HOUSE BILL NO. 1638

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF 2 EDUCATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE COMMON SCHOOLS OF 3 MISSISSIPPI, FOR THE MINIMUM EDUCATION PROGRAM AND FOR THE 4 EDUCATION OF HOSPITALIZED AND EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN FOR THE FISCAL 5 YEAR 2000.

б BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. The following sums, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 8 9 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Department of Education for the support and maintenance of the common schools 10 11 of Mississippi and for the Minimum Education Program for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000, as 12 13 follows:

SECTION 2. In addition to all other sums heretofore 24 25 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 26 necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the State 27 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Department 28 of Education for the support and maintenance of the common schools 29 of Mississippi and for the Minimum Education Program, for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of State General Funds, 30 as provided in Section 37-19-39, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the 31 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... 32 33 700,000.00.

Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 1999.

37 SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 38 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code 39 of 1972, to the State Department of Education for the purpose of 40 providing Fourteen Million Seven Hundred Seventy-two Thousand 41 42 Eight Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$14,772,820.00) for transportation, 43 Five Million Seven Hundred Thirty-four Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-one Dollars (\$5,734,831.00) for teacher assistants, 44 45 Twenty-six Million Seven Hundred Seventy-one Thousand Eight Hundred Sixty-nine Dollars (\$26,771,869.00) for public school 46 employee health insurance for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 47 1999, and ending June 30, 2000..... \$ 47,279,520.00. 48 49 SECTION 4. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 50 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the Education Enhancement Fund and deposited pursuant to Section 27-103-203 (1), Mississippi 51 52 Code of 1972, for the public school employee health insurance for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000. 53

The above sum is intended to provide a level of support for eighteen thousand one hundred thirty (18,130) regular teacher units, four thousand one hundred (4,100) special education teacher units, seven hundred ten (710) gifted education teacher units, one thousand forty-five (1,045) vocational teacher units and five (5,000) teacher assistant units.

95 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 96 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by general law. 97 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 98 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 99 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 100 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

101 The State Department of Education, in reporting expenditures 102 and disbursements to the Legislature, shall report the amounts 103 expended and disbursed in categories corresponding to the elements 104 outlined in this section.

105 SECTION 6. The State Department of Education is authorized 106 to transfer district allotments for insurance separately from 107 regular Minimum Program allotments to insure funds are received by 108 school districts for timely payment of premiums.

109 SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance

110 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 111 112 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. 156	SECTION 8. Should revenues generated and deposited to the	

Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1), Mississippi Code of 1972, and apportioned pursuant to Section 37-61-33(6), Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds appropriated herein from said source, the State Department of Education shall notify the Department of Finance and Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced to insure expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.

164 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 165 State Department of Education be allowed to receive, budget and

166 expend funds from any source available not to exceed Ten Million 167 Dollars (\$10,000,000.00), that may become available to the 168 department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the 169 Department of Finance and Administration.

170 SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 171 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 172 173 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 174 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 175 SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from 176 177 and after July 1, 1999.
