SENATE BILL NO. 2616

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11-46-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 ALLOW FOSTER PARENTS TO BE COVERED UNDER THE TORT CLAIMS ACT; AND 3 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 11-46-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 11-46-1. As used in this chapter the following terms shall 8 have the meanings herein ascribed unless the context otherwise 9 requires:

10 (a) "Claim" means any demand to recover damages from a11 governmental entity as compensation for injuries.

12 (b) "Claimant" means any person seeking compensation 13 under the provisions of this chapter, whether by administrative 14 remedy or through the courts.

15 (c) "Board" means the Mississippi Tort Claims Board.
16 (d) "Department" means the Department of Finance and
17 Administration.

18 (e) "Director" means the executive director of the19 department who is also the executive director of the board.

(f) "Employee" means any officer, employee or servant of the State of Mississippi or a political subdivision of the state, including elected or appointed officials and persons acting on behalf of the state or a political subdivision in any official capacity, temporarily or permanently, in the service of the state or a political subdivision whether with or without compensation. The term "employee" shall not mean a person or other legal entity

No. 2616 99\SS02\R617 PAGE 1 27 while acting in the capacity of an independent contractor under 28 contract to the state or a political subdivision; provided, however, that for purposes of the limits of liability provided for 29 in Section 11-46-15, the term "employee" shall include physicians 30 31 under contract to provide health services with the State Board of 32 Health, the State Board of Mental Health or any county or municipal jail facility while rendering services under such 33 34 The term "employee" shall also include Mississippi contract. Department of Human Services licensed foster parents for the 35 limited purposes of coverage under the Tort Claims Act for 36 adequate supervision and care of foster children. 37

38 (g) "Governmental entity" means and includes the state39 and political subdivisions as herein defined.

40 (h) "Injury" means death, injury to a person, damage to
41 or loss of property or any other injury that a person may suffer
42 that is actionable at law or in equity.

"Political subdivision" means any body politic or 43 (i) 44 body corporate other than the state responsible for governmental 45 activities only in geographic areas smaller than that of the state, including, but not limited to, any county, municipality, 46 47 school district, community hospital as defined in Section 41-13-10, Mississippi Code of 1972, airport authority or other 48 instrumentality thereof, whether or not such body or 49 50 instrumentality thereof has the authority to levy taxes or to sue 51 or be sued in its own name.

(j) "State" means the State of Mississippi and any office, department, agency, division, bureau, commission, board, institution, hospital, college, university, airport authority or other instrumentality thereof, whether or not such body or instrumentality thereof has the authority to levy taxes or to sue or be sued in its own name.

(k) "Law" means all species of law including but not
limited to any and all constitutions, statutes, case law, common
law, customary law, court order, court rule, court decision, court
opinion, court judgment or mandate, administrative rule or
regulation, executive order, or principle or rule of equity.
SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
