AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A MISSISSIPPI CONSTRUCTION EDUCATION
PROGRAM TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE STATE BOARD FOR COMMUNITY AND
JUNIOR COLLEGES TO PROVIDE TUITION-FREE TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION
COURSEWORK FOR SKILLED LABOR EMPLOYEES IN THE STATE'S CONSTRUCTION
INDUSTRY; TO CREATE THE CONSTRUCTION EDUCATION FUND; TO PRESCRIBE
STANDARDS FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF SUCH FUNDS; AND FOR RELATED
PURPOSES.

- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) There is hereby established a Mississippi
- 10 Construction Education Program to be administered by the State
- 11 Board for Community and Junior Colleges to provide tuition-free
- 12 training and certification coursework to skilled labor employees
- in Mississippi's construction industry.
- 14 (2) Funds appropriated by the Legislature for the
- 15 Mississippi Construction Education Program shall be deposited into
- 16 the "Construction Education Fund," a special fund hereby created
- 17 in the State Treasury, and distributed by the State Board for
- 18 Community and Junior Colleges created in Section 37-4-3,
- 19 Mississippi Code of 1972, to Mississippi public community or
- 20 junior colleges, public high schools and certain construction
- 21 educational trusts or foundations approved by the board in the
- 22 manner hereinafter provided to offer courses for construction
- 23 education and construction craft training to meet the needs of the
- 24 construction industry of the State of Mississippi.
- 25 (3) The State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall,
- 26 on an annual basis, solicit from all the public community and
- 27 junior colleges, public high schools and any construction
- 28 educational trusts or foundations, applications for the use of

29 such funds in construction education and craft training programs

30 in a manner prescribed by the board. The board may appoint a

31 technical advisory committee or may designate the State Board of

32 Public Contractors created in Section 31-3-3, Mississippi Code of

33 1972, to advise the board on the most needed areas of construction

34 education and craft training, continuing education or research

35 relating to the construction education and craft training in the

36 state, based on significant changes in the construction industry's

37 practices, economic development or on problems costing public or

38 private contractors substantial waste. The board shall ensure

39 that the monies distributed from this fund are properly spent to

promote construction education and craft training in programs in

41 the state approved by the board.

- 42 (4) Each community college, junior college, public high
- 43 school or construction educational trust or foundation receiving
- 44 funds pursuant to this act for construction education or
- 45 construction craft training programs shall utilize such funds only
- 46 for construction education and craft training curricula and
- 47 program development, faculty development, equipment, student
- 48 scholarships, student assistantships, and for continuing education
- 49 programs related to construction education and craft training.
- 50 Such funds shall not be commingled with the normal operating funds
- of the educational institution, regardless of the source of such
- 52 funds.

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- 53 (5) The State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall
- 54 ensure the distribution of reports and the availability of
- 55 construction education programs established pursuant to this act
- 56 to all segments of the construction industry. The board shall
- 57 cause a report to be made to the Legislature in October of each
- 58 year, summarizing the allocation of funds by institution or
- 59 program and summarizing the new projects funded and the status of
- 60 previously funded projects.
- 61 (6) All monies deposited into the "Construction Education
- 62 Fund" shall be subject to the availability of funds specifically
- 63 appropriated therefor by the Legislature, and shall be used
- 64 exclusively for construction education and craft training and any
- 65 unspent funds at the end of the fiscal year shall not revert to

- 66 the General Fund of the State Treasury but shall be available for
- 67 construction education and craft training in subsequent fiscal
- 68 years.
- 69 (7) All expenditures from the "Construction Education Fund"
- 70 shall be by requisition to the State Auditor, signed by the
- 71 Executive Director of the State Board for Community and Junior
- 72 Colleges, and the State Treasurer shall issue his warrants
- 73 thereon.
- 74 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 75 and after July 1, 1999.
