- WHEREAS, Mr. Leland Speakes, Jr., a resident of Cleveland,
- 5 Mississippi, took the office of President of the Foundation for
- 6 North American Wild Sheep in April 1998 and will serve in the
- 7 office until April 1999; and
- 8 WHEREAS, after graduating from Mississippi State University
- 9 in 1951, Mr. Speakes entered the United States Air Force Pilot
- 10 Training Program at Columbus, Mississippi, and graduated from
- 11 flight training at Williams Air Force Base, Arizona; and
- 12 WHEREAS, after completing his flight training, Mr. Speakes
- 13 served his country as a jet fighter pilot during the Korean
- 14 Conflict, flying 98 combat missions and receiving the
- 15 Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal with two oak leaf
- 16 clusters; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Mr. Speakes, a real estate broker and appraiser and
- 18 an avid hunter, has always been interested in wild sheep, hunting
- 19 throughout the North American continent, Europe, Asia and Africa,
- 20 and he became the first Mississippian to take the Grand Slam by
- 21 successfully taking one sheep of each of the four varieties of
- 22 sheep that inhabit North America: the Dall, Stone, Rocky Mountain
- 23 and Desert; and
- 24 WHEREAS, the Foundation for North American Wild Sheep is a
- 25 6,000 member international organization that covers the United
- 26 States, Canada and Mexico, whose objectives are to promote and

- 27 enhance increasing populations of indigenous wild sheep on the
- 28 North American continent, to safeguard against the decline or
- 29 extinction of such species and to fund programs for professional
- 30 management of these populations; and
- 31 WHEREAS, now in his third three-year term, Mr. Speakes was
- 32 elected to his first term as a member of the Foundation's Board of
- 33 Directors in 1992, and has served as membership chairman,
- 34 convention chairman and First Vice President of the Foundation's
- 35 Board of Directors; and
- 36 WHEREAS, being politically active at the federal level
- 37 promoting hunting, fishing and wildlife conservation, Mr. Speakes
- 38 has worked closely with the United States Forest Service, the
- 39 Bureau of Land Management and the United States Fish and Wildlife
- 40 Service on wildlife enhancement programs; and
- 41 WHEREAS, in addition to his responsibilities with the
- 42 Foundation, Mr. Speakes serves on the Board of Directors of the
- 43 Ballot Issues Coalition, an organization dedicated to protecting
- 44 wildlife and wildlife management from unfavorable ballot issues
- 45 supported by animal rights groups; and
- WHEREAS, in 1998, Mr. Speakes was selected by Peterson's
- 47 Hunting Magazine as one of the 20 most influential wildlife
- 48 conservation people in the United States; and
- 49 WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Mississippi finds it
- 50 most appropriate to recognize and commend excellence, especially
- 51 when evidenced by such a remarkable man as Mr. Leland Speakes,
- 52 Jr., whose leadership has made an tremendous impact in the area of
- 53 wildlife:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 55 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 56 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend Mr. Leland Speakes, Jr., for
