COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1749

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF MAYOR AND COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF CLARKSDALE, MISSISSIPPI, TO CREATE THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE DELTA BLUES MUSEUM; TO PROVIDE FOR QUALIFICATIONS, 3 TERMS AND APPOINTMENTS OF BOARD MEMBERS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE 5 CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF PROPERTY; TO PROVIDE FOR THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES; TO PROVIDE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE POWERS AND AUTHORITY OF THE CITY 6 7 OF CLARKSDALE UNDER THIS ACT; TO PROVIDE FOR THE CONTROL OF FUNDS; 8 9 TO AUTHORIZE THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF A TAX FOR CONSTRUCTING, 10 SUPPORTING AND MAINTAINING THE DELTA BLUES MUSEUM; TO AUTHORIZE 11 THE ISSUANCE OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS FOR CONSTRUCTION, REPAIR, 12 REMODELING, EQUIPPING, FURNISHING, ADDING TO OR IMPROVING CAPITAL FACILITIES AND/OR EXHIBITS OF THE DELTA BLUES MUSEUM; TO PROVIDE 13 14 FOR A REVERSE REFERENDUM ELECTION PROCEDURE WITH REGARD TO THE TAX LEVY OR THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE DISPOSITION AND 15 16 UTILIZATION OF PROPERTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 18 SECTION 1. The Mississippi Legislature recognizes the Delta 19 Blues Museum of Clarksdale, Mississippi, begun by the Board of Trustees of the Carnegie Public Library more than twenty (20) 20 years ago for the purpose of honoring Mississippians and others 21 2.2 who have made significant contributions to Mississippi and to the 23 musical art form commonly known as the "Blues" through their music. The Mississippi Legislature further recognizes the 24 25 preeminence of the Delta Blues Museum as a leading facility in the 26 world of blues music. The Mississippi Legislature further 27 recognizes that the Delta Blues Museum is of great economic and 28 cultural importance to the City of Clarksdale, to Coahoma County, 29 and to the Delta region of the State of Mississippi, and is of 30 potential great economic and cultural importance to the entire 31 State of Mississippi. 32 SECTION 2. (1) The management and control of the Delta

Blues Museum shall be vested in a board of five (5) trustees, who

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- 34 shall be appointed by the Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the
- 35 City of Clarksdale, Mississippi. The first appointments shall be
- 36 for terms of one, two, three, four and five years, respectively,
- 37 and thereafter, a trustee shall be appointed to serve a five-year
- 38 term.
- 39 (2) Each trustee shall be a resident and qualified elector
- 40 of the City of Clarksdale, Mississippi. After the initial term,
- 41 if the initial term is for less than five (5) years, trustees
- 42 shall be limited to two (2) consecutive terms of office; provided,
- 43 however, there shall be no limit on the total number of terms
- 44 served by a trustee.
- 45 (3) Vacancies on the Board of Trustees of the Delta Blues
- 46 Museum shall be filled for unexpired terms by action of the Board
- 47 of Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale.
- 48 (4) Any trustee who shall not attend three (3) consecutive
- 49 meetings of the board of trustees shall be subject to removal by
- 50 the Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale.
- 51 (5) No trustee shall receive a salary or other compensation
- 52 for his or her service; provided, however, that all trustees shall
- 53 be reimbursed for their necessary travel expenses and mileage
- 54 incident to their attendance upon the business of the board of
- 55 trustees, as provided by Section 25-3-41, Mississippi Code of
- 56 1972.
- 57 SECTION 3. All property, real and personal, of and utilized
- 58 or acquired by the Delta Blues Museum which is under the
- 59 operation, control and management of the Board of Trustees of the
- 60 Delta Blues Museum shall be and remain the property of the City of
- 61 Clarksdale, Mississippi.
- 62 SECTION 4. (1) The Board of Trustees of the Delta Blues
- 63 Museum, immediately after their appointment, shall meet and
- 64 organize by the election of such officers as they deem necessary,
- 65 which may include a chairman, one or more vice chairmen, a
- 66 secretary and a treasurer. They shall (a) adopt such bylaws,
- 67 rules and regulations for their own guidance in the government of
- 68 the Delta Blues Museum as they deem expedient; (b) meet at least
- once in each month; (c) have the supervision, care and custody of
- 70 all property of the Delta Blues Museum, including the building or

