HOUSE BILL NO. 1638
(As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF
2 EDUCATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE COMMON SCHOOLS OF
3 MISSISSIPPI, FOR THE MINIMUM EDUCATION PROGRAM AND FOR THE
4 EDUCATION OF HOSPITALIZED AND EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN FOR THE FISCAL
5 YEAR 2000.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

7 SECTION 1. The following sums, or so much thereof as may be
8 necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
9 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Department
10 of Education for the support and maintenance of the common schools
11 of Mississippi and for the Minimum Education Program for the
12 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000, as
13 follows:

14	For the support and maintenance	
15	of the common schools	
16	(Common School Fund).....	\$ 5,000,000.00
17	An additional sum, to be known as	
18	the Minimum Education Program Fund,	
19	to be disbursed by the State Department	
20	of Education in compliance with the laws	
21	enacted at the Extraordinary Session	
22	of 1953, as amended.....	<u>\$1,139,527,977.00</u>
23	Total.....	\$1,144,527,977.00

24 SECTION 2. In addition to all other sums heretofore
25 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
26 necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the State
27 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Department

28 of Education for the support and maintenance of the common schools
29 of Mississippi and for the Minimum Education Program, for the
30 purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of State General Funds,
31 as provided in Section 37-19-39, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the
32 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000.....
33 \$ 700,000.00.

34 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the
35 provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended
36 exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 1999.

37 SECTION 3. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
38 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the Education Enhancement
39 Fund pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code
40 of 1972, to the State Department of Education for the purpose of
41 providing Fifteen Million Four Hundred Thirty-nine Thousand Six
42 Hundred Ninety-four Dollars (\$15,439,694.00) for transportation,
43 Five Million Seven Hundred Thirty-four Thousand Eight Hundred
44 Thirty-one Dollars (\$5,734,831.00) for teacher assistants,
45 Twenty-eight Million Four Hundred Ninety-one Thousand One Hundred
46 Sixty-five Dollars (\$28,491,165.00) for public school employee
47 health insurance for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1999, and
48 ending June 30, 2000..... \$ 49,665,690.00.

49 SECTION 4. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
50 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the Education Enhancement
51 Fund and deposited pursuant to Section 27-103-203 (1), Mississippi
52 Code of 1972, to the State Department of Education for the purpose
53 of providing Twenty Million Two Hundred Fifty-four Thousand One
54 Hundred Forty-three Dollars (\$20,254,143.00) for the public school
55 employee health insurance Two Million Three Hundred Sixty-seven
56 Thousand Nine Hundred Fifteen Dollars (\$2,367,915.00) for
57 additional supportive services for the fiscal year beginning July
58 1, 1999, and ending June 30, 2000.....
59 \$ 22,622,058.00.

60 SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated to the Minimum
61 Education Program Fund under the provisions of Sections 1, 2, 3
62 and 4, the estimated amount that shall be expended in each of the
63 following elements of the Minimum Education Program shall be:

95 The above sum is intended to provide a level of support for
96 eighteen thousand one hundred thirty (18,130) regular teacher
97 units, four thousand one hundred (4,100) special education teacher

98 units, seven hundred ten (710) gifted education teacher units, one
99 thousand forty-five (1,045) vocational teacher units and five
100 thousand (5,000) teacher assistant units.

101 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
102 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by general law.

103 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
104 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
105 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
106 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

107 The State Department of Education, in reporting expenditures
108 and disbursements to the Legislature, shall report the amounts
109 expended and disbursed in categories corresponding to the elements
110 outlined in this section.

111 SECTION 6. The State Department of Education is authorized
112 to transfer district allotments for insurance separately from
113 regular Minimum Program allotments to insure funds are received by
114 school districts for timely payment of premiums.

115 SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
116 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
117 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
118 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
119 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
120 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
121 performance measures provided below:

158 A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets
159 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
160 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
161 Committee for Fiscal Year 2001.

162 SECTION 8. Should revenues generated and deposited to the
163 Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203(1),

164 Mississippi Code of 1972, and apportioned pursuant to Section
165 37-61-33(6), Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds
166 appropriated herein from said source, the State Department of
167 Education shall notify the Department of Finance and
168 Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced to insure
169 expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.

170 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
171 State Department of Education be allowed to receive, budget and
172 expend funds from any source available not to exceed Ten Million
173 Dollars (\$10,000,000.00), that may become available to the
174 department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the
175 Department of Finance and Administration.

176 SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
177 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
178 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
179 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
180 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
181 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

182 SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from
183 and after July 1, 1999.
