HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 131

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE MISSISSIPPI LIBRARY 2 COMMISSION FOR THE CELEBRATION OF ITS 30TH ANNIVERSARY OF 3 MISSISSIPPI'S SUMMER LIBRARY READING PROGRAM.

Shurden have 8 9 coordinated the development of this annual program which includes the selection of art work; development of the planning manual; 10 distribution of posters, bookmarks and certificates; and 11 12 presentation of training workshops based on the theme; and 13 WHEREAS, the art work for "Mississippi Magic 1999" has been created by the art classes in the Carroll County School District 14 15 which includes students grades seven to twelve from the Carrollton and Vaiden areas under the direction of Ms. Kitty Cook Hodges and 16 Ms. Jean Aldridge; and 17

29 WHEREAS, the students regard Mississippi as a magical land 30 with watery, swampy places which have special creatures living in 31 them; for example, the alligator who is a magician and serves as a 32 guide for this summer's program; and

33 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Library Commission funded the 34 preparation of the art work through a grant to assist the Carroll 35 County School District for the purchase of additional art supplies 36 and equipment for the J.Z. George High School; and

37 WHEREAS, for the past thirty years, the Mississippi Library 38 Commission has been sponsoring summer reading programs in the 39 public libraries throughout the state, which attract approximately 40 34,000 children who read almost 750,000 library books and other 41 resources during the summer; and

42 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize 43 and commend such outstanding programs as the Mississippi Library 44 Commission Summer Library Reading Program, which is designed to 45 improve the reading skills of the children of the State of 46 Mississippi:
