HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 14  
(As Adopted by House)

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING MS. JIMOLA MCCASKILL UPON HER  
2 RETIREMENT FROM THE MISSISSIPPI EMPLOYMENT SECURITY COMMISSION.

3 WHEREAS, Ms. Jimola McCaskill, a resident of Greenwood,  
4 Mississippi, has retired from the Mississippi Employment Security  
5 Commission after 31 years of service; and

6 WHEREAS, in May 1962, Ms. McCaskill graduated from Broad  
7 Street High School in Greenwood, Mississippi, and in October 1966,  
8 she received secretarial training from Systematic Training and  
9 Redevelopment; and

10 WHEREAS, Ms. McCaskill began working with the Mississippi  
11 Employment Security Commission in May 1968, where her  
12 responsibilities included recruitment, screening and preparing  
13 young people for enrollment into the Job Corps Training Program;  
14 and

15 WHEREAS, throughout her career, Ms. McCaskill maintained  
16 records on Job Corps Enrollment from the Greenwood Employment  
17 office, developed good public relations and appearance, gave Job  
18 Corps presentations at various high schools and kept the community  
19 aware of the opportunities available within the Job Corps Training  
20 Program; and

21 WHEREAS, Ms. McCaskill has received several awards such as  
22 the Employee of the Year Award in December 1991, and the Employee  
23 of the Month Award in October 1991; and

24 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize  
25 and pay special tribute to such outstanding employees as Ms.  
26 McCaskill, who devoted over 30 years of her life to helping people

28           NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF  
29 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby  
30 commend and congratulate Ms. Jimola McCaskill upon her retirement
