SENATE BILL NO. 2569

AN ACT TO CODIFY SECTION 73-39-43, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
TO AUTHORIZE THE MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICINE TO
CERTIFY ANIMAL CONTROL AGENCIES TO UTILIZE CERTAIN CONTROLLED
SUBSTANCES FOR THE HUMANE DESTRUCTION OF ANIMALS AND TO CERTIFY
AND PRESCRIBE QUALIFICATIONS FOR CERTIFIED ANIMAL EUTHANASIA
TECHNICIANS (CAET) TO PERFORM EUTHANASIA OF ANIMALS; TO AMEND
SECTION 73-39-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE
MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF VETERINARY MEDICINE TO ADOPT RULES IN
CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 SECTION 1. The following provision shall be codified as
- 12 Section 73-39-43, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 73-39-43. (1) For purposes of this section, the following
- 14 terms shall have the meaning ascribed herein, unless the context
- 15 shall indicate otherwise:
- 16 (a) "Certified animal control agency" means a county or
- 17 municipal animal shelter, dog pound, or animal control agency,
- 18 private humane society, state, county or municipal law enforcement
- 19 agency, or any combination thereof, which temporarily houses
- 20 stray, unwanted or injured animals and which is certified pursuant
- 21 to the provisions of this section.
- 22 (b) "Certified animal euthanasia technician (CAET)"
- 23 means a person employed by a certified animal control agency who
- 24 is authorized by the Mississippi Board of Veterinary Medicine for
- 25 such use.
- 26 (c) "Board" means the Mississippi Board of Veterinary
- 27 Medicine.
- 28 (2) The Mississippi Board of Veterinary Medicine, upon
- 29 submission of a complete application and payment of a fee

30 established by the board, shall issue to any animal control agency

31 which it determines to be qualified, a certificate authorizing the

- 32 agency to apply to the Federal Drug Enforcement Agency, including
- 33 any successor entity, for a restricted controlled substance
- 34 registration certificate for the purchase, possession and use of
- 35 sodium pentobarbital or other drugs as authorized by the board for
- 36 administration by a certified animal euthanasia technician to
- 37 euthanize injured, sick or abandoned animals.
- 38 (3) The Mississippi Board of Veterinary Medicine, upon
- 39 submission of a complete application and payment of a fee
- 40 established by the board, shall issue to any person who it
- 41 determines to be qualified, a certificate for such person to
- 42 function as a certified animal euthanasia technician.
- 43 (4) Euthanasia of animals in a certified animal control
- 44 agency may only be performed by a licensed veterinarian, including
- 45 a licensed animal technician employed by and functioning under the
- 46 direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian, or a certified
- 47 animal euthanasia technician as provided by this section. A
- 48 certified animal control agency which employs a certified animal
- 49 euthanasia technician may purchase, possess and administer sodium
- 50 pentobarbital or such other drug which the board may approve for
- 51 the euthanasia of animals. Sodium pentobarbital and such other
- 52 drugs approved by the board shall be the only drugs used for the
- 53 euthanasia of animals in a certified animal control agency.
- 54 (5) Certified animal control agencies and certified animal
- 55 euthanasia technicians shall be required to renew their
- 56 certificates at such intervals, upon such conditions and upon the
- 57 payment of such fees as may be established by the board.
- SECTION 2. Section 73-39-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 59 amended as follows:
- 73-39-9. The board shall elect from their members a
- 61 president, vice-president and secretary-treasurer. The board is
- 62 authorized:
- 63 (a) To adopt reasonable rules governing the practice of
- 64 veterinary medicine as are necessary to enable it to carry out and
- 65 make effective the purpose and intent of this chapter. Such rules
- 66 shall be adopted and promulgated in accordance with the provisions

- 67 of this chapter.
- (b) To adopt rules of professional conduct appropriate
- 69 to establish and maintain a high standard of integrity, skills and
- 70 practice in the profession of veterinary medicine. In prescribing
- 71 such rules of professional conduct, the board may be guided by the
- 72 principles of veterinary medical ethics adopted by the American
- 73 Veterinary Medical Association and the Mississippi Veterinary
- 74 Medical Association.
- 75 (c) To have its rules printed which shall be
- 76 distributed to all licensed veterinarians.
- 77 (d) To bring proceedings in courts for the enforcement
- 78 of this chapter or any rules made pursuant thereto.
- 79 (e) To hold at least one (1) regular meeting on the
- 80 third Tuesday in June each year in the City of Jackson at such
- 81 time and location as fixed by the board, for the purpose of
- 82 conducting examinations of applicants for license to practice
- 83 veterinary medicine, the election of officers and to consider any
- 84 other business that may properly come before the board. Other
- 85 meetings may be held upon the call of the president and secretary
- 86 of the board.
- 87 (f) To pass upon the qualifications of applicants for a
- 88 license to practice veterinary medicine in this state, or for a
- 89 certificate as an animal technician.
- 90 (g) To prescribe the subjects, character, manner, time
- 91 and place of holding examinations and the filing of applications
- 92 for examinations and to conduct the examinations.
- 93 (h) To issue temporary permits to practice to duly
- 94 qualified applicants which shall be signed by the secretary.
- 95 (i) To provide for, regulate and require all persons
- 96 licensed in accordance with the provisions of this chapter to
- 97 renew their license annually; to require as a condition precedent
- 98 to such annual renewal the payment of the annual renewal fee as
- 99 provided herein; to issue annual renewal licenses to such persons

- 100 and to suspend or revoke the license of such persons who fail,
- 101 refuse or neglect to renew same or pay such fees.
- 102 (j) To conduct investigations and hearings upon
- 103 complaints calling for discipline of a licensee or applicant for
- 104 license.
- 105 (k) To take testimony on any matter under its
- 106 jurisdiction and any member thereof may administer oaths.
- 107 (1) To issue summons and subpoenas, including subpoenas
- 108 duces tecum, for any witness in connection with any matter within
- 109 the jurisdiction of the board, which shall be signed by either the
- 110 president or the secretary-treasurer of the board.
- 111 (m) To adopt such forms as it may deem necessary.
- 112 (n) To adopt rules and regulate the certification of
- 113 <u>animal control agencies and animal euthanasia technicians pursuant</u>
- 114 to Section 73-39-43, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 115 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 116 and after July 1, 1999.