71 buildings leased, designated or set apart therefor; (d) may, in 72 their discretion, employ a director, a curator and such other 73 staff as may be necessary, prescribe their duties, fix their compensation and remove them, with or without cause; (e) submit 74 75 annually to the Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City of 76 Clarksdale a budget containing estimates of income and expenses 77 for the ensuing year; (f) have exclusive control of the finances of the Delta Blues Museum; (g) accept such gifts of money or 78 79 property for museum purposes and under such conditions as they 80 deem expedient; (h) purchase exhibits, equipment, insurance, 81 supplies and other items incident to the operation, maintenance 82 and control of the Delta Blues Museum as they, in their 83 discretion, deem necessary; (i) dispose of equipment and discarded 84 or surplus museum materials as provided in Section 19-7-5, Mississippi Code of 1972; (j) enter into agreements with such 85 86 consultants, architects, engineers, museum designers, public 87 relations, media relations, web designers, fundraisers, promoters 88 and such other firms and organizations necessary to design, 89 construct, maintain and promote the Delta Blues Museum; and (k) do 90 all other acts necessary for the orderly and efficient management 91 and control of the Delta Blues Museum. However, no expenditure made or contracted by the Board of Trustees of the Delta Blues 92 93 Museum shall be binding upon the City of Clarksdale so as to require any payment in excess of funds made available for Delta 94 95 Blues Museum purposes by the Board of Mayor and Commissioners of 96 the City of Clarksdale.

97 (2) The Board of Trustees of the Delta Blues Museum is
98 authorized and empowered to employ a director and/or a curator for
99 the Delta Blues Museum, who shall have such educational
100 qualifications as may be prescribed by the board of trustees. The
101 board of trustees may, from time to time, combine the positions of
102 director and curator, or may keep them separate, as the board of
103 trustees, in its discretion, deems in the best public interest.

- 104 (3) The director shall administer and establish procedures according to policies established by the board of trustees. 105 106 or her duties shall include: (a) recommendations relative to the employment of staff, with the final decision and approval to be 107 108 made by the board of trustees; (b) prescription of staff duties; (c) recommendation of removal or discharge of staff, which final 109 110 decision shall be that of the board of trustees; (d) preparation of the budget; (e) financial and statistical management; (f) 111 112 reporting to the board of trustees; and (g) other acts necessary 113 for the orderly and efficient administration of the Delta Blues 114 Museum.
- The board of trustees is authorized to insure all 115 (4) property used in the operation of the Delta Blues Museum, 116 including buildings, furniture, exhibits, memorabilia, books and 117 records, and the like against loss by fire, wind, water, theft and 118 119 other perils commonly insured against, and to carry a sufficient 120 amount of employer's liability, worker's compensation and other insurance as, in the discretion of the board of trustees, may be 121 122 deemed proper, and to pay the premiums therefor out of the funds 123 available to it, including funds derived from the operation of the 124 Delta Blues Museum.
- 125 (5) The board of trustees may enter into agreements with
 126 other museums, individuals, corporations and other business
 127 entities, and other governmental entities, for the acquisition,
 128 display, movement, transfer and relocation of exhibits, upon such
 129 terms and conditions and for such consideration as the board of
 130 trustees may, from time to time, in its discretion, determine to
 131 be in the best interests of the Delta Blues Museum.
- (6) The board of trustees may establish an admission fee or charge, or may, at its discretion, waive such admission fee or charge to residents of the City of Clarksdale and/or Coahoma

 County, Mississippi. The board of trustees shall have the right, from time to time, to modify such admission fees, to provide for

- 137 group discounts or to waive such fees in their entirety, as the
- 138 board of trustees, in its discretion, deems appropriate.
- 139 (7) The board of trustees may determine and require
- 140 reasonable reimbursements to be collected for the provision of
- 141 special museum services.
- 142 (8) The board of trustees may accept in the name of the
- 143 museum gifts or donations of money, real estate, exhibits, music,
- 144 books, periodicals or other property for the purpose of promoting
- 145 the work of the Delta Blues Museum, and may accept and administer
- 146 any funds which might be provided by state or federal government
- 147 for such purposes.
- 148 (9) The board of trustees may accept loans of exhibits,
- 149 photographs, musical instruments, books, periodicals, memorabilia,
- 150 collections and other items of interest to be displayed upon such
- 151 conditions as the board of trustees may deem appropriate, and may
- 152 insure the same and pay the premiums therefor, which shall not be
- 153 considered as a donation.
- 154 (10) The Board of Trustees of the Delta Blues Museum shall
- 155 advertise for competitive bids in the manner and form as is
- 156 required by Section 31-7-13, Mississippi Code of 1972. The board
- 157 of trustees shall not be required to comply with the competitive
- 158 bid requirements of Section 31-7-13, relative to the acquisition
- 159 of museum exhibits and professional services.
- 160 (11) The board of trustees may enter into professional
- 161 services contracts and agreements with architects, engineers,
- 162 museum designers, consultants, media and public relations
- 163 consultants, fundraisers, web and Internet designers and
- 164 consultants, and other professional service providers under such
- 165 terms and conditions as the board of trustees, in its discretion,
- 166 may determine to be in the best interest of the Delta Blues
- 167 Museum.
- 168 (12) The board of trustees may design, publish and maintain
- 169 a website for the Delta Blues Museum, and pay the costs incident

