COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2226

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 17-23-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 ALLOW CERTAIN COUNTIES TO APPLY FOR THE FOURTH ROUND OF FIRE 3 TRUCKS UNDER THE RURAL FIRE TRUCK ACQUISITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM; 4 TO PROVIDE FOR AN ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION OF MONIES TO THE RURAL 5 FIRE TRUCK FUND DURING THE 1999 REGULAR SESSION; AND FOR RELATED 6 PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
8 SECTION 1. Section 17-23-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
9 amended as follows:

10 17-23-1. (1) There is established a rural fire truck 11 acquisition assistance program to be administered by the 12 Department of Insurance for the purpose of assisting counties and 13 municipalities in the acquisition of fire trucks.

14 (2) There is created in the State Treasury a special fund to be designated as the "Rural Fire Truck Fund." The Legislature may 15 appropriate during the 1999 Regular Session an amount not to 16 17 exceed Two Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,300,000.00), 18 or that amount obligated by the Department of Insurance, from the State General Fund to such special fund, which sum shall be added 19 to the remainder of the money transferred on July 1, 1995, and 20 21 appropriated during the 1996 and 1998 Regular Sessions to the Rural Fire Truck Fund. * * * Such monies as are deposited into 22 23 the fund under the provisions of this section may be available 24 after the 1999 Regular Session and such monies must be obligated 25 by December 31, 2000, upon legislative appropriation, and upon 26 requisition therefor by the Commissioner of Insurance, in 27 accordance with the provisions of this section. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall 28 not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on 29 S. B. No. 2226 99\SS02\R324CS.1 PAGE 1

30 amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of the fund.
31 It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of
32 Insurance continue to accept applications from the counties for
33 fire trucks from the additional funds authorized by this
34 subsection. The Department of Insurance shall include these funds
35 in the fiscal years 2000 and 2001 budget requests.

(a) A county that meets the requirements provided 36 (3)37 herein may receive an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) as provided in subparagraphs (i), (ii), 38 (iii) and (iv) of this paragraph, and such amount shall be divided 39 equally with not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per 40 fire truck. Monies distributed under this chapter shall be 41 42 expended only for the purchase of new fire trucks and such trucks must meet the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 43 standards in the 1900 series. 44

(i) Any county that has not applied for a fire
truck under this section is eligible to submit applications for
<u>four (4)</u> fire trucks at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars
(\$50,000.00) per truck or a total of <u>Two Hundred Thousand Dollars</u>
(\$200,000.00).

(ii) Any county that has received one (1) fire truck under this section is eligible to submit applications for <u>three (3)</u> fire trucks at not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per truck or a total of <u>One Hundred Fifty Thousand</u> <u>Dollars (\$150,000.00)</u>.

(iii) Any county that has received two (2) fire trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for <u>two (2)</u> fire trucks or a total of not more than <u>One Hundred</u> <u>Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00)</u>.

59 (iv) Any county that has received three (3) fire
60 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for
61 one (1) fire truck or a total of not more than Fifty Thousand
62 Dollars (\$50,000.00).

(b) The board of supervisors of the county shall submit its request for the receipt of monies to the Department of Insurance. A committee composed of the Commissioner of Insurance, the State Fire Coordinator, the Director of the Rating Bureau and the Director of the State Fire Academy shall review the requests S. B. No. 2226 99\SS02\R324CS.1 PAGE 2 by the boards of supervisors and shall determine whether the county or municipality for which the board of supervisors has requested a truck meets the requirements of eligibility under this chapter.

72 (c) To be eligible to receive monies under this73 chapter:

74 A county or municipality must pledge to set (i) 75 aside or dedicate each year as matching funds, for a period not to extend over ten (10) years, local funds in an amount equal to or 76 77 not less than one-tenth (1/10) of the amount of monies for which it is requesting distribution from the Rural Fire Truck Fund, 78 79 which pledged monies may be derived from local ad valorem tax authorized by law or from any other funds available to the county 80 or municipality, except for those funds received by municipalities 81 or counties from the Municipal Fire Protection Fund or the County 82 83 Volunteer Fire Department Fund, as defined in Sections 83-1-37 and 84 83-1-39.

85 (ii) A municipality must provide adequate 86 documentation of its contract with the county that requires the 87 municipality to provide fire protection in rural areas. The term 88 "rural areas" means any area within the county located outside the 89 boundaries of an incorporated municipality or any incorporated 90 municipality with a population of two thousand five hundred 91 (2,500) or less.

The Department of Insurance shall maintain an 92 (d) 93 accurate record of all monies distributed to counties and municipalities and the number of fire trucks purchased and the 94 cost for each fire truck, such records to be kept separate from 95 other records of the Department of Insurance; notify counties and 96 97 municipalities of the rural fire truck acquisition assistance 98 program and the requirements for them to become eligible to 99 participate; adopt and promulgate such rules and regulations as 100 may be necessary and desirable to implement the provisions of this 101 chapter; and file with the Legislature on or before January 2, S. 102 1999, and July 1, 1999, a report detailing how monies made 103 available under this chapter were distributed and spent during the 104 preceding portion of the fiscal year in each county and 105 municipality, the number of fire trucks purchased, the counties 106 and municipalities making such purchases and the cost of each fire 107 truck purchased.

108 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 109 and after July 1, 1999.
