HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 151

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION TO CREATE A JOINT STUDY COMMITTEE TO 2 STUDY RESTRUCTURING OF THE ELECTRIC UTILITY INDUSTRY; TO DIRECT THE JOINT COMMITTEE TO MAKE A WRITTEN REPORT OF ITS FINDINGS AND 3 RECOMMENDATIONS BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 1999; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 5 WHEREAS, electricity is a necessity for all individuals, industries, businesses and municipalities in the State of 6 7 Mississippi; and WHEREAS, the generation and transmission of electric power 8 and the sale and distribution of electricity to consumers within 9 10 the state are affected by the public interest; and WHEREAS, markets for electricity are changing nationally and 11 12 appear to be moving toward increased competition; and WHEREAS, changes in the electric utility industry could 13 enhance the competitive position of Mississippi's businesses and 14 15 industries, including Mississippi's ability to compete more 16 effectively in business development; and 17 WHEREAS, there is a need for careful consideration of all issues involving customer choice and the potential restructuring 18 19 of, and competition in, the electric utility industry and the 20 system of electric utility regulations; and WHEREAS, the Mississippi Public Service Commission is 21 22 currently studying electric industry restructuring and competition in the provision of retail electric service in its active Docket 23 24 Number 96-UA-389: 25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF 26 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN, That a special joint study committee is created to study 27

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restructuring of the electric industry and competition in the 28 29 provision of retail electric service. The joint committee shall be composed of seven (7) members of the House of Representatives 30 to be appointed by the Speaker of the House and seven (7) members 31 of the Senate to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor. 32 The 33 committee shall be chaired by a cochairman selected by the appointed members of the House and a cochairman selected by the 34 35 appointed members of the Senate.

Within ten (10) days after the final passage of this 36 resolution during the 1999 Regular Session of the Legislature, the 37 38 Speaker and the Lieutenant Governor shall appoint the members of the committee. Within ten (10) days after the members are 39 40 appointed, the membership shall meet on a date mutually agreed upon by a majority of the members from each house for the purpose 41 42 of organizing the committee and establishing rules for transacting its business and keeping records. A majority of the members of 43 44 the joint committee from each house shall constitute a quorum at 45 all committee meetings. An affirmative vote of a majority of the 46 members from each house present and voting shall be required in 47 the adoption of rules, resolutions and reports, and in any other actions taken by the committee. All members of the joint 48 49 committee shall be notified in writing of all regular and special meetings of the committee, which notices shall be mailed at least 50 five (5) days before the dates of the meetings. The joint 51 52 committee shall hold a minimum of three (3) regular special 53 meetings.

The joint committee shall make a written report of its findings and recommendations, and shall mail copies of the report to each member and member-elect of the Legislature not later than December 1, 1999.

For attending meetings of the joint committee, each member shall be paid, from the Contingent Expense Fund of the member's respective house, per diem compensation in the amount authorized by Section 25-3-69, Mississippi Code of 1972, and a mileage allowance and an expense allowance in the amount authorized by Section 5-1-47, Mississippi Code of 1972. However, no per diem compensation, mileage allowance or expense allowance shall be paid

No. 151 99\HR07\R2062 PAGE 2 65 for attending meetings of the joint committee while the Legislature is in session, and no per diem compensation, mileage 66 67 allowance or expense allowance shall be paid without prior approval of the proper committee in the member's respective house. 68 69 All expenses incurred by and on behalf of the joint committee shall be paid from funds made available by the House Management 70 71 Committee and the Senate Management Committee from the Contingent 72 Expense Fund of each respective house, from any funds appropriated for the purpose of this resolution, and from any grants or 73 74 contributions made to the committee for its purpose.

In carrying out the provisions of this resolution, the joint committee may utilize the services, facilities and personnel of all departments, agencies, offices and institutions of the state, including the Mississippi Public Utilities Staff.