- 170 thereto from its available funds.
- 171 (13) The board of trustees shall install and maintain proper
- 172 books of records and accounts, separate entirely from other
- 173 records and accounts of the City of Clarksdale, in which correct
- 174 entries shall be made of all dealings or transactions of or in
- 175 relation to the properties, business and affairs of the Delta
- 176 Blues Museum.
- 177 (14) The board of trustees may cause the operation of a
- 178 museum gift shop, and sell for profit books, recordings, posters,
- 179 t-shirts and similar items.
- 180 (15) The board of trustees may, in its discretion, promote
- 181 the Delta Blues Museum by (a) sponsoring live events, concerts or
- 182 other public performances, (b) entering into contracts with
- 183 management companies, lighting, stage and sound providers,
- 184 promoters, public relations and media relations companies, and
- 185 such other service providers as may be necessary for such
- 186 promotions, and (c) sponsoring photographic, art and music
- 187 exhibits, performances, workshops and such other functions as will
- 188 continue to promote and foster the development of the blues.
- 189 (16) The board of trustees may, in its discretion, create
- 190 and offer various programs, including, but not limited to, an
- 191 educational component to teach music, music appreciation, and to
- 192 promote a better understanding of the blues, and may employ
- 193 persons specifically for those purposes.
- 194 (17) The board of trustees may, in its discretion, enter
- 195 into agreements with other museums, educational institutions or
- 196 the like, to exchange, display or loan exhibits, and may institute
- 197 and implement satellite and/or traveling exhibits.
- 198 SECTION 5. (1) Quarterly Reports. The Board of Trustees of
- 199 the Delta Blues Museum shall report quarterly to the Board of
- 200 Mayor and Commissioners on all of its actions and transactions of
- 201 every kind whatsoever, which report shall also contain a detailed
- 202 statement of the financial condition of the Delta Blues Museum.

203 (2) Annual Reports. At the close of each year, the board of trustees shall make a report to the Board of Mayor and 204 205 Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale, showing the condition of 206 the trust during the year, the sums of money received for the 207 Delta Blues Museum fund from taxes and all other sources, the sums 208 of money expended and the purposes of the expenditures, the number 209 of the exhibits on hand, the number added during the year, the 210 number disposed of, the number of visitors to the Delta Blues 211 Museum, and such other statistics and information, and such 212 suggestions, as the board of trustees deems in the public 213

- 214 SECTION 6. The Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale is hereby specifically granted the power and 215 216 authority:
- 217 To create the Board of Trustees of the Delta Blues 218 Museum as specified in Section 2 of this act and to appoint the 219 members thereof.
- 220 (b) To acquire all real property necessary for the 221 development and expansion of the Delta Blues Museum, and to erect buildings and structures thereon to house the museum, its 222 223 exhibits, gift shops and related facilities.
- 224 (c) To create an advisory board, to consist of such number of members as it, in its discretion, deems in the best 225 226 interests of the Delta Blues Museum. Members of the advisory board may reside within or without the City of Clarksdale and/or 227 228 the State of Mississippi, and may include a broad cross section, including musicians, managers, authors, publishers, members of the 229 business community, academies or otherwise, to provide advice to 230 231 the board of trustees as to the design, operation, promotion, management, finances and future growth of the Delta Blues Museum. 232 233 No person may serve simultaneously as a member of the board of trustees and of the advisory board. The Board of Mayor and 234 235 Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale may determine the terms of

interest.

236 service of members of the advisory board.

237 (d) To develop, construct and promote "Blues Alley" as
238 an entertainment district in which the Delta Blues Museum is
239 situated, and to make such rules and regulations relative thereto

240 as may be in the best interests of the City of Clarksdale.

(e) To enter into agreements with other local
governments, including, without limitation, the Board of
Supervisors of Coahoma County and the Coahoma County Tourism
Commission, to provide funds, property, buildings, exhibits and
other support to the Delta Blues Museum.

