SENATE BILL NO. 2436
(As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 478, GENERAL LAWS OF 1998, TO EXTEND
2 THE LIFE OF THE JOINT NATURAL AND SCENIC RIVER STUDY COMMITTEE FOR
3 ONE YEAR AND TO RECONSTITUTE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMITTEE; AND
4 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

6 SECTION 1. Chapter 478, General Laws of 1998, is amended as
7 follows:

8 Section 1. (1) The natural and scenic river study
9 committee, created under Chapter 478, General Laws of 1998, is
10 continued and reconstituted, and shall continue to function until
11 it is dissolved under subsection (5) of this section. The
12 committee shall consist of the following members: (a) the
13 Chairman of the House Game and Fish Committee * * *; the Chairman
14 of the House Conservation and Water Resources Committee * * *; the
15 Chairman of the House Agriculture Committee * * *; and two (2)
16 members of each of such committees to be appointed by the Speaker
17 of the House; and (b) the Chairman of the Senate Wildlife and
18 Fisheries Committee * * *; the Chairman of the Senate
19 Environmental Protection, Conservation and Water Resources
20 Committee * * *; the Chairman of the Senate Agriculture Committee;
21 and two (2) members of each of such committees to be appointed by
22 the chairman of the respective Senate committees.

23 The Chairman of the House Game and Fish Committee and the
24 Chairman of the Senate Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks Committee
25 shall serve as cochair of the study committee.

26 For attending meetings of the committee, each legislative
27 member shall be paid per diem in the amount authorized by Section

28 25-3-69 and a mileage allowance and an expense allowance in the
29 amount authorized by Section 5-1-47 from the contingent expense
30 fund of his respective house. However, no per diem, mileage
31 allowance or expense allowance shall be paid for attending
32 meetings of the committee while the Legislature is in session, and
33 no per diem, mileage allowance or expense allowance shall be paid
34 without prior approval of the proper committee in the member's
35 respective house.

36 (2) In conducting its activities, the committee may elicit
37 the support of and participation by any commercial, industrial,
38 governmental, environmental, minority and public interest
39 organizations and associations, or individual members thereof, and
40 any federal, state and local agencies and political subdivisions
41 as may be necessary or appropriate in the furtherance of the
42 study.

43 (3) The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall
44 coordinate the study of certain natural and scenic rivers in the
45 state. The study shall be conducted in order to assess and
46 document the ecological, scenic, recreational and natural
47 characteristics of these rivers; to consider the feasibility of a
48 program for conserving the quality of scenic rivers; to recommend
49 a plan of nonregulatory incentive programs to encourage landowner
50 participation in any stream protection program that may be
51 recommended; to ensure any activities on a natural and scenic
52 river shall be according to best management practices; to ensure
53 that any natural and scenic river program shall be administered
54 solely by the State of Mississippi.

55 (4) The committee shall seek public oral and written
56 comments on the scenic rivers.

57 (5) The committee shall prepare a report of the study with
58 recommendations and file the report with the Legislature by
59 January 4, 2000. Upon presentation of its report to the
60 Legislature, the committee shall be dissolved.

61 (6) For purpose of the study, a "natural and scenic river"
62 means a river, stream or bayou or segment thereof that is in a
63 free-flowing condition, that has not been channelized, cleared and
64 snagged within the past five (5) years, realigned, inundated or

65 otherwise altered and has a shoreline covered by native vegetation
66 and has no or few man-made structures along its banks.

67 Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
68 and after its passage.
