AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 23-15-625, 23-15-627, 23-15-631, 1 2 23-15-635, 23-15-719 AND 23-15-753, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 3 REQUIRE THAT BEFORE AN ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATION MAY BE 4 FURNISHED TO A VOTER, THE VOTER MUST MAKE AN ORAL OR WRITTEN REQUEST FOR SUCH APPLICATION; TO PROVIDE THAT NO PERSON, OTHER 5 THAN THE PARENT, CHILD, SPOUSE OR SIBLING OF A VOTER, MAY ORALLY б 7 REQUEST AN ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATION FOR SUCH VOTER; TO PROHIBIT A CANDIDATE FOR PUBLIC OFFICE FROM WITNESSING ABSENTEE BALLOT 8 9 APPLICATIONS; TO REQUIRE THE REGISTRAR OR DEPUTY REGISTRAR TO AFFIX THE SEAL OF THE CIRCUIT OR MUNICIPAL CLERK TO AND TO INITIAL 10 11 ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATIONS FURNISHED TO THE VOTER; TO PROVIDE THAT ONLY APPLICATIONS BEARING SUCH SEAL AND INITIAL SHALL BE 12 VALID; TO REQUIRE THAT ANY PERSON WHO PROVIDES THE REGISTRAR WITH 13 A WRITTEN REQUEST FOR AN ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATION TO SIGN SUCH 14 15 APPLICATION AND PROVIDE CERTAIN OTHER INFORMATION; TO PROVIDE THAT NO PERSON WHO IS A CANDIDATE FOR PUBLIC OFFICE MAY BE AN ATTESTING 16 17 WITNESS FOR ANY ABSENTEE BALLOT UPON WHICH SUCH PERSON'S NAME APPEARS; TO AUTHORIZE ANY VOTER CASTING AN ABSENTEE BALLOT WHO 18 DECLARES THAT HE REQUIRES ASSISTANCE TO VOTE BY REASON OF 19 BLINDNESS, TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT PHYSICAL DISABILITY OR INABILITY TO READ OR WRITE, TO RECEIVE CERTAIN ASSISTANCE; TO MAKE IT 20 21 UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO COMPENSATE ANOTHER PERSON FOR ASSISTING 22 23 VOTERS IN MARKING THEIR ABSENTEE BALLOT TO BASE SUCH COMPENSATION ON THE NUMBER OF ABSENTEE BALLOTS ASSISTED OR THE NUMBER OF 2.4 ABSENTEE BALLOTS CAST BY PERSONS WHO HAVE RECEIVED SUCH 25 26 ASSISTANCE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

27 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- 28 SECTION 1. Section 23-15-625, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 29 amended as follows:

30 23-15-625. (1) The registrar shall be authorized to

- 31 disburse applications for absentee ballots to any qualified
- 32 <u>elector within the county where he serves upon a proper request by</u>
- 33 such elector for such application. The registrar shall keep a
- 34 permanent ledger for the purpose of showing the number of
- 35 applications and the persons to whom the applications were given.
- 36 Any person who presents to the registrar the oral or written
- 37 request for an absentee ballot application for a voter entitled to
- 38 vote absentee by mail, other than the elector who seeks to vote by
- 39 absentee ballot shall, in the presence of the registrar, sign such

41 address, the name of the elector for whom the application is being 42 requested and the person's relationship to the elector, if any, in 43 the place provided for on the application for such purpose. If an 44 elector picks up applications for another person, the elector 45 shall indicate on the ledger the name or names of the persons for 46 whom he is obtaining the applications.

(2) The registrar in the county wherein a voter is qualified 47 to vote upon receiving the envelope containing the absentee 48 49 ballots shall keep an accurate list of all persons preparing such ballots, which list shall be kept in a conspicuous place 50 accessible to the public near the entrance to his office. 51 The 52 registrar shall also furnish to each precinct manager a list of 53 the names of all persons in each respective precinct voting absentee ballots to be posted in a conspicuous place at the 54 55 polling place for public notice. The application on file with the 56 registrar and the envelopes containing the ballots shall be kept 57 by the registrar and deposited in the proper precinct ballot boxes before such boxes are delivered to the election commissioners or 58 59 managers. At the time such boxes are delivered to the election 60 commissioners or managers, the registrar shall also turn over a 61 list of all such persons who have voted and whose ballots are in 62 the box.