246 (f) To lease or furnish space to the Delta Blues 247 Museum, for such period of time as the governing authorities determine. The benefit to the City of Clarksdale from the 248 249 operation of such lease shall be considered as sufficient 250 consideration. The lease may be exercised for a nominal fee, and 251 it shall be presumed that such lease shall not amount to a 252 donation of municipal property. The consideration may be adjusted, from time to time, upon agreement of the Board of Mayor 253 254 and Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale and the Board of 255 Trustees of the Delta Blues Museum.

(g) To create a Hall of Fame and/or Walk of Fame, 256 257 honoring substantial contributors to blues music, by photograph, 258 bias relief, statue, or such other recognition as the Board of 259 Mayor and Commissioners, in its discretion, deems appropriate, and 260 to expend municipal funds therefor. The Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale and the Board of Trustees 261 262 of the Delta Blues Museum may coordinate such efforts as the 263 boards deem appropriate.

(h) To adopt such ordinances and resolutions and to do
all things and perform all acts necessary, proper or desirable to
effectuate the full intent and purposes of these sections,
including the authority to borrow money and issue negotiable notes
or certificates of indebtedness therefor under the provisions

269 hereof.

SECTION 7. (1) The Board of Trustees of the Delta Blues

Museum shall have full jurisdiction of all funds coming into its

possession, either by appropriation of the governing authorities

of the City of Clarksdale, or by gift, or by revenue derived from

the operation of the Delta Blues Museum, its gift shop or from the

sale of merchandise, and shall have the authority to make all

contacts in relation thereto.

(2) The Board of Trustees of the Delta Blues Museum shall devote all monies derived by appropriation from the municipal governing authorities, by gift, by revenue or from any other source, for the payment of all maintenance and operation expenses, the operation of the Delta Blues Museum, the purchase of equipment, exhibits and artifacts, the repair and replacement thereof, and the extension of museum facilities, services and programs for the benefit of the citizens and patrons of the Delta Blues Museum.

SECTION 8. The Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale is hereby authorized, in its discretion, to levy and collect not more than three (3) mills on all taxable property in the City of Clarksdale annually for the purpose of constructing, supporting and maintaining the Delta Blues Museum. The funds so collected by said tax shall be used for no purpose except as provided in this act.

SECTION 9. (1) The Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale is hereby authorized and empowered to, at one (1) time or from time to time, issue general obligation bonds of the City of Clarksdale, Mississippi, to provide funds for construction, repair, remodeling, equipping, furnishing, adding to or improving the capital facilities and/or exhibits of the Delta Blues Museum. The issuance of bonds under this provision shall be preceded by the adoption of a resolution by the Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale, declaring the necessity

- 302 for the issuance of general obligation bonds under the authority
- 303 contained in this section. The total outstanding amount of bonds
- 304 issued hereunder shall not exceed Two Million Dollars
- 305 (\$2,000,000.00) at any one time.
- 306 (2) The proceeds of bonds issued hereunder shall be used
- 307 solely for the benefit of the Delta Blues Museum, including
- 308 capital improvements, exhibit acquisition and development, and the
- 309 costs incident to the issuance and sale of such bonds.
- 310 (3) All bonds issued under this section shall be legal
- 311 investments for trustees and other fiduciaries and for savings
- 312 banks, trust companies and insurance companies organized under the
- 313 laws of the State of Mississippi, and such bonds shall be legal
- 314 securities that may be deposited with and shall be received by all
- 315 public officers and bodies of this state and all municipalities
- 316 and political subdivisions for the purpose of securing the deposit
- 317 of public funds.
- 318 (4) The bonds authorized under the authority of this section
- 319 may be validated in the Chancery Court of Coahoma County,
- 320 Mississippi, in the manner and with the force provided by Chapter
- 321 13, Title 31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the validation of
- 322 municipal and other bonds. A notice to taxpayers required by such
- 323 statutes shall be published in a newspaper published or having a
- 324 general circulation in the City of Clarksdale, Mississippi.
- 325 (5) Bonds issued under this section and income from the
- 326 bonds shall be exempt from all taxation in the State of
- 327 Mississippi.
- 328 (6) The bonds issued under the provisions of this section
- 329 are general obligations of the City of Clarksdale, Mississippi,
- 330 and for the payment thereof, the full faith and credit of the City
- 331 of Clarksdale may irrevocably be pledged. If the funds
- 332 appropriated by the Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City
- 333 of Clarksdale are insufficient to pay the principal of and the
- 334 interest on such bonds as they become due, then the deficiency

