- 2 TO REQUIRE SLOW-MOVING TRAFFIC TO KEEP TO THE RIGHT LANE AND TO
- 3 PROVIDE THAT THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL
- 4 ERECT SIGNS ON HIGHWAYS SO DIRECTING; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-603, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 63-3-603. (1) Whenever any roadway has been divided into
- 9 three (3) or more clearly marked lanes for traffic, except through
- 10 or bypassing a municipality, the following rules in addition to
- 11 all others consistent herewith shall apply:
- 12 (a) A vehicle shall be driven as nearly as practical
- 13 entirely within a single lane and shall not be moved from such
- 14 lane until the driver has first ascertained that such movement can
- 15 be made with safety.
- 16 (b) A vehicle shall not be driven in the center lane
- 17 upon a roadway which is divided into three (3) lanes except when:
- 18 (i) Overtaking and passing another vehicle where
- 19 the roadway is clearly visible and such center lane is clear of
- 20 traffic within a safe distance;
- 21 (ii) Such vehicle is in preparation for a left
- 22 turn; or
- 23 (iii) Such center lane is at the time allocated
- 24 exclusively to traffic moving in the direction such vehicle is
- 25 proceeding and is signposted to give notice of such allocation.
- 26 (c) Official signs may be erected directing slow-moving
- 27 traffic to use a designated lane or allocating specified lanes to

- 28 traffic moving in the same direction, and drivers of vehicles
- 29 shall obey the directions of every such sign.
- 30 (d) Upon all roadways any vehicle proceeding at less
- 31 than the normal speed of traffic at the time and place and under
- 32 the conditions then existing shall be driven in the right-hand
- 33 lane then available for traffic, or as close as practicable to the
- 34 right-hand curb or edge of the roadway, except when overtaking and
- 35 passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction or when
- 36 preparing for a left turn at an intersection or into a private
- 37 road or driveway.
- 38 (e) Persons riding bicycles upon a roadway shall not
- 39 ride more than two (2) abreast except on paths or parts of
- 40 roadways set aside for the exclusive use of bicycles. Persons
- 41 riding two (2) abreast shall not impede the normal and reasonable
- 42 movement of traffic and, on a laned roadway, shall ride within a
- 43 single lane.
- 44 (2) (a) Whenever any highway has been divided into four (4)
- 45 <u>or more clearly marked lanes for traffic, the Mississippi</u>
- 46 Department of Transportation shall erect signs directing
- 47 <u>slow-moving traffic to use the right lane, and that violators will</u>
- 48 <u>be fined.</u>
- (b) Motorists traveling on any four (4) or more laned
- 50 <u>highway shall travel in the right lane and shall yield to</u>
- 51 <u>motorists travelling at a greater rate of speed. Violators shall</u>
- 52 be fined Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00).
- 53 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 54 and after July 1, 1999.
