AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 PROVIDE THAT ANY PERSON ADJUDGED TOTALLY DISABLED BY THE U.S. 2 3 CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM HUNTING LICENSE 4 FEES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE 5 LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: б 7 SECTION 1. Section 49-7-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 amended as follows: 49-7-5. (1) * * * Any resident, as defined in Section 9 49-7-3, upon application, shall receive: 10 11 (a) A combination resident hunting and fishing license for the sum of Seventeen Dollars (\$17.00). Under this 12 license * * * the licensee * * * <u>may take fish and</u> game * * *, 13 including deer and turkey * * *. 14 (b) * * * A resident combination small game hunting and 15 fishing license for the sum of Thirteen Dollars 16 (\$13.00) * * *. * * * <u>Under this</u> license, * * * the 17 18 licensee * * * may take fish * * * and game * * *, except deer and turkey * * *. 19 (c) * * * A resident small game license * * * for * * * 20 the sum of Thirteen Dollars (\$13.00) * * *. * * * Under this 21 license, * * * the * * * licensee may take game * * *, except deer 22 23 and turkey * * *. (d) * * * A sportsman's license for the sum of 24 25 Thirty-two Dollars (\$32.00). <u>Under this</u> license, * * * the licensee <u>may take fish and</u> * * * game * * *, including deer and 26 27 turkey, * * * and <u>may</u> hunt <u>with</u> primitive weapons and bow and 28 arrow * * *. The commission may notify the licensee of the

A licensee who has not renewed the license within thirty (30) days after the expiration date shall be removed from the commission's records, and the licensee must apply to be placed on the renewal list.

Any resident * * * of the State of Mississippi who 34 (2) (a) 35 has not reached the age of sixteen (16) years or who has reached the age of sixty-five (65) years, or any resident * * * who is 36 37 blind, paraplegic, or a multiple amputee, or who has been adjudged by the Veterans Administration as having a total service-connected 38 disability, or has been adjudged to be totally disabled by the 39 40 Social Security Administration or U.S. Civil Service Commission shall not be required to purchase or have in his possession, a 41 hunting or fishing license while engaged in such activities. A 42 person exempt * * * under this section, shall have in his 43 possession and on his person proof of * * * age, residency, 44 45 disability status or other respective physical impairment while engaged in * * * hunting or fishing. 46

47 (b) All exempt hunting and fishing licenses previously
48 issued for disabilities shall be null and void effective July 1,
49 1993.

50 (3) No license shall be required of <u>a resident</u> to hunt, fish 51 or trap on lands in which the record title is vested in <u>that</u> 52 person.

(4) Any person or persons exempt under this section from
procuring a license shall be subject to and must comply with all
other * * provisions of this chapter.

56 (5) Any person authorized to issue any license under this
57 section may collect and retain for the issuance of each license
58 the additional fee authorized under Section 49-7-17.

59 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 60 and after July 1, 1999.
