1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 PROVIDE FOR A SALARY SUPPLEMENT AND PROCESS REIMBURSEMENT FOR 3 SCHOOL DISTRICT COUNSELORS WHO HAVE OBTAINED THE NATIONAL BOARD 4 FOR CERTIFIED COUNSELORS' ENDORSEMENT AS A NATIONAL CERTIFIED 5 SCHOOL COUNSELOR; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. б BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows: 37-19-7. (1) The allowance in the minimum education program 9 10 for teachers' salaries in each county and separate school district shall be determined and paid in accordance with the scale for 11 teachers' salaries as provided in this subsection for the number 12 13 of teachers employed not in excess of the number of teacher units 14 allotted. For teachers holding the following types of licenses or the equivalent as determined by the State Board of Education, and 15 the following number of years of teaching experience, the scale 16 shall be as follows: 17 1999-2000 School Year 18 and School Years Thereafter 19 Less Than 25 Years of Teaching Experience 20 21 2.2 AAA 23,595.00 23 AA..... 22,745.00 24 A..... 21,695.00 25 or More Years of Teaching Experience 25 AAAA.....\$25,445.00 26 27 28 AA..... 23,745.00

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30 It is the intent of the Legislature that any state funds made 31 available for salaries of licensed personnel in excess of the funds paid for such salaries for the 1986-1987 school year shall 32 33 be paid to licensed personnel pursuant to a personnel appraisal and compensation system implemented by the State Board of 34 The State Board of Education shall have the authority 35 Education. to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to 36 establish, administer and maintain the system. 37

38 All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no 39 school district shall receive any funds under this section for any 40 41 school year during which the local supplement paid to any 42 individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties 43 44 from local supplement during the immediately preceding school 45 The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health year. and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the 46 47 aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a part of the amount of individual local supplement. 48

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Six Hundred Fifty-five Dollars (\$655.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

54 For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base 55 pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of 56 Five Hundred Ninety Dollars (\$590.00) for each year of teaching 57 experience possessed by the person holding such license until such 58 person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

59 For teachers holding a Class AA license, the minimum base pay 60 specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Five 61 Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$520.00) for each year of teaching 62 experience possessed by the person holding such license until such

For teachers holding a Class A license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Four Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$425.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-one (21) years of teaching experience.

The level of professional training of each teacher to be used in establishing the salary allotment for the teachers for each year shall be determined by the type of valid teacher's license issued to those teachers on or before October 1 of the current school year.

74 Prior to April 15 of any school year in which a teacher (2)75 meets the standard requirements, any licensed teacher who shall 76 have met the requirements and acquired a Master Teacher 77 certificate from the National Board for Professional Teaching 78 Standards and who is employed by a local school board or the State 79 Board of Education as a teacher and not as an administrator shall receive a salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars 80 81 (\$6,000.00) in addition to any other compensation to which the The teacher shall be reimbursed one (1) 82 teacher may be entitled. 83 time for the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring the Master Teacher certificate, regardless of whether or not the 84 85 process resulted in the award of the Master Teacher certificate. 86 All such salary supplements and process reimbursement shall be paid directly by the State Department of Education to the local 87 88 school district and shall be in addition to its minimum education 89 program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education, and 90 subject to appropriation by the Legislature. Local school 91 districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any 92 93 teacher receiving such salary supplement, and the teacher shall receive any local supplement to which teachers with similar 94 95 training and experience are otherwise entitled.

97 year in which a school counselor meets the standard requirements, any licensed school counselor who shall have met the requirements 98 and acquired a National Certified School Counselor (NCSC) 99 endorsement from the National Board of Certified Counselors and 100 101 who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of 102 Education as a counselor and not as an administrator shall receive a salary supplement in the amount of Six Thousand Dollars 103 (\$6,000.00), in addition to any other compensations to which the 104 counselor may be entitled. The counselor shall be reimbursed one 105 106 (1) time for an amount equal to the reimbursement cost paid to individuals acquiring a Master Teacher certificate from the 107 108 National Board for Professional Teaching Standards, regardless of 109 whether the process resulted in the endorsement as a National Certified School Counselor. All such salary supplements and 110 process reimbursement shall be paid directly by the State 111 112 Department of Education to the local school district and shall be 113 in addition to its minimum education program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated by the 114 115 State Board of Education, and subject to appropriation by the Legislature. Local school districts shall not reduce the local 116 117 supplement paid to any counselor receiving such salary supplement, and the counselor shall receive any local supplement to which 118 counselors with similar training and experience are otherwise 119 120 entitled. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 121
