## SENATE BILL NO. 2625

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY, 1
- 2
- MISSISSIPPI, TO PAY AN ANNUAL SUPPLEMENT TO THE SHERIFF OF THE 3
- COUNTY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 25-3-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 25-3-25. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections
- (2) through (9), the salaries of sheriffs of the various counties 9
- 10 are hereby fixed as full compensation for their services.
- From and after October 1, 1998, the annual salary for each 11
- 12 sheriff shall be based upon the total population of his county
- according to the latest federal decennial census in the following 13
- categories and for the following amounts; however, no sheriff 14
- 15 shall be paid less than the salary authorized under this section
- to be paid the sheriff based upon the population of the county 16
- 17 according to the 1980 federal decennial census:
- (a) For counties with a total population of more than 18
- two hundred thousand (200,000), a salary of Seventy-five Thousand 19
- 20 Dollars (\$75,000.00).
- (b) For counties with a total population of more than 2.1
- 22 one hundred thousand (100,000) and not more than two hundred
- thousand (200,000), a salary of Seventy Thousand Dollars 23
- 24 (\$70,000.00).
- 25 (c) For counties with a total population of more than
- forty-five thousand (45,000) and not more than one hundred 26
- thousand (100,000), a salary of Sixty-five Thousand Dollars 2.7
- (\$65,000.00). 28
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- 29 (d) For counties with a total population of more than
- thirty-four thousand (34,000) and not more than forty-five 30
- 31 thousand (45,000), a salary of Sixty Thousand Dollars
- (\$60,000.00). 32
- 33 (e) For counties with a total population of more than
- twenty-five thousand (25,000) and not more than thirty-four 34
- thousand (34,000), a salary of Fifty-two Thousand Dollars 35
- (\$52,000.00). 36
- 37 (f) For counties with a total population of more than
- 38 fifteen thousand (15,000) and not more than twenty-five thousand
- (25,000), a salary of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). 39
- 40 (g) For counties with a total population of more than
- nine thousand five hundred (9,500) and not more than fifteen 41
- thousand (15,000), a salary of Forty-seven Thousand Dollars 42
- (\$47,000.00). 43
- 44 For counties with a total population of more than
- 45 seven thousand five hundred (7,500) and not more than nine
- thousand five hundred (9,500), a salary of Forty-five Thousand 46
- 47 Dollars (\$45,000.00).
- (i) For counties with a total population of not more 48
- 49 than seven thousand five hundred (7,500), a salary of Forty-two
- Thousand Dollars (\$42,000.00). 50
- 51 In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 52 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Leflore County may,
- 53 in its discretion, pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 54 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 55 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 56 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- county for the following reasons: 57
- 58 The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 59 and maintains a restitution center within the county;
- 60 The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates (b)
- and maintains a community work center within the county; 61
- 62 There is a resident circuit court judge in the (C) S. B. No. 2625 99\SS01\R736

- 63 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;
- 64 There is a resident chancery court judge in the
- 65 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;
- (e) The Magistrate for the Fourth Circuit Court 66
- 67 District is located in the county and maintains his office at the
- Leflore County Courthouse; 68
- 69 The Region VI Mental Health-Mental Retardation (f)
- Center, which serves a multicounty area, calls upon the sheriff to 70
- 71 provide security for out-of-town mental patients, as well as
- 72 patients from within the county;
- The increased activity of the Child Support 73
- 74 Division of the Department of Human Services in enforcing in the
- 75 courts parental obligations has imposed additional duties on the
- 76 sheriff; and
- 77 The dispatchers of the enhanced E-911 system in
- 78 place in Leflore County has been placed under the direction and
- 79 control of the sheriff.
- (3) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 80
- 81 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Rankin County may, in
- 82 its discretion, pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 83 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 84
- 85 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- county for the following reasons: 86
- The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates 87
- 88 and maintains the Central Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 89 the county;
- The State Hospital is operated and maintained 90 (b)
- within the county at Whitfield; 91
- Hudspeth Regional Center, a facility maintained for 92
- 93 the care and treatment of the mentally retarded, is located within
- 94 the county;
- 95 The Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers Training
- 96 Academy is operated and maintained within the county;

- 97 (e) The State Fire Academy is operated and maintained
- 98 within the county;
- 99 (f) The Pearl River Valley Water Supply District,
- 100 ordinarily known as the "Reservoir District," is located within
- 101 the county;
- 102 (g) The Jackson International Airport is located within
- 103 the county;
- 104 (h) The patrolling of the state properties located
- 105 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff;
- 106 and
- 107 (i) The sheriff, in addition to providing security to
- 108 the nearly one hundred thousand (100,000) residents of the county,
- 109 has the duty to investigate, solve and assist in the prosecution
- 110 of any misdemeanor or felony committed upon any state property
- 111 located in Rankin County.
- 112 (4) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 113 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Neshoba County shall
- 114 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county an amount
- equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).
- 116 (5) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 117 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Tunica County may, in
- 118 their discretion, pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 119 county an amount equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00),
- 120 payable beginning April 1, 1997.
- 121 (6) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 122 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Hinds County shall
- 123 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount
- 124 equal to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). The Legislature
- 125 finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this
- 126 subsection is justified in such county for the following reasons:
- 127 (a) Hinds County has the greatest population of any
- 128 county, two hundred fifty-four thousand four hundred forty-one
- 129 (254,441) by the 1990 census, being almost one hundred thousand
- 130 (100,000) more than the next most populous county;

- 131 (b) Hinds County is home to the state capitol and the
- 132 seat of all state government offices;
- 133 (c) Hinds County is the third largest county in
- 134 geographic area, containing eight hundred seventy-five (875)
- 135 square miles;
- 136 (d) Hinds County is comprised of two (2) judicial
- 137 districts, each having a courthouse and county office buildings;
- (e) There are four (4) resident circuit judges, four
- 139 (4) resident chancery judges, and three (3) resident county judges
- 140 in Hinds County, the most of any county, with the sheriff acting
- 141 as chief executive officer and provider of bailiff services for
- 142 all;
- 143 (f) The main offices for the clerk and most of the
- 144 judges and magistrates for the United States District Court for
- 145 the Southern District of Mississippi are located within the
- 146 county;
- 147 (g) The state's only urban university, Jackson State
- 148 University, is located within the county;
- 149 (h) The University of Mississippi Medical Center,
- 150 combining the medical school, dental school, nursing school and
- 151 hospital, is located within the county;
- 152 (i) Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium, the state's
- 153 largest sports arena, is located within the county;
- 154 (j) The Mississippi State Fairgrounds, including the
- 155 Coliseum and Trade Mart, are located within the county;
- 156 (k) Hinds County has the largest criminal population in
- 157 the state, such that the Hinds County Sheriff's Department
- 158 operates the largest county jail system in the state, housing
- 159 almost one thousand (1,000) inmates in three (3) separate
- 160 detention facilities;
- 161 (1) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department handles more
- 162 mental and drug and alcohol commitments cases than any other
- 163 sheriff's department in the state;
- 164 (m) The Mississippi Department of Corrections maintains S. B. No. 2625  $99\scalebox{NS}01\R736$

- 165 a restitution center within the county;
- 166 (n) The Mississippi Department of Corrections regularly
- 167 houses as many as one hundred (100) state convicts within the
- 168 Hinds County jail system; and
- 169 (o) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department is regularly
- 170 asked to provide security services not only at the Fairgrounds and
- 171 Memorial Stadium, but also for events at the Mississippi Museum of
- 172 Art and Jackson City Auditorium.
- 173 (7) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 174 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Wilkinson County, in
- 175 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 176 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 177 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 178 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 179 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts
- 180 for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private
- 181 correctional facility within the county.
- 182 (8) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 183 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Marshall County, in
- 184 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 185 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 186 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 187 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 188 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts
- 189 for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private
- 190 correctional facility within the county.
- 191 (9) In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of
- 192 this section, the Board of Supervisors of Greene County, in its
- 193 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 194 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 195 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 196 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 197 county for the following reasons:
- 198 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates S. B. No. 2625  $99\$  SS01\R736

- 199 and maintains the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 200 the county;
- 201 In 1996, additional facilities to house another one
- 202 thousand four hundred sixteen (1,416) male offenders were
- 203 constructed at the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 204 the county; and
- 205 (c) The patrolling of the state properties located
- 206 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff
- 207 justifying additional compensation.
- 208 (10) <u>In addition to the salary provided for in subsection</u>
- 209 (1) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Franklin County,
- 210 in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of
- 211 the county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 212
- supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 213
- 214 county because the sheriff has certain contractual duties
- 215 regarding a regional correctional facility within Jefferson County
- used for the private incarceration of state inmates. 216
- 217 (11) The salaries herein provided shall be payable monthly
- on the first day of each calendar month by chancery clerk's 218
- 219 warrant drawn on the general fund of the county; however, the
- board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and entered on 220
- 221 its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be paid
- 222 semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month.
- pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments 223
- 224 shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the weekend or
- 225 legal holiday.
- The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 226 SECTION 2.
- 227 is directed to submit this act, immediately upon approval by the
- 228 Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a
- 229 veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the
- United States District Court for the District of Columbia in 230
- 231 accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965,
- 232 as amended and extended.

233 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 234 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 235 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, or October 1, 1999, 236 whichever occurs later.
