SENATE BILL NO. 2151

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF 1 ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TO PREPARE AND DISTRIBUTE A 2 3 "MISSISSIPPI DIRECTORY AND GUIDE TO CAREER AND EDUCATIONAL 4 SERVICES" TO INCLUDE A GUIDE TO ALL STATE WORKFORCE TRAINING SERVICES, APPRENTICESHIPS, SCHOLARSHIPS AND CAREER OPPORTUNITIES; TO PROVIDE FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THIS INFORMATION DIRECTORY; AND 5 б BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE 7 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

10 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Mississippi Department of Economic and Community Development is authorized and directed to develop a 11 "Mississippi Directory and Guide to Career and Educational 12 Services" to provide a comprehensive guide to Mississippi 13 residents regarding the state's current system of workforce 14 15 related training services, student apprenticeships, student 16 scholarships, labor needs and career opportunities. This directory shall be made available as an interactive website on the 17 18 internet, and shall be made available in printed form. The Mississippi Directory and Guide to Career and Educational Services 19 shall consist of the following sections: 20

(a) Section One: "Guide to Workforce Training 21 Services." This section shall include descriptions, physical 22 23 locations, phone/fax/e-mail numbers, and guidelines concerning all current available workforce-related training services and 24 25 programs, including training programs administered or funded by the State Department of Education, the State Board for Community 26 and Junior Colleges, the Department of Economic and Community 27 Development, the State Department of Rehabilitative Services, the 28 Department of Human Services, the Mississippi Employment Security 29

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30 Commission, the Board of Trustees of Institutions of Higher 31 Learning and other programs administered through federal or 32 private entities.

(b) Section Two: "Guide to Apprenticeships." 33 This section shall include resources available for, and state and 34 federal laws concerning, apprenticeships, including student 35 work-study, job shadowing, and any other paid or non-paid 36 37 apprenticeships. This section shall also include a summary of employment laws that mandate a minimum age of eighteen (18) and 38 applicable exemptions to these laws, according to O.S.H.A. 39 guidelines, child labor laws, and the Fair Labor Standards Act. 40

Section Three: "Career Opportunities in 41 (C) 42 Mississippi." This section shall include a five-year simple description of labor trends in Mississippi on a regional basis, 43 44 showing career opportunities in all major recorded career categories, with data showing income, retention, shortage areas, 45 projections and educational levels required for the various 46 47 occupations.

Section Four: "Scholarships and Funding." This 48 (d) 49 section shall include a compilation of all available educational 50 scholarships and training program funding support for vocational programs, community colleges, institutions of higher learning, 51 apprenticeships and all adult workforce related training programs. 52 (2) The Department of Economic and Community Development 53 54 shall develop a marketing plan to educate the public of the 55 availability of the directory on website and in print. The target 56 for the marketing shall include all public school students, 57 private school students, post-secondary school students, parents 58 of these students, business and industry entities, agencies 59 involved in workforce placement and training, public libraries, chambers of commerce and economic development agencies. 60 The 61 department may enter into contracts or cooperative agreements with any public or private agency for the development, marketing and 62 63 distribution of the Mississippi Directory and Guide to Career and 64 Educational Services.

65 (3) The Department of Economic and Community Development may66 apply for public or private funding for the development, marketing

S. B. No. 2151 99\SS01\R492.1 PAGE 2 and distribution of this directory, and may expend any fundsspecifically appropriated therefor by the Legislature.

69 SECTION 2. All new programs authorized under this Senate Bill No. 2151, 1999 Regular Session, shall be subject to the 70 71 availability of funds specifically appropriated therefor by the Legislature during the 1999 Regular Session or any subsequent 72 session. It is the intent of the Legislature that this act shall 73 be codified but that no amendment to a code section or repeal of a 74 code section enacted by this Senate Bill No. 2151, 1999 Regular 75 76 Session shall take effect until the Legislature has funded any new 77 programs authorized hereunder by line item appropriation, said line item appropriation to be certified by the Legislative Budget 78 Office to the Secretary of State. 79

80 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 81 and after July 1, 1999.
