5	SECTION 1. Section 9-7-123, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
6	amended as follows:
7	9-7-123. $\underline{(1)}$ The clerk of the circuit court shall have
8	power, with the approbation of the court, or of the judge in
9	vacation, to appoint one or more deputies, who shall take the oath
LO	of office and may give bond, and who thereupon shall have power to
L1	do and perform all the acts and duties which their principal may
L2	lawfully do; such approval, when given by the judge in vacation,
L3	shall be in writing, and shall be entered on the minutes of the
L4	court at the next term.
L5	(2) Each deputy clerk of the circuit court, before he enters
L6	upon the duties of the appointment, may give bond, with sufficient
L7	surety, to be payable, conditioned and approved as provided by
L8	law, in a penalty equal to three percent (3%) of the sum of all
L9	the state and county taxes shown by the assessment rolls and the
20	levies to have been collectible in the county for the year
21	immediately preceding the commencement of the term of office for
22	the circuit clerk. However, such bond shall not exceed the amount
23	of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00). And he may give
