18 Riley, sold Riley Memorial Hospital, a hospital founded by their 19 father, Franklin Gail Riley who was the first pediatrician in 20 Mississippi; and

21 WHEREAS, after the sale of the hospital in 1997, the brothers 22 established the Riley Foundation, which has helped improve the 23 quality of life for individuals and the Meridian community as a 24 whole; and

25 WHEREAS, in January 1999, the Riley Foundation announced 26 grant awards totaling \$329,888.00 to allow six Meridian and
