SENATE BILL NO. 2266

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 1, CHAPTER 134, LAWS OF 1998, TO TRANSFER FROM THE MINIMUM EDUCATION PROGRAM FUND AN AMOUNT NOT 1 2 3 EXCEEDING ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00) TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TO DEVELOP AND TELEVISE A 4 PUBLIC RELATIONS CAMPAIGN TO ENHANCE THE IMAGE OF PUBLIC EDUCATION 5 AND PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHERS IN MISSISSIPPI, FOR FISCAL YEAR 1999; 6 TO AMEND SECTION 2, CHAPTER 105, LAWS OF 1998, IN CONFORMITY 7 THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 1, Chapter 134, Laws of 1998, is amended 10 as follows: 11 12 Section 1. The following sums, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 13 14 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Department 15 of Education for the support and maintenance of the common schools of Mississippi and for the Minimum Education Program for the 16 fiscal year beginning July 1, 1998, and ending June 30, 1999, as 17 follows: 18 19 For the support and maintenance of the common schools 20 21 (Common School Fund).....\$ 5,000,000.00 An additional sum, to be known as 2.2 the Minimum Education Program Fund, 23 24 to be disbursed by the State Department of Education in compliance with the laws 25 26 enacted at the Extraordinary Session 27 of 1953, as amended..... <u>\$1,043,983,455.00</u> Total.....\$1,048,983,455.00 28 29

No. 2266 99\SS26\R685 PAGE 1 30 Of any available State General Funds appropriated under the provisions of this act, the State Department of Education may 31 transfer an amount not to exceed One Million Dollars 32 (\$1,000,000.00) to the Department of Economic and Community 33 34 Development to develop and televise a public relations campaign to 35 enhance the image of public education and public school teachers in Mississippi. It is the intent of the Legislature that any 36 television spots or commercial messages authorized by this section 37 shall be produced at the Mississippi Educational Television using 38 their facilities, and to the extent possible, National Board 39 Certified Teachers shall be utilized in the making of this 40 campaign in cooperation with the various teacher organizations in 41 42 <u>the state.</u> SECTION 2. Section 2, Chapter 105, Laws of 1998, is amended 43 as follows: 44 45 Section 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 46 47 Treasury to the credit of the Department of Economic and Community Development or the appropriate special fund for the purpose of 48 defraying the expenses incurred in the operation of the various 49 divisions of the department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 50 1998, and ending June 30, 1999..... \$ 121,968,908.00. 51 52 It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of 53 Economic and Community Development shall have the authority to 54 escalate its budget and expend funds from any source not to exceed 55 One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a 56 manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds, to develop 57 and televise a public relations campaign to enhance the image of 58 public education and public school teachers in Mississippi. It is 59 60 the intent of the Legislature that any television spots or commercial messages authorized by this section shall be produced 61 62 at the Mississippi Educational Television using their facilities,

66 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 67 and after its passage.
