1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-1-85, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DELETE CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS RELATING TO THE PURCHASE OF PASSENGER VEHICLES BY STATE AGENCIES AND TO DELETE THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE PUBLIC PROCUREMENT REVIEW BOARD APPROVE THE PURCHASE OF CERTAIN FULL-SIZE VEHICLES BY STATE AGENCIES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 25-1-85, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
9	amended as follows:
10	25-1-85. The following state departments, agencies or
11	institutions are hereby allowed to purchase, own and operate, in
12	strict accordance with the provisions hereof, passenger vehicles
13	not to exceed the following numbers:

92	state department, institution or agency shall purchase, operate or
93	maintain any passenger vehicle out of any funds available for the
94	use of such department, institution or agency, unless same has
95	been or may be donated.

97	For purposes of this section, passenger vehicle shall be

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- 98 defined as a vehicle which is designed to transport four (4) or
- 99 more persons and/or provides adequate seating for at least four
- 100 (4) persons. The terms "luxury vehicle," "full-size vehicle,"
- 101 "utility vehicle" and "carryall vehicle" shall be as defined by
- 102 the industry.
- 103 * * *
- Nothing in Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93 shall be
- 105 construed to prohibit agencies, departments and institutions from
- 106 purchasing and operating passenger vehicles when used exclusively
- 107 to transport patients, prisoners, students, faculty or staff of
- 108 state institutions, blind and sighted employees essential to
- 109 operate blind training programs or material, products and
- 110 client-trainees in the sheltered workshop program, or bookmobiles.
- 111 The superintendents of the Columbia Training School and Oakley
- 112 Training School and the Commissioner of Corrections, or staff
- 113 members designated by them, may use such passenger vehicles for
- 114 other official functions and operations of those institutions at
- 115 their discretion. Passenger vehicles or similar vehicles used for
- 116 any other purposes shall be considered as automobiles and subject
- 117 to the restrictions set forth in the aforesaid sections.
- In addition to the motor vehicles authorized to be owned and
- 119 operated by the Mississippi Department of Public Safety, said
- 120 department is also authorized to receive, own and operate special
- 121 purpose motor vehicles to be used solely in investigations.
- Of the motor vehicles authorized to be owned and operated by
- 123 the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol, no more than twenty-one
- 124 (21) vehicles may be kept for use by administrative personnel of
- 125 the patrol whose principal duties are performed at the Highway
- 126 Safety Patrol Headquarters Building and the Drivers' License
- 127 Examining Station in Hinds County to commute to and from the
- 128 residence of said personnel to the office at which such duties are
- 129 regularly performed.
- Of the motor vehicles authorized to be owned and operated by
- 131 the Mississippi Department of Transportation, not more than five

- 132 (5) vehicles may be kept for use by administrative personnel of
- 133 the department to commute between their residences and the offices
- 134 at which their duties are regularly performed. The executive
- 135 director of the department is authorized to allow additional
- 136 department personnel to commute to and from their residences in
- 137 department vehicles due to the nature of their job and for the
- 138 safety of the traveling public.
- Of the motor vehicles authorized to be owned and operated by
- 140 the State Tax Commission, no more than four (4) vehicles may be
- 141 kept for use by administrative personnel whose principal duties
- 142 are performed at State Tax Commission offices in Hinds County to
- 143 commute to and from the residence of said personnel to the office
- 144 at which such duties are regularly performed.
- The provisions of Chapter 226, Laws of 1964, remain in force
- 146 and are not affected by this section.
- 147 Any state officer, employee or board member who violates any
- 148 of the foregoing provisions of Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-85
- 149 shall be liable on his or her official bond for the total amount
- 150 of the purchase price of the passenger vehicle, plus the total
- 151 amount of funds expended in violation of said sections for the
- 152 operating costs of such vehicle.
- 153 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 154 and after July 1, 1999.
