BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF б MISSISSIPPI: 7 8 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) Any person using force intended or likely to 9 cause death or serious bodily injury within the person's own residence or place of business is presumed to have held a 10 reasonable fear of imminent peril of death or serious bodily 11 injury to self, family, a member of the household or a guest or 12 customer when that force is used against another person, not a 13 14 member of the family or household, who unlawfully and forcibly 15 enters or has unlawfully and forcibly entered the residence or place of business, and the person using the force knew or had 16 reason to believe that an unlawful and forcible entry occurred. 17 (2) Any person using physical force, including deadly 18 physical force, in accordance with the provisions of this section 19 shall be immune from any civil liability for injuries or death 20 resulting from the use of such force. 2.1 SECTION 2. The codifier is directed to codify this act 22 within Title 15, Chapter 1, Mississippi Code of 1972.
