- 1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 23-15-627 AND 23-15-713, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW QUALIFIED ELECTORS TO VOTE BY ABSENTEE BALLOT FOR ANY REASON; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 2 3 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 23-15-627, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 amended as follows: 7 23-15-627. The registrar shall be responsible for furnishing 8 an absentee ballot application form to any elector authorized to 9 receive a ballot. Such application shall be substantially in the 10 following form: "OFFICIAL APPLICATION FOR ABSENT ELECTOR'S BALLOT 11 12 I, _____, duly qualified and registered in the ___ Precinct of 13 the County of _____, and State of Mississippi, coming within the purview of the definition 'ABSENT ELECTOR' will be absent from the 14 county of my residence on election day, or unable to vote in 15 person because (check appropriate reason): 16 () (PRESIDENTIAL APPLICANT ONLY:) I am currently a 17 resident of Mississippi or have moved therefrom within thirty (30) 18 days of the coming presidential election. 19 20 () I am an enlisted or commissioned member, male or female, of any component of the United States Armed Forces and am 2.1 a citizen of Mississippi, or spouse or dependent of such member. 22) I am a member of the Merchant Marine or the American 23 Red Cross and am a citizen of Mississippi or spouse or dependent 24 25 of such member. 2.6 () I am a disabled war veteran who is a patient in any
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    hospital and am a citizen of Mississippi or spouse or dependent of
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    such veteran.
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         ( ) I am a civilian attached to and serving outside of the
    United States with any branch of the armed forces or with the
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    Merchant Marine or American Red Cross, and am a citizen of
    Mississippi or spouse or dependent of such civilian.
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               I am a citizen of Mississippi temporarily residing
    outside the territorial limits of the United States and the
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    District of Columbia.
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         ( ) I am a student, teacher or administrator at a college,
    university, junior or community college, high, junior high,
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    elementary or grade school, whose studies or employment at such
    institution necessitates my absence from the county of my voting
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    residence or spouse or dependent of such student, teacher or
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    administrator who maintains a common domicile outside the county
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    of my voting residence with such student, teacher or
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    administrator.
           ) I desire to vote by absentee ballot at this election.
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               I have a temporary or permanent physical disability.
               I am sixty-five (65) years of age or older.
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               I am the parent, spouse or dependent of a person with a
    temporary or permanent physical disability who is hospitalized
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    outside his county of residence or more than fifty (50) miles away
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    from his residence, and I will be with such person on election
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    day.
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               I am a member of the congressional delegation, or
    spouse or dependent of a member of the congressional delegation.

         SECTION 2. Section 23-15-713, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
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    amended as follows:
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         23-15-713. For the purpose of this subarticle, any duly
    qualified elector may vote as provided in this subarticle if he be
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    one who falls within the following categories:
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              (a) Any qualified elector who is a bona fide student,
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    teacher or administrator at any college, university, junior
    college, high, junior high or elementary grade school whose
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    studies or employment at such institution necessitates his absence
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from the county of his voting residence on the date of any

of said student, teacher or administrator if such spouse or

primary, general or special election, or the spouse and dependents

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- 93 dependent(s) maintain a common domicile, outside of the county of
- 94 his voting residence, with such student, teacher or administrator.
- 95 (b) Any qualified elector who is required to be away
- 96 from his place of residence on any election day due to his
- 97 employment as an employee of a member of the Mississippi
- 98 congressional delegation and the spouse and dependents of such
- 99 person if he or she shall be residing with such absentee voter
- 100 away from the county of the spouse's voting residence.
- 101 (c) Any qualified elector who <u>desires to vote by</u>
- 102 <u>absentee ballot</u> for any reason.
- 103 (d) Any person who has a temporary or permanent
- 104 physical disability.
- 105 (e) The parent, spouse or dependent of a person with a
- 106 temporary or permanent physical disability who is hospitalized
- 107 outside of his county of residence or more than fifty (50) miles
- 108 distant from his residence, if the parent, spouse or dependent
- 109 will be with such person on election day.
- 110 (f) Any person who is sixty-five (65) years of age or
- 111 older.
- 112 (g) Any member of the Mississippi congressional
- 113 delegation absent from Mississippi on election day, and the spouse
- 114 and dependents of such member of the congressional delegation.

- 116 SECTION 3. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
- 117 is directed to submit this act, immediately upon approval by the
- 118 Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a
- 119 veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the
- 120 United States District Court for the District of Columbia in
- 121 accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965,
- 122 as amended and extended.
- 123 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 124 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
- 125 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
