SENATE BILL NO. 2095

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-106-29, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
 TO INCREASE THE TUITION AMOUNTS UNDER THE MISSISSIPPI RESIDENT
 TUITION ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM FOR FRESHMAN AND SOPHOMORE
 STUDENTS TO \$1,000.00 PER TERM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 37-106-29, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

37-106-29. (1) There is established the Mississippi 8 Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Program for college or 9 10 university freshmen, sophomores, juniors and seniors to be administered by the Mississippi Postsecondary Education Financial 11 Assistance Board established under Section 37-106-9, Mississippi 12 13 Code of 1972, which shall set the dates and deadlines for applying for an award under this section. The board shall establish such 14 15 rules and regulations as it deems necessary and proper to carry 16 out the purposes and intent of this act.

17 (2) The college or university shall approve grants to
18 full-time freshman, sophomore, junior and senior Mississippi
19 residents who meet the general requirements for student
20 eligibility as provided in subsection (4) of this section.

(3) Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants shall be 21 22 for Mississippi students from any Mississippi family whose prior year adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to 23 24 qualify for full Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal 25 aid. Those Mississippi students receiving less than the full Pell 26 Grant award, as determined by the institution, shall receive a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant in an amount not to 27 exceed the maximum Pell Grant allowable for that individual 28 S. 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29 The award shall be applied to tuition, rooms and meals, student. 30 books, materials and fees not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for <u>freshman, sophomore</u>, junior and senior students 31 attending state institutions of higher learning in Mississippi, 32 33 two-year or four-year regionally accredited, state-approved, 34 nonprofit colleges and universities in Mississippi, * * * or public community or junior colleges in Mississippi, * * * which 35 will be prorated per term, semester or quarter of the academic 36 year for costs of attendance, calculated according to the formula 37 specified in subsection (8) of this section. 38

39 (4) The general requirements for initial eligibility of
40 students for Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants
41 consist of the following:

42 (a) Member of a Mississippi family whose prior year
43 adjusted gross income (AGI) exceeds the maximum allowed to qualify
44 for Pell Grant eligibility and campus-based federal aid.

45 Acceptance for enrollment at any state institution (b) of higher learning or public community or junior college located 46 47 in Mississippi, or any regionally accredited, state-approved, nonprofit four- or two-year college or university located in 48 Mississippi as listed in subsection (d) of this Section 49 50 37-106-29(4): (i) a minimum grade point average of 2.5 calculated on a 4.0 scale after seven (7) semesters certified by the high 51 school counselor or other authorized school official on the 52 application and graduation from high school verified by the 53 54 institution before disbursement of award and has scored fifteen 55 (15) on the American College Test Program (ACT); or (ii) has 56 attended a home education program during grade levels 9 through 57 12, and has scored fifteen (15) on the American College Testing 58 Program; or (iii) satisfactory completion of the General 59 Educational Development Test (GED) or have successfully completed 60 the International Baccalaureate Program and has scored fifteen 61 (15) on the American College Testing Program; provided, however, that any student entering a vocational or technical program of 62 63 study, or who has satisfactorily completed the General Education Development Test and attends a community or junior college will 64 65 not be required to have a test score under the American College 66 Testing Program except those students enrolled in courses of S. 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academic study. Any student currently enrolled in any qualified
institution shall have to only meet the same requirements as
students who are applying for a renewal award.

(c) Resident status for purposes of receiving grants under this act shall be determined in the same manner as resident status for tuition purposes as set forth in Sections 37-103-1 through 37-103-29, with the exception of 37-103-17.

By accepting a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance 91 (5) 92 Grant, the student is attesting to the accuracy, completeness and 93 correctness of information provided to demonstrate the student's eligibility. Falsification of such information shall result in 94 the denial of any pending grant and revocation of any award 95 96 currently held to the extent that no further payments shall be 97 made. Any student knowingly making false statements in order to 98 receive a grant shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable, upon 99 conviction thereof, by a fine of up to Ten Thousand Dollars 100 (\$10,000.00), a prison sentence of up to one (1) year in the S. 101 county jail, or both, and shall be required to return all 102 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grants wrongfully 103 obtained.

104 (6) Eligibility for renewal of Mississippi Resident Tuition 105 Assistance Grants shall be evaluated at the end of each semester, 106 or term, of each academic year. As a condition for renewal, a 107 student shall:

108 (a) Make steady academic progress toward a certificate
109 or degree, as outlined in the school Satisfactory Academic
110 Progress Standards and certified by the institution's registrar.

