HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 93  
(As Adopted by House and Senate)

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE OF CARROL LEE  
2 CHAMBERS AND EXTENDING OUR DEEPEST SYMPATHY TO HIS FAMILY UPON HIS  
3 PASSING.

4 WHEREAS, Carrol Lee Chambers, known as "Carl" or "Mr. C." by  
5 his closest friends, departed this life on Thursday, January 7,  
6 1999, causing a great loss to his family and friends; and

7 WHEREAS, Mr. Chambers, the oldest of eleven children of  
8 Anthony and Druscilla Chambers, was born in Lorman, Mississippi,  
9 on October 1, 1907; and

10 WHEREAS, at an early age, Mr. Chambers accepted Christ as his  
11 Lord and Savior and joined the Lorman Christian (Disciples of  
12 Christ) Church in Jefferson County, Mississippi; and

13 WHEREAS, upon completion of his public school education in  
14 Jefferson and Claiborne Counties, Mr. Chambers enrolled at the  
15 Southern Christian Institute in Edwards, Mississippi, where he  
16 participated in basketball and baseball; and

17 WHEREAS, Mr. Chambers pursued courses in the field of  
18 insurance and was employed by Universal Life Insurance Company of  
19 Memphis, Tennessee, where he was named "Manager of the Year" of  
20 the Greenville, Mississippi, district; and

21 WHEREAS, an active member of his community, Mr. Chambers was  
22 a life member of the NAACP, a member of the executive board of the  
23 Forrest County Branch of the NAACP and a poll worker in the Rowan  
24 precinct; and

25 WHEREAS, Mr. Chambers also was a faithful servant to the East  
26 Pine African Methodist Episcopal Church as a steward, trustee and

27 Sunday School superintendent, he was honored with the church's  
28 "Keep the Faith Award" and as "Church Member of the Year"; and

29 WHEREAS, Mr. Chambers is survived by his lovely wife,  
30 Marjorie, four daughters, eight grandchildren and five great-  
31 grandchildren; and

32 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize  
33 and pay special tribute to such outstanding Mississippians as Mr.  
34 Carrol Lee Chambers, who was a loving husband, father and friend:

35 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF  
36 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING  
37 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend the life of Mr. Carrol Lee  
38 Chambers and express our deepest sympathy to his family upon his  
39 passing.