335 shall be paid by the city clerk from any funds in the city treasury not otherwise appropriated. All such bonds issued 336 337 hereunder shall contain recitals on their faces substantially 338 covering the provisions of this section. 339 The principal of and interest on the bonds authorized 340 hereunder shall be payable in the manner provided in this section. Such bonds shall bear such date or dates, be in such denomination 341 342 or denominations, bear interest at such rate or rates not 343 exceeding the limits set forth in Section 75-17-101, Mississippi 344 Code of 1972, be payable at such place or places within or without the State of Mississippi, shall mature absolutely at such time or 345 346 times, not to exceed twenty (20) years from the date of issue, be 347 redeemable before maturity at such time or times, and upon such terms, with or without premium, shall bear such registration 348 privileges, and shall be substantially such form, all as 349 350 determined by resolution of the Board of Mayor and Commissioners 351 of the City of Clarksdale. SECTION 10. (1) The Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the 352 353 City of Clarksdale is hereby authorized and empowered, if it so 354 desires, to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of the municipally 355 owned real and personal property utilized or acquired by the Delta 356 Blues Museum, on such terms and conditions, and with such 357 safeguards as will best promote and protect the public interest. 358 In the event of the sale of real property, the Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale shall comply with the 359 360 requirements of Section 21-17-1, Mississippi Code of 1972. In the 361 event of the sale or disposition of personal property, the Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale may dispose 362 of the same on such terms and conditions as it deems in the public 363 interest, including, without limitation, sale, lease or donation; 364 365 provided, however, that any donations shall only be to bona fide not-for-profit entity complying in all respects with Section 366 367 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. The Board of Mayor

368 and Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale is specifically

369 authorized to enter into donation agreements with the Board of

370 Trustees of the Carnegie Public Library relative to the

371 disposition of personal property utilized in the operation of the

- 372 Delta Blues Museum.
- 373 (2) The Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City of
- 374 Clarksdale, in the event of a sale, may use the proceeds of such
- 375 sale, or any part thereof, for the purpose of retiring and paying
- 376 off any public debt of the municipality incurred by the ownership
- 377 or operation of the Delta Blues Museum, or may invest said funds
- 378 or any part thereof derived from the sale in such lawful
- investments as may, from time to time, be designated by the
- 380 Mississippi Legislature for public bodies.
- 381 SECTION 11. This act shall be liberally construed so as to
- 382 promote the efficient maintenance and operation of the Delta Blues
- 383 Museum to the end that it may result in the improvement of the
- 384 general health, entertainment and welfare of the citizens of the
- 385 City of Clarksdale and of the State of Mississippi.
- 386 SECTION 12. If at any time before the date the tax described
- 387 in Section 8 is to be levied, or before the date the bonds
- 388 described in Section 9 are to be issued, a petition signed by
- twenty percent (20%), or fifteen hundred (1,500), whichever is
- 390 less, of the qualified electors residing within the City of
- 391 Clarksdale is filed with the Board of Mayor and Commissioners of
- 392 the City requesting an election to be held within the city upon
- 393 the proposition, then the Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the
- 394 City of Clarksdale shall adopt a resolution calling an election to
- 395 be held within the city. The election shall be called upon at
- 396 least three (3) weeks' notice by publication of the proposition at
- 397 least once a week for three (3) consecutive weeks in a newspaper
- 398 having general circulation in the City of Clarksdale.
- 399 The election to approve the tax or bonds shall be held, as
- 400 far as is practicable, in the same manner as other elections are

- 401 held in cities. At the election, all qualified electors who
- 402 reside in the City of Clarksdale may vote. When the results of
- 403 the election have been canvassed by the election commissioners of
- 404 the city and certified by them to the Board of Mayor and
- 405 Commissioners of the City of Clarksdale, it shall be the duty of
- 406 the board to determine and adjudicate whether or not a majority of
- 407 the qualified electors residing in the city who voted in the
- 408 election voted in favor of the proposition or against the
- 409 proposition. If a majority of the qualified electors residing in
- 410 the city who voted in the election vote in favor of the
- 411 proposition, then the proposition shall be authorized.
- SECTION 13. The Board of Mayor and Commissioners of the City
- 413 of Clarksdale shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by
- 414 the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a
- 415 veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the
- 416 United States District Court for the District of Columbia in
- 417 accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965,
- 418 as amended and extended.
- SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 420 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
- 421 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
