSES OF THE GENERAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS, THE VOCATIONAL AND  
3 TECHNICAL EDUCATION DIVISION OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION  
4 AND THE MISSISSIPPI SCHOOL DISTRICT UNIFORM MILLAGE ASSISTANCE  
5 GRANT PROGRAM FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2000.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

7 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be  
8 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State  
9 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of  
10 defraying the expenses of the State Department of Education, and  
11 excluding the expenses of the Vocational and Technical Education  
12 Division, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending  
13 June 30, 2000..... \$ 82,978,644.00.

14 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be  
15 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special  
16 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department  
17 of Education which is comprised of special source funds collected  
18 by or otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of  
19 defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal year  
20 beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000.....  
21 ..... \$ 588,616,223.00.

22 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of  
23 Section 1 and Section 2, the following positions are authorized:

29 From the funds provided herein, funds may be expended for the  
30 following purposes, in compliance with the policies established by  
31 the State Personnel Board and any conditions placed on such  
32 expenditures:

33 (a) The components of the Variable Compensation Plan  
34 shall be maintained within the constraints of the funds  
35 appropriated herein.

36 (b) Funds are provided to adjust the Variable  
37 Compensation Plan, including realignment, to ensure that all  
38 full-time employees with at least six (6) months of continuous  
39 current service, as of June 30, 1999, receive an increase of One  
40 Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00). Funds are provided to  
41 adjust critical job classes up to an additional One Thousand  
42 Dollars (\$1,000.00).

43 (c) If an employee is currently at or above the end  
44 salary for his or her job classification, then the increase shall  
45 be built into the employee's base salary. To be eligible for any  
46 increase authorized in this section, employees may not have a  
47 current performance rating below "meets expectations" as of the  
48 effective date of the increase. Employees who subsequently  
49 receive a performance rating of "meets expectations" or above  
50 during Fiscal Year 2000 shall receive the salary increase  
51 effective the date of the rating.

52 It is the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds  
53 required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal  
54 Year 2001 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2000 funds appropriated for  
55 that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the  
56 agency's budget by the Mississippi Legislature.

57 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with  
58 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

59 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be  
60 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are

61 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this  
62 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

63 The State Department of Education shall prepare and present  
64 to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee and the Department of  
65 Finance and Administration and make available to the Legislature  
66 an accounting of program expenditures for all programs once at the  
67 beginning of the legislative session and once at the end of the  
68 fiscal year. The department at the same time shall present a  
69 summary report for each program.

70 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2,  
71 Forty-eight Million One Hundred Eighty-six Thousand Four Hundred  
72 Sixty-seven Dollars (\$48,186,467.00) shall be derived from the  
73 School Ad Valorem Reduction Fund and Fifty-nine Million Nine  
74 Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-two Dollars  
75 (\$59,925,832.00) shall be derived from the Education Enhancement  
76 Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31,  
77 Mississippi Code of 1972, for the following purposes:

139 derived from the Technology in Classroom Fund 3203.

140 SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of  
141 Section 2, funds in the amount of One Million Five Hundred One  
142 Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty-six Dollars (\$1,501,726.00) shall  
143 come from income derived from the principal of the Education  
144 Improvement Trust Fund created by Section 206A, Mississippi  
145 Constitution of 1890, and One Million Five Hundred One Thousand  
146 Seven Hundred Twenty-six Dollars (\$1,501,726.00) shall be used for  
147 the School for Math and Science.

148 SECTION 8. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance  
149 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of  
150 the Legislature that the funds provided in Sections 1 and 2 shall  
151 be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to  
152 achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding  
153 authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the  
154 targeted performance measures provided below:

213 which is comprised of special source funds collected by or  
214 otherwise available to the division, for the purpose of defraying  
215 the expenses of the division for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
216 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... \$ 25,567,558.00.

264 year.

265 SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions  
266 of Section 10, Eight Million One Hundred Seventy-eight Thousand  
267 Seven Hundred Forty-six Dollars (\$8,178,746.00) shall be derived  
268 from the Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Sections 27-65-75  
269 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.

270 SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions  
271 of Section 10, One Million Eight Hundred Nine Thousand Two Hundred  
272 Seventy-five Dollars (\$1,809,275.00) shall be derived from  
273 Education Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Section  
274 27-103-203 (1), Mississippi Code of 1972, for the following  
275 purposes:

279 SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that the  
280 Vocational and Technical Education Division of the State  
281 Department of Education shall, with the funds appropriated in  
282 Section 9, transfer no more than One Hundred Thousand Dollars  
283 (\$100,000.00) to the Mississippi Soil and Water Conservation  
284 Commission for the purpose of providing matching funds to purchase  
285 soil conservation equipment.

286 SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 9 and 10,  
287 no more than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is  
288 provided for the purpose of supporting the Future Farmers of  
289 America Center.

290 SECTION 17. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance  
291 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of

292 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized  
 293 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the  
 294 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,  
 295 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted  
 296 performance measures provided below:

312 SECTION 18. In addition to any other funds herein  
 313 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be  
 314 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State  
 315 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Department  
 316 of Education, for the purpose of providing funding for the  
 317 Mississippi School District Uniform Millage Assistance Grant  
 318 Program, the Second Level Funding Program and the Emergency Fund  
 319 Loss Assistance Program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999  
 320 and ending June 30, 2000..... \$ 21,400,000.00.

321 SECTION 19. In addition to all other sums herein  
 322 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be  
 323 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the  
 324 Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and

325 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, not otherwise appropriated, to  
326 the State Department of Education, for the purpose of providing  
327 funding for the Uniform Millage Assistance Grant Program, the  
328 Second Level Funding Program and the Emergency Loss Assistance  
329 Program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending  
330 June 30, 2000..... \$ 15,310,351.00.

331 SECTION 20. With respect to agency programs whose operation  
332 is dependent on the receipt of federal funds, it is the intent of  
333 the Legislature, except as hereinafter provided, that no funds  
334 from the State General Fund be expended to administer, support or  
335 in any way continue such programs should federal funds for their  
336 operation be reduced or become unavailable and that no funds from  
337 the State General Fund available for expenditure under this act  
338 shall be used to replace federal funds in any major object of  
339 expenditure.

340 SECTION 21. It is the intention of the Legislature that the  
341 State Department of Education and Vocational and Technical  
342 Education Division shall maintain complete accounting and  
343 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds  
344 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the  
345 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year  
346 1999. The Department of Finance and Administration shall insure  
347 that financial controls comparable to those utilized for Fiscal  
348 Year 1999 are maintained throughout Fiscal Year 2000 for this  
349 agency. The State Personnel Board shall insure that personnel  
350 controls and records comparable to those utilized for Fiscal Year  
351 1999 are maintained throughout Fiscal Year 2000 for this agency.  
352 It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's  
353 budget request for Fiscal Year 2001 shall be submitted to the  
354 Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail  
355 comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the  
356 Fiscal Year 2000 budget request process.

357 SECTION 22. Any school district receiving conservatorship

358 assistance from the State Department of Education shall pay for  
359 any additional assistance as determined by the State Department of  
360 Education from any source funds available.

361 SECTION 23. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,  
362 funds in the amount of Eight Million Nine Hundred Eighty-five  
363 Thousand Dollars (\$8,985,000.00) are provided for the Industrial  
364 Training Program. No funding obligation or commitment shall be  
365 made on behalf of the state for the Industrial Training Funds  
366 beyond the level of funding made available in this section. All  
367 Industrial Training commitments made in Fiscal Year 2000 and  
368 future fiscal years shall be based only upon funds available in  
369 this section and any proposed commitments shall be approved by the  
370 State Superintendent of Education, or the Superintendent's  
371 designee prior to such commitment being finalized. Industrial  
372 Training Program commitments shall be made and based only upon  
373 training services provided and not for a specific funding amount.  
374 Any expenditures of funds authorized in these sections are  
375 limited to obligations made July 1, 1999, or after, and shall not  
376 be expended for obligations made prior to this date.

377 SECTION 24. Should revenues generated and deposited to the  
378 Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203 (1),  
379 Mississippi Code of 1972, and apportioned pursuant to Section  
380 37-61-33 (6), Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds  
381 appropriated herein from said source, the State Department of  
382 Education shall notify the Department of Finance and  
383 Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced to insure  
384 expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.