63 SECTION 2. Section 23-15-627, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 64 amended as follows:

(1) The registrar shall be responsible for 65 23-15-627. 66 furnishing an absentee ballot application form to any elector 67 authorized to receive an absentee ballot. Absentee ballot applications shall be furnished to an elector who seeks to vote by 68 69 absentee ballot only upon the oral or written request of such 70 elector, or furnished to any other person for an elector who seeks to vote by absentee ballot only upon the written request of such 71 elector; provided, however, that the parent, child, spouse or 72 sibling of such an elector may orally request an absentee ballot 73 74 application on behalf of such elector. An absentee ballot application must have the seal of the circuit or municipal clerk 75 76 affixed to it and be initialed by the registrar or his deputy in 77 order to be utilized to obtain an absentee ballot. A reproduction S. B. No. 2580

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78 of an absentee ballot application shall not be valid unless it is

79 <u>a reproduction provided by the office of the registrar of the</u> 30 <u>jurisdiction in which the election is being held and which</u> 31 <u>contains the seal and initials required by this section.</u> Such 32 application shall be substantially in the following form: 33 "OFFICIAL APPLICATION FOR ABSENT ELECTOR'S BALLOT

101 () I am a civilian attached to and serving outside of the
102 United States with any branch of the Armed Forces or with the
103 Merchant Marine or American Red Cross, and am a citizen of
104 Mississippi or spouse or dependent of such civilian.

105 () I am a citizen of Mississippi temporarily residing
106 outside the territorial limits of the United States and the
107 District of Columbia.

108 () I am a student, teacher or administrator at a college,
109 university, junior or community college, high, junior high,
110 elementary or grade school, whose studies or employment at such
111 institution necessitates my absence from the county of my voting
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112 residence or spouse or dependent of such student, teacher or administrator who maintains a common domicile outside the county 113 114 of my voting residence with such student, teacher or 115 administrator.

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I will be outside the county on election day. I have a temporary or permanent physical disability. ()

I am sixty-five (65) years of age or older. ()

119 I am the parent, spouse or dependent of a person with a () 120 temporary or permanent physical disability who is hospitalized 121 outside his county of residence or more than fifty (50) miles away 122 from his residence, and I will be with such person on election 123 day.

I am a member of the congressional delegation, or spouse 124 () or dependent of a member of the congressional delegation. 125

126 I am required to be at work on election day during the () 127 times at which the polls will be open.

128 I hereby make application for an official ballot, or ballots, to be voted by me at the election to be held in _____, on _ 129 130 Send 'Absent Elector's Ballot' to me at the following address

132 I realize that I can be fined up to Five Thousand Dollars 133 (\$5,000.00) and sentenced up to five (5) years in the penitentiary 134 for making a false statement in this application and for selling 135 my vote and violating the Mississippi Absentee Voter Law. (This 136 sentence is to be in bold print.)

137 If you are temporarily or permanently disabled, you are not required to have this application notarized or signed by an 138 139 official authorized to administer oaths for absentee balloting. 140 You are required to sign this application in the proper place and have a person eighteen (18) years of age or older witness your 141 142 signature and sign this application in the proper place.

143 DO NOT SIGN WITHOUT READING. (This sentence is to be in bold 144 print.)

169	witness on an Official Application for Absent Elector's Ballot.
170	SECTION 3. Section 23-15-631, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
171	amended as follows:
172	23-15-631. (1) The registrar shall enclose with each ballot
173	provided to an absent elector separate printed instructions
174	furnished by him containing the following:
175	(a) All absentee voters, excepting those with temporary
176	or permanent physical disabilities or those who are sixty-five
177	(65) years of age or older, who mark their ballots in the county
178	of the residence shall use the registrar of that county as the
179	witness. Said absentee voter shall come to the office of the
180	registrar and neither the registrar nor his deputy shall be
181	required to go out of the registrar's office to serve as an
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182 attesting witness.

(b) Upon receipt of the enclosed ballot, you will not mark same except in view or sight of the attesting witness. In the sight or view of the attesting witness, mark the ballot according to instructions.

187 After marking the ballot, fill out and sign the (C) 188 "ELECTOR'S CERTIFICATE" on back of the envelope so that the 189 signature shall be across the flap of the envelope so as to insure 190 the integrity of the ballot. All absent electors shall have the 191 attesting witness sign the "ATTESTING WITNESS CERTIFICATE" on back 192 of the envelope. Place necessary postage on the envelope and 193 deposit it in the post office or some government receptacle provided for deposit of mail so that the absent elector's ballot, 194 excepting presidential absentee ballots, will reach the registrar 195 196 in which your precinct is located not later than 5:00 p.m. on the 197 day preceding the date of the election, or by personally 198 delivering such ballot to the registrar's office not later than 12:00 noon on the Saturday immediately preceding elections held on 199 200 Tuesday, the Thursday immediately preceding elections held on 201 Saturday, and the second day immediately preceding elections held 202 on other days.

