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## SENATE BILL NO. 2020

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-13-131, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REQUIRE CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION INSTRUCTION IN HEALTH 3 CLASSES IN GRADES 9-12; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 37-13-131, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 37-13-131. (1) The State Department of Education is 8 designated as the state agency responsible for the administration 9 and supervision of the Comprehensive School Health Education Program as an educational curriculum in the State of Mississippi. 10 It is the intent of the Legislature that all funds made available 11 12 to the State Department of Education for the purpose of 13 comprehensive school health education shall be administered by the State Department of Education. 14

(2) Pursuant to the provisions of subsection (1) of this 15 section, the State Department of Education is authorized to 16 establish an Office of Comprehensive School Health Education 17 within the framework of the State Department of Education for the 18 purpose of developing standards, procedures and criteria for the 19 20 administration and supervision of a statewide program of health education in Kindergarten through Grade 12. The State Department 21 22 of Education, through the Office of Comprehensive School Health Education, shall assume the further responsibility for promoting a 23 statewide effort designed to prepare local school faculties and 24 staffs to incorporate the comprehensive health education concept 25 26 into their local educational programs.

No. 2020 99\SS26\R29 PAGE 1 27 (3) The Mississippi Department of Health, in conjunction 28 with the Office of Student Development-Branch of Health-Related Services of the State Department of Education, shall develop a 29 30 long-range strategic plan for a Comprehensive School Health 31 Education Program in Grades K through 12. The Comprehensive 32 School Health Education Program shall encompass four (4) interdependent components: (a) health education; (b) health 33 service; (c) physical education and fitness; and (d) a healthful 34 35 school environment. These curriculum components shall be designed to develop decision-making competencies related to health and 36 37 health behavior. Such curriculum components are intended to 38 motivate health maintenance and promote wellness, not only to prevent disease or disability. The Mississippi Department of 39 40 Health, in conjunction with the Office of Student Development-Branch of Health-Related Services of the Department of 41 42 Education, shall develop the strategic plan and make a report 43 thereon to the Governor and the Legislature on or before January 1, 1995. 44 (4) The following words shall have the meanings ascribed 45 herein unless the context clearly states otherwise: 46 47 "Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR)" shall pertain to a procedure employed after cardiac arrest in which cardiac massage and 48 49 mouth-to-mouth resuscitation are used to restore rhythm and 50 breathing. All state accredited health classes in Grades 9 51 through 12 shall teach Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) to each 52 <u>student.</u> SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 53

54 and after July 1, 1999.
