HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 39

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION CLAIMING SOVEREIGNTY FOR MISSISSIPP

- 2 UNDER THE 10TH AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION OVER
- 3 POWERS NOT GRANTED TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.
- WHEREAS, the 10th Amendment to the Constitution of the United
- 5 States reads as follows:
- 6 "The powers not delegated to the United States by the
- 7 Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the states, are reserved to
- 8 the states respectively, or to the people."; and
- 9 WHEREAS, the 10th Amendment defines the total scope of
- 10 federal power as being that specifically granted by the United
- 11 States Constitution and no more; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the scope of power defined by the 10th Amendment
- 13 means that the federal government was created by the states
- 14 specifically to be an agent of the states; and
- WHEREAS, today, in 1999, the states are treated as agents of
- 16 the federal government; and
- 17 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Legislature has forwarded many
- 18 resolutions to Congress without any response or result from
- 19 Congress or the federal government; and
- 20 WHEREAS, many federal mandates are directly in violation of
- 21 the 10th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States; and
- 22 WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court ruled in New York v.
- 23 <u>United States</u>, 112 S.Ct. 2408 (1992), that Congress may not simply
- 24 commandeer the legislative and regulatory processes of the states;
- 25 and
- 26 WHEREAS, a number of proposals from previous administrations

- 27 and some pending from the present administration and from Congress
- 28 may further violate the United States Constitution:
- 29 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING 30
- 31 THEREIN, That the State of Mississippi claims sovereignty under
- the 10th Amendment to the Constitution of the United States over 32
- 33 all powers not otherwise enumerated and granted to the federal
- government by the United States Constitution. 34
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution serve as notice 35
- 36 and demand to the federal government, as our agent, to cease and
- desist, effective immediately, mandates that are beyond the scope 37
- 38 of its constitutionally delegated powers.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be 39
- sent to the President of the United States, the presiding officers 40
- of the Senate and the House of Representatives of Congress, the 41
- 42 members of the Mississippi Congressional Delegation and the
- 43 Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate of the
- Legislature of each State of the United States of America. 44
