SENATE BILL NO. 2609

AN ACT TO DIRECT THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO ESTABLISH A
PRE-KINDERGARTEN "PARENTS AS TEACHERS PILOT PROGRAM" IN THE SCHOOL
DISTRICTS IN THE STATE TO ASSIST PARENTS IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF
LEARNING SKILLS OF THEIR CHILDREN FROM BIRTH TO AGE FIVE; TO SET
FORTH THE OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAM; TO SET FORTH THE COMPONENTS
OF THE PROGRAM; TO SET FORTH PROCEDURES FOR APPLICATION; TO
PROVIDE FOR FUNDING; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- 9 SECTION 1. (1) The State Board of Education shall provide
- for the establishment of a pre-kindergarten pilot program in the 10
- public schools of Mississippi for children under the age of five 11
- (5) years, which shall be designated the "Parents as Teachers 12
- Pilot Program" following the procedures set forth in this section. 13
- 14 The Parents as Teachers Pilot Program shall provide parent
- 15 education services, including resource materials on home learning
- activities, private and group educational guidance, individual and 16
- group learning experiences for the parent and child, and other 17
- activities that enable the parent to improve learning in the home. 18
- 19 The objectives of the Parents as Teachers Pilot Program shall be
- as follows: 20
- The program shall be an early childhood parent 21
- 22 education and family support program designed to empower all
- parents to give their child the best possible start in life, based 23
- on the philosophy that parents are their children's first and most 24
- 25 influential teachers.
- 26 (b) The program shall be a home-school-community
- 27 partnership providing parents with information on child
- development from birth to age five (5) which suggests learning 28

- 29 opportunities that encourage language and intellectual growth,
- 30 basic skills leading to reading instruction, and physical and
- 31 social skills.
- 32 (c) The program shall be voluntary.
- 33 (2) Components of the Parents as Teachers Pilot Program
- 34 shall include, but shall not be limited to:
- 35 (a) Personalized home visits by certified parent
- 36 educators, trained in child development, who assist parents in
- 37 understanding what to expect in each stage of their child's
- 38 development, and recommend methods to encourage learning and
- 39 promote strong parent-child relationships.
- 40 (b) Parent group meetings in which parents share
- 41 concerns and successes and participate in group parent-child
- 42 activities.
- 43 (c) Periodic screening services of the child's overall
- 44 development, language, hearing and vision, in order to provide
- 45 early detection of potential learning problems.
- 46 (d) Provide families with access to other early
- 47 childhood services and related community services.
- 48 (3) The State Board of Education shall establish rules and
- 49 regulations for the submission of school district applications for
- 50 the Parents as Teachers Pilot Program and criteria and procedures
- 51 for the operation of the program by local school districts. The
- 52 State Board of Education shall receive and review applications for
- 53 the program from local school boards and may award program funding
- 54 to up to six (6) local school districts throughout the state, with
- one (1) district in each Mississippi congressional district as
- 56 such districts exist on the effective date of this and at least
- 57 one (1) local school district situated in the Delta region of the
- 58 state, unless there are no applications submitted from a
- 59 particular congressional district or the Delta.
- 60 (4) A Parents as Teachers Pilot Program may be funded by:
- 61 federal funds, nonminimum or nonadequate education program school
- 62 district funds, grants, gifts or donations from any private
- 63 sources, and any state funds appropriated for the support of the
- 64 Parents as Teachers Pilot Program. Any state funds shall be
- 65 specifically appropriated for the purpose of supporting the

- 66 Parents as Teachers Pilot Program.
- 67 (5) School districts that offer an approved Parents as
- 68 Teachers Pilot Program shall be eligible for state reimbursement
- 69 subject to appropriations therefor for each participating family.
- 70 If a school district fails or is unable to offer an approved
- 71 program the district shall enter into a contract which meets the
- 72 requirements of this subsection with another district or public
- 73 agency offering an approved program for such services. If the
- 74 district finds that no approved program is available in another
- 75 district or through public agencies, it shall request the State
- 76 Department of Education to assist it in obtaining from an approved
- 77 program services at the reimbursable rate. Costs of contractual
- 78 arrangements shall be the obligation of the school district of
- 79 residence of each preschool child. Costs of contractual
- 80 arrangements shall not exceed an amount equal to an amount
- 81 reimbursable to the school districts under the provisions of this
- 82 section. No program shall be approved or contract entered into
- 83 which requires any additional payment by participants or their
- 84 parents or guardians. Payments for participants for Parents as
- 85 Teachers Pilot Programs shall be uniform for all districts or
- 86 public agencies.
- 87 (6) No person shall be required to participate in any
- 88 Parents as Teachers Pilot Program.
- 89 (7) The State Board of Education shall evaluate the Parents
- 90 as Teachers Pilot Program in participating school districts and
- 91 shall report to the Legislature and the Governor on or before
- 92 August 1, 2000, identifying exemplary programs and making
- 93 recommendations regarding methods and criteria for funding such
- 94 programs.
- 95 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 96 and after July 1, 1999.