385 SECTION 25. Of the funds provided in Section 1 for the  
386 purpose of providing financial assistance for the education of  
387 exceptional children as determined under Section 37-23-63,  
388 Mississippi Code of 1972, children who are certified by the  
389 designated authority as requiring inpatient care in a private  
390 intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded or

391 psychiatric residential treatment facility, with Medicaid  
392 reimbursement, shall be eligible and entitled to receive state  
393 financial assistance under the provisions of Section 37-23-69, in  
394 an amount not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) from  
395 state funds, per child per school year, if an approved private  
396 school is operated as an integral part of the facility which  
397 provides twenty-four (24) hours a day monitoring, treatment and  
398 education, except that the State Department of Education is  
399 authorized to pilot a fee-for-service based cost system for  
400 children served through Millcreek Schools, Inc.

401 SECTION 26. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 in  
402 accordance with Sections 37-31-103 through 37-31-111, Mississippi  
403 Code of 1972, training will be conducted in the areas outlined in  
404 Section 37-31-103 (2) for TANF recipients and subject to agreement  
405 between the Mississippi State Department of Education and the  
406 Mississippi Department of Human Services.

407 SECTION 27. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions  
408 of Sections 1 and 2, the amount of Eighty-eight Million Three  
409 Hundred Two Thousand Seven Hundred Six Dollars (\$88,302,706.00)  
410 shall be derived from the Interim School District Capital  
411 Expenditure Fund for the benefit of the school districts as  
412 authorized in Senate Bill No. 2649, 1997 Regular Session.

413 SECTION 28. Of the funds provided in Section 1, Six Hundred  
414 Thousand Dollars (\$600,000.00) shall be used to provide for a  
415 Director of School Nurses in the State Department of Education and  
416 the implementation of three (3) pilot projects for a variety of  
417 school health programs in an elementary school setting.  
418 Evaluations shall be developed to determine the program's effect  
419 to drop-out rates, suspensions, expulsions, attendance and test  
420 scores.

421 SECTION 29. It is the intention of the Legislature that the  
422 State Department of Education shall have the authority to accept,  
423 budget and expend any source funds not to exceed Thirty Million

424 Dollars (\$30,000,000.00), that become available to the department  
425 to carry out the provisions of those funds in a manner consistent  
426 with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and  
427 Administration.

428 SECTION 30. Funds are provided in this act for the  
429 reallocation of twenty-three (23) positions for an amount not to  
430 exceed Eighty Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-four Dollars  
431 (\$80,334.00).

432 SECTION 31. The State Department of Education shall transfer  
433 the designated amounts to the appropriate entities, which shall  
434 assume full responsibility for the expenditure of these funds in  
435 accordance with state laws and accept all responsibility for any  
436 improper expenditure. For the following: National Guard Youth  
437 Challenge Program, MSU Capital Improvements Project, World Class  
438 Teacher Programs, Writing and Thinking Institute, USM Special  
439 Education Program, Soil and Water Conservation Commission,  
440 Mississippi School Boards Association and Department of Wildlife,  
441 Fisheries and Parks, City of New Albany and Mississippi Eye  
442 Screening Program.

443 SECTION 32. With the funds provided herein, it is the  
444 intention of the Legislature that an amount not to exceed Three  
445 Million Dollars (\$3,000,000.00) may be transferred to the Minimum  
446 Program budget.

447 SECTION 33. With the funds provided herein, it is the  
448 intention of the Legislature that an amount not to exceed One  
449 Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,800,000.00) may be  
450 transferred to the Institutions of Higher Learning for the purpose  
451 of providing certain scholarships for the Mississippi Critical  
452 Teacher Shortage Fund as authorized in House Bill No. 609, 1998  
453 Regular Session.

454 SECTION 34. Of the funds appropriated herein, Fifty Thousand  
455 Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be transferred to the Mississippi Eye  
456 Screening Program for providing vision screening services.

457           SECTION 35. With the funds provided herein, the State  
458 Department of Education shall conduct a study of the Hispanic  
459 school-age population in the state to include number, age,  
460 location, an assessment of needs relative to limited English  
461 speaking abilities and other related information. The study shall  
462 be provided to the Legislature on or before January 1, 2000.

463           SECTION 36. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by  
464 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the  
465 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon  
466 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal  
467 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the  
468 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

469           SECTION 37. This act shall take effect and be in force from  
470 and after July 1, 1999.
