## SENATE BILL NO. 2437

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE TO FIVE YEARS THE AMOUNT OF TIME THAT A PHYSICIAN MUST CERTIFY THAT A PERSON WILL HAVE A DISABILITY IN ORDER FOR SUCH PERSON TO BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE A SPECIAL LICENSE TAG FOR DISABLED PERSONS; TO PROVIDE THAT WINDSHIELD PLACARDS ISSUED BY THE STATE TAX COMMISSION SHALL BE VALID FOR THE PERIOD OF TIME THAT LICENSE TAGS ATTACHED UPON A MOTOR VEHICLE ARE VALID; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
10	SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
11	amended as follows:
12	27-19-56. (1) Upon application by any legal resident of the
13	State of Mississippi with a disability which limits or impairs the
14	ability to walk, the State Tax Commission shall prepare and issue
15	through the county tax collectors a special license plate bearing
16	the International Symbol of Access adopted by Rehabilitation
17	International in 1969 at its Eleventh World Congress on
18	Rehabilitation of the Disabled for not more than one (1) vehicle
19	that is registered in the applicant's name. The initial
20	application shall be accompanied by the certification of a
21	licensed physician that (a) the applicant meets the definition of
22	persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to
23	walk; and (b) that the physician has determined that the applicant
24	will have the disability for at least $\underline{\text{five (5)}}$ years. * * * The
25	special license plate issued under this section is valid for the
26	period of time that the license tag attached upon a motor vehicle
27	is issued pursuant to Section 27-19-31(1). A person to whom the
28	special license plate is issued may retain the special license

29 plate and may renew it by submitting to the county tax collector,

- 30 on or before its expiration, the certification of a licensed
- 31 physician that the physician has determined (a) that the applicant
- 32 meets the definition of a person with a disability which limits or
- 33 impairs the ability to walk; and (b) that the applicant will have
- 34 the disability for at least <u>five (5)</u> years. If an applicant fails
- 35 to renew the special license plate before its date of expiration,
- 36 then he shall surrender the special license plate to the county
- 37 tax collector and the tax collector shall issue to such person a
- 38 regular license plate to replace the special license plate.
- 39 The terms "vehicle" and "motor vehicle," as used in this
- 40 section, include motorcycles.
- The term "persons with disabilities which limit or impair the
- 42 ability to walk" when used in this section means those persons
- 43 who, as determined by a licensed physician:
- 44 (a) Cannot walk two hundred (200) feet without stopping
- 45 to rest; or
- 46 (b) Cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from,
- 47 a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device,
- 48 wheelchair, or other assistive device; or
- 49 (c) Are restricted by lung disease to such an extent
- 50 that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one
- 51 (1) second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one (1)
- 52 liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty (60)
- 53 mm/hg on room air at rest; or
- (d) Use portable oxygen; or
- (e) Have a cardiac condition to the extent that the
- 56 person's functional limitations are classified in severity as
- 57 Class III or Class IV according to standards set by the American
- 58 Heart Association; or
- (f) Are severely limited in their ability to walk due
- 60 to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition.
- An applicant for a special license plate bearing the
- 62 International Symbol of Access shall not be required to pay any
- 63 fee or charge for the issuance of such license plate separate from
- or in addition to the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad valorem
- 65 taxes and registration fees otherwise required by law to be paid
- 66 for the issuance of a regular license plate for such vehicle.

67 The State Tax Commission shall prepare removable 68 windshield placards and such placards shall be issued and periodically renewed upon the applications of persons with 69 disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk. 70 71 placards shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices of the tax collectors of the counties. 72 The initial application shall be accompanied by the certification of a 73 74 licensed physician that the applicant meets the definition of 75 persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to 76 These placards shall be valid for the period of time that 77 the license tag attached upon a motor vehicle is issued pursuant 78 to Section 27-19-31(1) and may be renewed in the same manner as provided for the renewal of the special license plates under 79 subsection (1) of this section. The removable windshield placard 80 must be displayed on the left side of the vehicle dashboard. 81 82 State Tax Commission shall prescribe the placement for 83 motorcycles. The State Tax Commission shall provide for the issuance 84 (3) of a temporary removable windshield placard, upon the application 85 of a person with a disability which limits or impairs the ability 86 87 to walk. Temporary removable windshield placards authorized by this subsection shall be prepared by the State Tax Commission and 88 89 shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices 90 of the tax collectors of the counties. Application for a temporary removable windshield placard must be accompanied by the 91 92 certification of a licensed physician that the applicant meets the 93 definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk. The certification shall also include the period 94

- 102 Commission shall prescribe the placement for motorcycles.
- 103 (4) The removable windshield placard and the temporary
- 104 removable windshield placard shall be two-sided and shall include:
- 105 (a) The International Symbol of Access, which is at
- 106 least three (3) inches in height, centered on the placard (the
- 107 color of the removable windshield placard shall be white on a blue
- 108 shield; and the temporary removable windshield placard shall be
- 109 white on a red shield);
- (b) An identification number and, on the reverse side,
- 111 the name of the individual to whom the placard is issued;
- 112 (c) A date of expiration, which shall be entered on the
- 113 placard by the tax collector; and
- 114 (d) The seal of the State of Mississippi.
- 115 (5) It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle in an area
- 116 set aside for persons who are disabled if the motor vehicle does
- 117 not have displayed the removable windshield placard authorized in
- 118 this section. Any person who unlawfully parks a motor vehicle in
- 119 such areas, or who blocks such spaces or access thereto, shall be
- 120 guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be
- 121 fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each such
- 122 violation. For the third and subsequent offenses under this
- 123 section, the offender's driver's license shall be suspended for
- 124 ninety (90) days by the Commissioner of Public Safety in
- 125 accordance with Section 63-1-53 in addition to any fine imposed.
- 126 The court shall not suspend or reduce any fine required to be
- 127 imposed under this subsection.
- 128 (6) Any person who, for the purpose of obtaining a special
- 129 license plate or windshield placard under this section, files with
- 130 the county tax collector a physician's certification, knowing the
- 131 certification to be false or to have been fraudulently obtained,
- 132 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be

- 133 fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).
- 134 (7) All law enforcement officers are authorized to enforce
- 135 this section on public and private property. Provision of spaces
- 136 restricted to handicapped parking and proper marking of such
- 137 spaces shall be considered as intent and permission to enforce
- 138 such designated parking on private property. Only areas marked in
- 139 accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility
- 140 Guidelines or equivalent standards shall be enforced. Spaces
- 141 shall bear the International Symbol of Access.
- 142 (8) Motor vehicles displaying a special license plate,
- 143 license plate decal, placard or parking certificate or permit
- 144 bearing the International Symbol of Access issued to a person with
- 145 a disability by any other state or district subject to the laws of
- 146 the United States shall be allowed the special parking privileges
- 147 under this section provided the license plate, decal, placard,
- 148 permit or certificate bears the International Symbol of Access and
- 149 is displayed in a prominent place on the vehicle.
- 150 (9) Parking in any area set aside for persons who are
- 151 disabled is limited to vehicles which, immediately before or after
- 152 the utilization of such an area, are used to transport a person
- 153 with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk.
- 154 The identification required to park in such an area, except as
- 155 provided in subsection (8) of this section, is as follows:
- 156 (a) For a vehicle used to transport a person with a
- 157 permanent disability, that person's permanent windshield placard
- 158 must be displayed.
- (b) For a vehicle being used by a person who has a
- 160 temporary disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk,
- 161 or which is being used to transport such a person, a temporary
- 162 windshield placard must be displayed.
- 163 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 164 and after July 1, 1999.