203 Any notary public, United States postmaster, assistant United 204 States postmaster, United States postal supervisor, clerk in 205 charge of a contract postal station, or any officer having 206 authority to administer an oath or take an acknowledgment may be 207 an attesting witness; provided, however, that in the case of an 208 absent elector who is temporarily or permanently physically 209 disabled, the attesting witness may be any person eighteen (18) 210 years of age or older and such person is not required to have the 211 authority to administer an oath. If a postmaster, assistant 212 postmaster, postal supervisor, or clerk in charge of a contract postal station acts as an attesting witness, his signature on the 213 214 elector's certificate must be authenticated by the cancellation 215 stamp of their respective post offices. officers herein named acts as attesting witness, his signature on the elector's certificate, together with his title and address, but no seal, shall be required. Any affidavits made by an absent elector who is in the armed forces may be executed before a commissioned officer, warrant officer, or noncommissioned officer not lower in grade than sergeant rating, or any person authorized to administer oaths.

(d) When the application accompanies the ballot it
shall not be returned in the same envelope as the ballot but shall
be returned in a separate pre-addressed envelope provided by the
registrar.

227 (e) No person who is a candidate for public office may
 228 be an attesting witness for any absentee ballot upon which such
 229 person's name appears.

230 (f) Any voter casting an absentee ballot who declares 231 that he requires assistance to vote by reason of blindness, 232 temporary or permanent physical disability or inability to read or write, shall be entitled to receive assistance in the marking of 233 234 his absentee ballot and in completing the affidavit on the 235 absentee ballot envelope. The voter may be given assistance by 236 anyone of the voter's choice other than a candidate whose name appears on the absentee ballot being marked, or the voter's 237 238 employer, or agent of that employer or officer or agent of the 239 voter's union. In order to ensure the integrity of the ballot, 240 any person who provides assistance to an absentee voter shall be 241 required to sign and complete the "Certificate of Person Providing 242 Voter Assistance" on the absentee ballot envelope. A person who provides assistance in the marking of an absentee ballot shall not 243 be the attesting witness to such absentee ballot, unless the 244 person is the parent, child, spouse or sibling of the absentee 245 246 voter. 247 (2) The foregoing instructions required to be provided by 248 the registrar to the elector shall also constitute the substantive

249 law pertaining to the handling of absentee ballots by the elector S. B. No. 2580 99\SS02\R388.1 PAGE 7 250 and registrar.

251 SECTION 4. Section 23-15-635, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 252 amended as follows:

23 23-15-635. (1) The form of the elector's certificate * * *,
attesting witness certification <u>and certificate of person</u>
<u>providing voter assistance</u> on the back of the envelope used by
voters who do not use the registrar of their county of residence
as an attesting witness shall be as follows:

(1) 319 Immediately upon completion of an 320 application filed pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (a) of 321 Section 23-15-715, the registrar shall deliver the necessary

Section 23-15-753, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 380 amended as follows: 381 23-15-753. (1) Any person who willfully, unlawfully and 382 feloniously procures, seeks to procure, or seeks to influence the 383 vote of any person voting by absentee ballot, by the payment of money, the promise of payment of money, or by the delivery of any 384 385 other item of value or promise to give such voter any item of 386 value, or by promising or giving such voter any favor or reward in 387 an effort to influence his vote, or any person who aids, abets, 388 assists, encourages, helps, or causes any person voting an 389 absentee ballot to violate any provision of law pertaining to 390 absentee voting, or any person who sells his vote for money, favor, or reward, has been paid or promised money, a reward, a 391 392 favor or favors, or any other item of value, or any person who shall willfully swear falsely to any affidavit provided for in 393 394 Sections 23-15-621 through 23-15-735, shall be guilty of the crime

of "vote fraud" and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a

fine of not less than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) nor more than

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Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail for no more than one (1) year, or by both such fine and imprisonment, or by being sentenced to the State Penitentiary for not less than one (1) year nor more than five (5) years.

401 (2) It shall be unlawful for any person who pays or 402 compensates another person for assisting voters in marking their absentee ballots to base such pay or compensation on the number of 403 404 absentee voters assisted or the number of absentee ballots cast by persons who have received such assistance. Any person who 405 406 violates the provisions of this subsection shall be guilty of a 407 felony and, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than One 408 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) nor more than Five Thousand Dollars 409 (\$5,000.00), or imprisoned in the State Penitentiary for not less than one (1) year nor more than five (5) years, or by both such 410 411 fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 7. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi is hereby directed to submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

419 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from 420 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 421 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
