SENATE BILL NO. 2487

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A TASK FORCE ON GANG BEHAVIOR IN 1 2 MISSISSIPPI TO COORDINATE THE EFFORTS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES TO STUDY, TRACK, IDENTIFY AND DEVELOP STRATEGIES FOR DEALING WITH 3 4 GANGS AND DEVIANT GROUPS; TO PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS TO THE TASK FORCE AND SPECIFY THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE 5 6 TASK FORCE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT OF THE TASK FORCE UNDER THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY; AND FOR 7 8 RELATED PURPOSES.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) There is created the Task Force on Gang 11 Behavior in Mississippi, the purpose of which is to coordinate the 12 efforts of law enforcement agencies in the state to study, track, 13 identify and develop strategies for dealing with gangs and deviant 14 groups and individuals.

(2) The task force shall be composed of the following voting 15 members: the Director of the Bureau of Narcotics, or his 16 17 designee; the Commissioner of Public Safety, or his designee; the chief drug investigator for the Mississippi Department of 18 19 Corrections; the Attorney General, or his designee; the State Superintendent of Education, or his designee; the President of the 20 21 Mississippi Sheriffs' Association, or his designee; the President 2.2 of the Mississippi Association of Chiefs of Police, or his designee; the President of the Mississippi Constables' 23 24 Association, or his designee; the Adjutant General of the 25 Mississippi National Guard, or his designee; the Director of the 26 Office of Youth Services of the Department of Human Services, or 27 his designee; a designee of the Mississippi Association of Black 28 Law Enforcement; a designee of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People; an appointee of the Lieutenant 29

No. 2487 99\SS02\R460 PAGE 1 30 Governor who is an expert in criminal justice and gang activity, 31 who shall serve as vice-chairman of the task force; and an 32 appointee of the Governor who is an expert in criminal justice and 33 gang activity, who shall serve as chairman of the task force.

34 (3) The Chairmen of the Senate and House Committees on
35 Juvenile Justice, Judiciary, Corrections and Education, or their
36 designees, shall serve in an advisory capacity as ex officio
37 nonvoting members of the task force.

38 (4) The Chairman of the Task Force on Gang Behavior shall be 39 appointed annually by the Governor, who shall call the initial 40 meeting of the task force. The task force shall adopt bylaws and 41 rules for its efficient operation, which may include designation 42 of its organizational structure including other officers and 43 committees, duties of committees, staff policies and other such 44 procedures as may be necessary.

45 (5) The task force shall be assigned to the Mississippi Department of Public Safety for administrative purposes only, and 46 47 the department shall designate staff to assist the task force. The task force shall have a line item in the budget of the 48 49 Department of Public Safety and shall be financed through the 50 department's annual appropriation wherein funds are made 51 available. Members of the task force may receive, within the 52 funds appropriated, reimbursement for travel expenses incurred while engaged in official business of the task force, except that 53 54 the legislative members shall be paid from the contingent expense funds of their respective houses. 55

56 (6) The task force shall meet and conduct business at least 57 quarterly. All meetings of the task force and any committees of 58 the task force shall be open to the public, with opportunities for 59 public comment.

60 (7) The task force may apply for and expend grants or other
61 contributions for the purpose of studying and tracking gang and
62 deviant activity in Mississippi.

63 (8) The Task Force on Gang Behavior in Mississippi shall64 have the following responsibilities:

65 (a) Serve as a liaison with the appropriate local law
66 enforcement agencies, public school officials, human services

track, study, identify and develop strategies for the prevention,
identification and suppression of illegal gang and deviant groups.

(b) Serve an advocacy and public awareness role with
the general public regarding illegal gang and deviant group
behavior.

(c) Recommend and make annual reports to the
Legislature and Governor regarding appropriate policies to reduce
illegal and deviant gang activity in Mississippi.

76 (d) Consult with experts and examine actions taken in77 other states regarding illegal gang activity.

78 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 79 and after July 1, 1999.
