HOUSE BILL NO. 1638 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF 1 EDUCATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE COMMON SCHOOLS OF 3 MISSISSIPPI, FOR THE MINIMUM EDUCATION PROGRAM AND FOR THE EDUCATION OF HOSPITALIZED AND EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN FOR THE FISCAL 5 YEAR 2000. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. The following sums, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 9 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Department 10 of Education for the support and maintenance of the common schools of Mississippi and for the Minimum Education Program for the 11 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000, as 12 follows: 13 14 For the support and maintenance of the common schools 15 16 (Common School Fund).....\$ 5,000,000.00 An additional sum, to be known as 17 the Minimum Education Program Fund, 18 to be disbursed by the State Department 19 of Education in compliance with the laws 20 21 enacted at the Extraordinary Session 2.2 23 Total......\$1,144,527,977.00 SECTION 2. In addition to all other sums heretofore 2.4 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 25 necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the State 26 2.7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Department

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 101 102 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by general law. No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 103 104 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 105 106 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available. 107 The State Department of Education, in reporting expenditures and disbursements to the Legislature, shall report the amounts 108 109 expended and disbursed in categories corresponding to the elements outlined in this section. 110 SECTION 6. The State Department of Education is authorized 111 to transfer district allotments for insurance separately from 112 113 regular Minimum Program allotments to insure funds are received by 114 school districts for timely payment of premiums. SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance 115 116 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 117 118 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. 162	SECTION 8. Should revenues generated and deposited to the		
163	Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1),		

- 164 Mississippi Code of 1972, and apportioned pursuant to Section
- 165 37-61-33(6), Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds
- 166 appropriated herein from said source, the State Department of
- 167 Education shall notify the Department of Finance and
- 168 Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced to insure
- 169 expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.
- 170 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 171 State Department of Education be allowed to receive, budget and
- 172 expend funds from any source available not to exceed Ten Million
- 173 Dollars (\$10,000,000.00), that may become available to the
- 174 department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the
- 175 Department of Finance and Administration.
- 176 SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 177 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 178 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 179 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 180 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 181 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 182 SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 183 and after July 1, 1999.
