HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 84

- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING MR. JAMES CHARLES EVERS
- 2 FOR HIS MANY YEARS OF SERVICE.
- 3 WHEREAS, Mr. James Charles Evers, born September 11, 1922,
- 4 was the first born of four children of Jim and Jessie Evers; and
- 5 WHEREAS, after graduation from the public schools in Decatur,
- 6 Mississippi, Mr. Evers volunteered for a term of duty in the
- 7 United States Army in 1940; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Mr. Evers, a resident of Fayette, Mississippi,
- 9 returned to Mississippi in the late 1940's and enrolled in Alcorn
- 10 State University, formerly known as Alcorn A&M College, where he
- 11 received his bachelor of science degree in 1951; and
- 12 WHEREAS, to further his education, Mr. Evers earned a
- 13 Doctorate of Civil Law from Luther College in 1969 and an honorary
- 14 doctorate from Tougaloo College in 1970; and
- WHEREAS, after teaching briefly in the public schools of
- 16 Humphrey County, Mr. Evers resigned and went into business for
- 17 himself; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Evers, a remarkable and successful businessman,
- 19 owned businesses including washhouses, hotels, lounges and
- 20 promotion companies; and
- 21 WHEREAS, seeking to bring positive changes to Mississippi,
- 22 Mr. Evers became a member of the NAACP of which he has a life
- 23 membership; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Mr. Evers has served in various leadership roles in
- 25 several professional organizations and clubs such as Field
- 26 Secretary of the Mississippi NAACP and founding member of the AJFC

- 27 Community Action Agency; and
- 28 WHEREAS, Mr. Evers founded and chaired several organizations
- 29 in honor of Medgar Evers including the Medgar Evers Fund, the
- 30 Medgar Evers Homecoming, the Medgar Evers Home Health Agency and
- 31 the Medgar Evers Comprehensive Health Center; and
- 32 WHEREAS, Mr. Evers has received many letters of appreciation
- 33 from several presidents such as John F. Kennedy, Richard Nixon,
- 34 Lyndon Johnson, Ronald Reagan and George Bush; and
- 35 WHEREAS, having traveled and worked throughout the United
- 36 States, Mr. Evers has received Keys to Cities including
- 37 Harrisburg, Pennsylvania; Denmark, South Carolina; Washington,
- 38 D.C; Cleveland, Ohio; Buffalo, New York; New Orleans, Louisiana;
- 39 Fort Wayne, Indiana; Springfield, Illinois and Raleigh, North
- 40 Carolina; and
- WHEREAS, during his lifetime, Mr. Evers has been honored with
- 42 over 50 awards such as Man of the Year Award, Medgar Evers Human
- 43 Rights Award, American Friendship Club Award, Outstanding Citizen
- 44 of the Year, Vernon Dahmer Award, Ambassador's Club Award,
- 45 Profiles in Courage Award, Black Man of Progress Award, John F.
- 46 Kennedy Award, Vehicle to Freedom Award, Friend of Man Award,
- 47 Black History Program Award and many others; and
- WHEREAS, the Legislature finds it most appropriate to
- 49 recognize such an outstanding man as Mr. James Charles Evers, a
- 50 man whose long and distinguished career of service has set an
- 51 example for many to follow:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
- 53 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING
- 54 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend Mr. James Charles Evers for his
