## SENATE BILL NO. 2124

1 2 3 4	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-35, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF THE FULL-TIME DISTRICT ATTORNEYS SHALL BE AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE ANNUAL SALARIES OF THE CIRCUIT COURT JUDGES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
6	SECTION 1. Section 25-3-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7	amended as follows:
8	25-3-35. (1) The annual salaries of the following judges
9	are fixed as follows, to begin at the commencement of the next
10	term of office immediately succeeding the existing term:
11	Chief Justice of the Supreme Court \$100,900.00
12	Presiding Justice of the Supreme Court 98,900.00
13	Associate Justices of the Supreme Court, each 98,300.00
14	However, in addition to their present official duties, there
15	are imposed upon the Supreme Court Justices the extra duties of
16	making a special study of existing laws and reporting to each
17	regular session of the Legislature such constructive suggestions
18	as they may deem necessary for the improvement of the
19	administration of justice, and of advising and counseling with the
20	State Librarian in the selection of law books for purchase and use
21	in the State Law Library, advising with the librarian thereof upon
22	the removal from the library of any books which may be the least
23	frequently used, and for the placing of same in a convenient
24	location so as to provide additional space for such books and
25	other current publications which may be more frequently used or
26	called for. For such extra services each justice, from and after
27	the effective date of Laws, 1997, Chapter 577, shall receive a sum
28	sufficient when added to the present salaries of the justices to

          In addition to their present official duties, there are

    imposed upon the chancery and circuit court judges the extra
    duties of making a special study of existing laws relating to

    trial courts and reporting to the Supreme Court of the State of

    necessary for the improvement of the administration of justice,

    which shall be recommended to the Legislature by the Supreme Court

    in the manner provided by law. The judges shall advise and

    supervise in the purchase of law books for the libraries of each
    district, and shall study and evaluate the inventory of books and

    circuit courts, and revise the same pursuant to existing laws.

    For such extra services each judge, from and after the effective

    date of Laws, 1997, Chapter 577, shall receive a sum sufficient

    when added to the present salaries of the judges to aggregate

    Eighty-eight Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars ($88,700.00) per annum

    for each judge. Upon the expiration of the existing term, the

- 67 above-captioned salaries become effective in due course, and the
- 68 extra duties and compensation provided for shall cease.
- 69 (4) The Supreme Court shall prepare a payroll for chancery
- 70 judges and circuit judges and submit such payroll to the
- 71 Department of Finance and Administration.
- 72 (5) The annual <u>salaries</u> of the full-time district attorneys
- 73 shall be <u>an amount equal to the annual salaries of the circuit</u>
- 74 court judges.
- 75 (6) The annual salary of the full-time legal assistants
- 76 shall be not less than Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) nor
- 77 more than Sixty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$67,500.00),
- 78 as established by the district attorney.
- 79 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
- 80 is directed to submit this act, immediately upon approval by the
- 81 Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a
- 82 veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the
- 83 United States District Court for the District of Columbia in
- 84 accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965,
- 85 as amended and extended.
- 86 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 87 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
- 88 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, or July 1, 1999,
- 89 whichever occurs later.
