| 8 | 73-63-7. (1) A person shall not use the term "Registered |
| 9 | Professional Geologist" unless that person is registered under |

- 28 a person shall be construed to engage in the practice of geology
- 29 or offer to practice geology under this chapter if that person:
- 30 (a) Practices any branch of geology;
- 31 (b) Represents by verbal claim, sign, advertisement,
- 32 letterhead, card or any other way or implies through the use of
- 33 the title "geologist" that the person is registered under this
- 34 chapter;
- 35 (c) Holds himself or herself out as able to perform or
- 36 does perform any geologic services or work recognized by the board
- 37 as the practice of geology; or
- 38 (d) Makes geologic determinations and evaluations which
- 39 may affect the public welfare including, but not limited to, the
- 40 following activities: protection of groundwater to ensure
- 41 adequate quality and quantity for present and future generations;
- 42 prevention and remediation of contamination of the earth, earth
- 43 materials and water from improper disposal or accidental spills;
- 44 determination of the suitability and risks in containment and
- 45 disposal of wastes and hazardous materials including but not
- 46 limited to landfills, storage tanks, and injection wells; siting
- 47 of boreholes, depth of wells to be drilled, depth of casing and
- 48 grouting requirements for the construction of monitoring wells or
- 49 other borings into the earth that may affect one or more aquifers;
- 50 the suitability for construction projects including excavations,
- 51 buildings, dams, highways, and other structures which may be
- 52 affected by floods, landslides, earthquakes, sinkholes, erosion,
- 53 expansive/contractive earth and earth materials, etc. These
- 54 geologic determinations and evaluations do not include the design
- of structures as defined by Title 73, Chapter 13 and other
- 56 engineering-related activities as clearly defined and mutually
- 57 agreed upon between the Board of Registered Professional
- 58 Geologists and the Board of Registration for Professional
- 59 Engineers and Land Surveyors in the memorandum of understanding
- 60 authorized under Section 73-63-53. <u>In the absence of the</u>

- 61 memorandum of understanding, qualified geologists and engineers
- 62 <u>shall not be restricted from engaging in activities of either</u>
- 63 profession where those activities are incidental to the duties of
- 64 his profession and are in compliance with the registration laws,
- 65 <u>codes of ethics/professional conduct associated with his</u>
- 66 professional affiliation.
- 67 (4) Any geologic report or geologic portion of a report,
- 68 which incorporates or is based on a geologic study or on geologic
- 69 data and is required by or supporting compliance with any federal,
- 70 state or local governmental law, ordinance, rule or regulation
- 71 shall be prepared by or under the supervision of a registered
- 72 professional geologist as evidenced by the geologist's signature
- 73 and seal.
- 74 (5) The following activities shall not require registration
- 75 under this chapter:
- 76 (a) Geological work performed by an employee or a
- 77 subordinate of a registered professional geologist, if that work
- 78 does not include responsible charge of geological work, and if the
- 79 work is performed under the direct supervision of a registered
- 80 professional geologist, who is responsible for that work;
- 81 (b) Geological work performed exclusively in the
- 82 exploration for and development (proving out) of petroleum
- 83 resources, including the giving of testimony, or preparation and
- 84 presentation of exhibits or documents regarding petroleum
- 85 resources for the sole purpose of consideration by, or being
- 86 placed into evidence before, any administrative agency, judicial
- 87 tribunal or public hearing, if the testimony, exhibits or
- 88 documents do not imply that the person is registered under this
- 89 chapter;
- 90 (c) The practice of engineering, including the
- 91 acquisition of engineering data and the utilization of these data
- 92 in analysis, design, and construction by professional engineers
- 93 appropriately registered in this state;

- 94 (d) Work customarily performed by physical or natural
- 95 scientists such as chemists, archaeologists, geographers,
- 96 oceanographers, pedologists and soil scientists, if that work does
- 97 not include the planning and execution of geologic investigations,
- 98 being in responsible charge of geologic work or the drawing of
- 99 geologic conclusions and making recommendations involving the
- 100 practice of geology; and
- 101 (e) Geologic work which does not affect the public
- 102 welfare as specified under subsection (3)(d) of this section.
- 103 (6) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to permit the
- 104 practice of engineering by a geologist.
- 105 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 106 and after its passage.
