HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 64

A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND COMMENDING THE MAGEE VOLUNTEER
 FIRE DEPARTMENT FOR ITS QUICK RESPONSE TO THE MASSIVE FIRE IN
 DOWNTOWN TAYLORSVILLE ON SUNDAY, JANUARY 31, 1999.
 WHEREAS, a quick and massive response by the Magee Volunteer

5 Fire Department and by other area volunteer fire departments on 6 Sunday, January 31, 1999, prevented a building fire from 7 destroying downtown Taylorsville, Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, more than 20 units from Smith and surrounding 8 9 counties responded to a call for help as the old Melroy Theater, a familiar Taylorsville landmark which housed the May Appliance 10 Center, became engulfed in flames that destroyed the building; and 11 12 WHEREAS, with assistance from volunteer fire departments from 13 Taylorsville, Mize, Raleigh, Richton, Shady Grove, Hebron, Pleasant Ridge, Powers, Soso, Myrick, Moselle, Mill Creek, Boggy 14 15 Creek, Northeast Jones, Sharon, Glade, Johnson, Mendenhall, Collins, Hot Coffee, East Covington, Stringer and Bay Springs, the 16 Magee Volunteer Fire Department battled the blaze until about 2:00 17 a.m. Monday, February 1, 1999; and 18 WHEREAS, according to official reports, flames had broken 19 20 through the roof of the building and blazed to a height of over 20 feet, threatening to quickly spread to other structures due to the 21 radiation of so much heat; and 22 WHEREAS, firemen saturated the walls with water from a bucket 23 truck that Entergy had provided to prevent the fire from spreading 24 25 until help arrived, and it would have been worse if not for the

26 incredible response from other fire departments; and

No. 64 99\HR03\R2146 PAGE 1 27 WHEREAS, personnel from the Mize Police Department, Smith 28 County Sheriff's Department, Soso Police Department, Jones County 29 Sheriff's Department and Jasper County Sheriff's Department, along 30 with the Pine Belt Chapter of the American Red Cross and the AMR 31 Ambulance Service also responded to provide assistance, and all 32 are to be praised for their work; and

33 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the hard 34 work and quick response of all these Mississippians who helped 35 their neighbors when they were most needed, by preventing a 36 building fire from destroying a Mississippi town:

37 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
38 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
39 recognize and commend the Magee Volunteer Fire Department for its
40 quick response to the massive fire in downtown Taylorsville on
41 Sunday, January 31, 1999, and express our appreciation to all
42 other units that assisted in this effort.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be presented to the Chief of the Magee Volunteer Fire Department and the Mayor of Magee on behalf of all personnel responding to the fire, and that copies be furnished to the Capitol Press Corps.
