## SENATE BILL NO. 2670

1 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO DEVISE 2 AND IMPLEMENT A GENERAL EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMA PROGRAM FOR PREGNANT 3 TEENAGERS, TO BE BROADCAST ON MISSISSIPPI EDUCATIONAL TELEVISION; 4 TO AMEND SECTION 37-63-17, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE 5 THE AUTHORITY FOR EDUCATIONAL TELEVISION TO ASSIST IN DEVELOPMENT 6 OF THAT PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

7 SECTION 1. The State Department of Education is hereby designated as the state agency responsible for the administration 8 9 and supervision of a general equivalency diploma curriculum to be broadcast on Mississippi Educational Television for the benefit of 10 11 pregnant teenagers desiring to obtain a general equivalency diploma. The State Department of Education is hereby authorized 12 to establish an office of televised GED curriculum within the 13 framework of the State Department of Education for the purpose of 14 developing standards, procedures and criteria for the 15 administration and supervision of a statewide program for pregnant 16 17 teenagers to obtain a general equivalency diploma, and shall 18 assume the further responsibility for promoting a statewide effort to publicize the availability of this resource for pregnant teens. 19 SECTION 2. Section 37-63-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 20 21 amended as follows: 37-63-17. (1) The Mississippi Authority for Educational 22 23 Television is empowered to provide noncommercial production or reproduction services for other public agencies and may collect 24 25 the costs of providing the services from the public agency plus a 26 separate equipment usage fee in an amount determined by the 27 authority and based upon the equipment used. The costs shall be

28 deposited to the credit of the authority. The separate equipment

S. B. No. 2670 99\SS02\R879 PAGE 1 29 usage fee shall be deposited in the Capital Equipment Replacement 30 Revolving Fund.

31 (2) The Authority for Educational Television may establish a Capital Equipment Replacement Revolving Fund into which shall be 32 33 deposited equipment usage fees collected under subsection (1) and 34 funds from other sources designated for deposit in the Capital 35 Equipment Replacement Revolving Fund. The authority may expend monies from the Capital Equipment Replacement Revolving Fund 36 37 subject to appropriation therefor by the Legislature to purchase technical equipment for operating the educational radio and 38 television facilities. 39

40 (3) The Authority for Educational Television shall cooperate
41 with the State Department of Education in developing for broadcast
42 a general equivalency diploma curriculum for the benefit of
43 pregnant teenagers desiring to obtain a general equivalency
44 diploma as required by Section 1 of Senate Bill No. 2670, 1999

46 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
