The State Department of Education, in reporting expenditures 101 102 and disbursements to the Legislature, shall report the amounts expended and disbursed in categories corresponding to the elements 103 104 outlined in this section. SECTION 6. The State Department of Education is authorized 105 106 to transfer district allotments for insurance separately from 107 regular Minimum Program allotments to insure funds are received by 108 school districts for timely payment of premiums. 109 SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 110 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 111 112 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 113 intended mission of this agency. 156	SECTION 8. Should revenues generated and dep	posited to the			
157	Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1),				
158	Mississippi Code of 1972, and apportioned pursuant to Section				
159	37-61-33(6), Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds				
160	appropriated herein from said source, the State Department of				
161	Education shall notify the Department of Finance and				
162	Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced to insure				
163	expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.				

164 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department of Education be allowed to receive, budget and 165 166 expend funds from any source available not to exceed Ten Million 167 Dollars (\$10,000,000.00), that may become available to the 168 department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration. 169 170 SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 171 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 172 173 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 174 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 175 176 SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from

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and after July 1, 1999.
