HOUSE BILL NO. 1726

1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE TOWN OF FALKNER, MISSISSIPPI, TO 2 PURCHASE THE WATER SYSTEM OF THE BLACKJACK DEVELOPMENT 3 ASSOCIATION, INCORPORATED; TO AUTHORIZE THE SALE OF THE ASSETS OF 4 THE WATER SYSTEM BY THE ASSOCIATION; TO AUTHORIZE AN ELECTION ON 5 THE TRANSACTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. б BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. (1) The governing authority of the Town of 8 Falkner, Mississippi, in its discretion, may (a) purchase and operate the water distribution center that is now owned and 9 10 operated by Blackjack Development Association, Inc., and is 11 located in Benton County, Mississippi; and (b) purchase from Blackjack Development Association, Inc., all of the assets of 12 13 Blackjack Development Association, Inc., including, but not 14 limited to the pipelines, pumps, motors, water treatment equipment, valves, controls, and meters, rights-of-way, easements, 15 leases, land, permits, licenses, franchises, water, water rights, 16 water stock, accounts receivable, cash on hand, and each and every 17 asset of the water system. 18 (2) As consideration for the purchase of the water system, 19 the Town of Falkner may assume and faithfully carry out all of the 20 21 terms, conditions and obligations of the following Deed of Trust executed by Blackjack Development Association, Inc.: 2.2 A certain Deed of Trust to Talmadge L. Finch, as trustee 23 for the United States of America, dated October 26, 24 1987, and evidencing an original indebtedness 25 aggregating \$147,000.00 and bearing interest at the rate 26 of 5.875% per annum, the Deed of Trust recorded in Trust 27

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Deed Book 105, page 34 in the office of the Chancery 28 29 Clerk of Benton County, Mississippi.

30 The Town of Falkner may assume and faithfully carry out (3) all of the terms and conditions and obligations of Blackjack 31 32 Development Association, Inc., to the United States of America, described and enumerated in the deed of trust described in 33 34 subsection (2) of this section.

The Town of Falkner, in payment of its obligations 35 (4) incurred in the purchase and operation of any such water system, 36 37 may use only the revenues derived by it from the operation of the 38 water system.

(5) The authority granted by this act for the purchase and 39 40 operation of a water distribution system and the assumption of certain obligations shall not be exercised until notice of 41 intention to make the purchase and assume those obligations, 42 setting out the amount and other terms and conditions of the 43 44 proposed transaction, has been given by publication once a week for three (3) consecutive weeks in a local newspaper published in 45 the municipality or, if no such newspaper is published in the 46 47 municipality, then in some newspaper having a general circulation in the municipality. After ten (10) days from the last 48 49 publication of the notice, the governing authority may exercise 50 the authority granted by this act unless within ten (10) days after the last publication of the notice, a petition signed by not 51 52 less than twenty percent (20%) of the qualified voters of the municipality is filed objecting to and protesting against the 53 54 transaction, in which event the transaction shall not be made 55 unless submitted to a special election order for the purpose of determining whether or not a majority of those voting in such an 56 57 election vote for or against the transaction. The election shall be ordered held not later than forty (40) days after the date of 58 the last notice of the proposed transaction. Notice of the 59 election that states the purpose of the election shall be 60 published once each week for three (3) consecutive weeks next 61 62 proceeding the time for holding the election in such a newspaper, 63 as provided in this subsection. The laws governing municipal 64 elections shall govern the order and conduct of the election.

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Nothing in this subsection shall prevent the governing authority from calling an election, whether required by petition of twenty percent (20%) of the qualified voters or not.

68 (6) Any indebtedness assumed by the Town of Falkner under
69 this act shall not be including the debt liability of the
70 municipality under any present or future law.

SECTION 2. The governing authority of the Town of Falkner shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

78 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 79 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 80 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