Maintain continuous enrollment for not less than 111 (b) 112 two (2) semesters or three (3) quarters in each successive 113 academic year, unless granted an exception for cause by the administering agency; examples of cause may include student 114 participation in a cooperative program, internship program or 115 116 foreign study program. If a student fails to maintain continuous 117 enrollment, and is not granted an exception for cause by the administering agency, the student is ineligible to receive the 118 119 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following 120 semester or trimester or term of the regular academic year.

(c) Have a cumulative grade point average of at least
2.50 calculated on a 4.0 scale at the end of each semester or
trimester or term.

124 (7) Each student, each year, must complete a Free
125 Application for Federal Student Aid form or a Statement of
126 Certification as designed by the administering board to determine
127 his/her eligibility for a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance
128 Grant.

129 (8) The amount of the Mississippi Resident Tuition (a) 130 Assistance Grant awarded to any one (1) student, up to the maximum 131 amount provided in subsection (3) of this section, shall be the difference of the student's cost of attendance at his accredited 132 133 college of choice and the amount of federal aid such student may 134 receive, not to supplant but to supplement the amount of any S. 135 federal aid awarded to the student. Cost of attendance is the 136 tuition and fees of the applicable institution plus an allowance 137 for room and meals and books and materials.

(b) Payment of the Mississippi Resident Tuition
Assistance Grant shall be made payable to the recipient and the
educational institution and mailed directly to the institution, to
be applied first to tuition.

142 (9) In order for an institution to remain eligible for its 143 students to participate in the Mississippi Resident Tuition 144 Assistance Grant Program, the institution shall comply with the 145 following requirements:

146 (a) A complete and accurate roster of the eligibility
147 status of each awarded student shall be made to the board for each
148 term, semester or quarter of the academic year the student
149 receives a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant.

150 (b) The institution is required to make refunds to the 151 Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Fund for any funds which have not been disbursed to the recipient, in the case of 152 153 students who have received a grant but who terminate enrollment 154 during the academic term, semester or quarter of the academic year 155 if an institution's refund policies permit a student to receive a 156 refund in such instance. The recipient shall be responsible for 157 the refund of any funds which have been disbursed by the 158 institution in such instance.

(c) If a student drops below full-time status but does
not terminate all enrollment during the term, semester or quarter
of the academic year no refund will be required for that term.
However, that student is ineligible to receive the Mississippi
Resident Tuition Assistance Grant during the following term,
semester or quarter of the regular academic year.

(d) The board may conduct its own annual audits of any institution participating in the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant Program. The board may suspend or revoke an institution's eligibility to receive future monies under the S. B. No. 2095 99\SS02\R370 PAGE 5 169 program if it finds that the institution has not complied with the 170 provisions of this act. In determining a student's initial 171 eligibility, the number of prior semesters enrolled will not be 172 counted against the student.

(10) No student may receive a Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant for more than the equivalent semesters or quarters required to complete one (1) baccalaureate degree or one (1) certificate or associate degree program per institution.

(11) Subject to the availability of funds specifically
appropriated therefor, it is the intent of the Legislature to
fully fund grant awards to eligible students. If funds are
insufficient to fully fund grant awards to eligible students,
grant awards shall be prorated among all eligible students. No
student shall receive any combination of student financial aid in
excess of the cost of attendance as defined in subsection (8)(a).

184 (12)No student receiving a Mississippi Eminent Scholars 185 Grant as provided in Section 37-106-31 shall be eligible to receive the Mississippi Resident Tuition Assistance Grant pursuant 186 187 to Section 37-106-29 unless he is eligible for such award after the Mississippi Eminent Scholars Grant has been considered by the 188 189 board when conducting an assessment of the financial resources 190 available to the student. In no case shall any student receive 191 any combination of student financial aid that would exceed the 192 cost of attendance, as defined in subsection (8)(a).

For purposes of this section, certificated shall mean, but not be limited to, all postsecondary vocational programs in eligible institutions as identified in subsection (4)(d) of this section.

197 SECTION 2. All new programs authorized under this Senate 198 Bill No. 2095 shall be subject to the availability of funds 199 specifically appropriated therefor by the Legislature during the 200 1999 Regular Session or any subsequent session. It is the intent 201 of the Legislature that this act shall be codified but that no 202 amendment to a Code section or repeal of a Code section enacted by S. B. No. 2095 99\SS02\R370 PAGE 6

203 this Senate Bill No. 2095 shall take effect until the Legislature 204 has funded any new programs authorized hereunder by line item 205 appropriation, said line item appropriation to be certified by the 206 Legislative Budget Office to the Secretary of State.

207 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 208 and after July 1, 1999.
