HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 70
(As Adopted by House)

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE OF MR. EDWARD
2 ELLIOTT AND EXTENDING DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HIS FAMILY AND FRIENDS
3 UPON HIS PASSING.

4 WHEREAS, Mr. Edward Elliott, a resident of Greenwood,
5 Mississippi, departed this life Tuesday, January 5, 1999, causing
6 great loss and suffering to his family and friends; and

7 WHEREAS, Mr. Elliott, whose name appears on one of the bricks
8 at the Leflore County Veteran's Monument, faithfully served his
9 country in the United States Army during World War I and received
10 the World War I 75th Anniversary Commemorative Award; and

11 WHEREAS, a sharecropper and carpenter, Mr. Elliott was a
12 member of Sweet Home Missionary Baptist Church for 48 years and
13 was the recipient of the Deacon Award for long-time service to the
14 church; and

15 WHEREAS, Mr. Elliott was honored on his 100th birthday with a
16 card from President Bill Clinton and recognized on the NBC morning
17 news program, Today; and

18 WHEREAS, a native of Duck Hill, Mr. Elliott was a member of
19 Masonic Lodge 342, where he served as chaplain and Honorary
20 Worshipful Master; and

21 WHEREAS, Mr. Elliott is survived by his eight children:
22 Henry Elliott, Frank Elliott, James Elliott, Roy Elliott, Archie
23 Elliott, Ollie Elliott, Minnie Whittaker and Glenda Crain; 31
24 grandchildren; 51 great-grandchildren and 58 great-great-
25 grandchildren; and

26 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize

27 and pay tribute to such outstanding men as Mr. Edward Elliott, who
28 was a man of God and a loving father:
