COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2504

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO ISSUE A LIMITED DRIVER'S LICENSE FOR PERSONS USING BIOPTIC TELESCOPIC LENSES OR A DRIVING REHABILITATION PERMIT; TO PROVIDE A 4 FEE AND PLACE RESTRICTIONS ON SUCH LICENSES AND PERMITS; TO AUTHORIZE THE COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO ISSUE REGULATIONS GOVERNING SUCH LICENSES AND PERMITS; TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-33, 5 6 7 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN CONFORMITY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 8 9 10 SECTION 1. (1) The Commissioner of Public Safety may issue a limited driver's license for persons using bioptic telescopic

- lenses. The license shall be valid for one (1) year from the date 12
- of issuance. The commissioner may require the reevaluation of a 13
- licensee before the reissuance of a limited driver's license. 14
- 15 (2) The commissioner shall prepare and administer a test for
- 16 the central and peripheral vision of persons using bioptic
- telescopic lenses. If the person passes the test and is otherwise 17
- qualified, the person may receive a license under this section. 18
- (3) The commissioner may issue a one-year driving 19
- rehabilitation permit subject to such restrictions as the 20
- commissioner may require. 21
- (4) The fee for a license or permit issued under this 2.2
- 23 section shall be the fee required for one-year licenses under
- Section 63-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972. 2.4
- 25 (5) The commissioner may impose restrictions on any license
- or permit issued under this section and may issue rules and 26
- 27 regulations governing such licenses and permits.
- 28 SECTION 2. Section 63-1-33, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 29

30 63-1-33. It shall be the duty of the license examiner, when

31 application is made for an operator's license or temporary driving

- 32 permit, to test the applicant's ability to read and understand
- 33 road signs and to give the required signals as adopted by the
- 34 National Advisory Committee on Uniform Traffic Control Devices and
- 35 the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators.
- The commissioner shall have prepared and administer a test
- 37 composed of at least ten (10) questions relating to the safe
- 38 operation of a motor vehicle and testing the applicant's knowledge
- 39 of the proper operation of a motor vehicle.
- 40 * * *
- Prior to the administration of the test the license examiner
- 42 shall inspect the horn, lights, brakes, inspection certificate and
- 43 vehicle registration of the motor vehicle which the applicant
- 44 expects to operate while being tested, and if he finds that any of
- 45 the aforementioned items are deficient, no license or endorsement
- 46 shall be issued to the applicant until same have been repaired.
- Except as otherwise provided by Section 63-1-6, when
- 48 application is made for an original motorcycle endorsement or a
- 49 restricted motorcycle operator's license, the applicant shall be
- 50 required to pass a written test which consists of questions
- 51 relating to the safe operation of a motorcycle and a skill test
- 52 similar to the "Motorcycle Operator Skill Test," which is endorsed
- 53 by the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators. The
- 54 commissioner may exempt any applicant from the skill test if the
- 55 applicant presents a certificate showing successful completion of
- 56 a course approved by the commissioner, which includes a similar
- 57 examination of skills needed in the safe operation of a
- 58 motorcycle.
- 59 SECTION 3. Section 1 shall be codified in Chapter 1 of Title
- 60 63, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 62 and after July 1, 1999.
