SENATE BILL NO. 2691

AN ACT TO CODIFY SECTION 37-143-12, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 2 TO PROVIDE A SCHOOL DISTRICT TEACHER-SCHOLAR GRANT PROGRAM TO 3 PROVIDE INCENTIVE SCHOLARSHIPS TO QUALIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT 4 EMPLOYEES TO TAKE COLLEGE COURSEWORK LEADING TO TEACHER 5 CERTIFICATION IF THE PERSON AGREES TO TEACH IN MISSISSIPPI TO 6 PLACE CONDITIONS ON SUCH SCHOLARSHIPS AND PROVIDE FOR CONVERSION 7 INTO LOANS IF THE GRANTEE DOES NOT MEET SUCH CONDITIONS; AND FOR 8 RELATED PURPOSES.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
10 SECTION 1. The following provision shall be codified as
11 Section 37-143-12, Mississippi Code of 1972:

12 <u>37-143-12.</u> (1) The Legislature finds that there continues to exist a critical shortage of teachers in many areas and 13 14 communities of Mississippi. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Legislature to attract the highest calibre 15 students into the teaching profession and to retain qualified 16 17 school district employees by awarding incentive grants to persons 18 declaring an intention to serve in the teaching field and who 19 actually render service to the state while possessing a regular teaching certificate with an appropriate major or subject area of 20 21 concentration.

(2) There is hereby established the "School District23 Employee Teacher-Scholar Grant Fund."

(3) To the extent of appropriations available, residents of the State of Mississippi who are presently employed by a public school district and have graduated from an accredited program of secondary education and who have expressed in writing a present intention to teach in (a) a critical teacher shortage area or subject area of concentration, or (b) a critical teacher shortage

S. B. No. 2691 99\SS06\R926 PAGE 1 30 geographic area section of the state, shall be eligible for a 31 grant under this program to be applied to the costs of their 32 college education.

(4) A freshman establishing initial eligibility shall be
eligible for a maximum of four (4) annual grants. Upper-class
students shall be eligible for grants for each remaining year of
study. To maintain eligibility, a student shall be enrolled in at
least six (6) credit hours per semester.

38 (5) The annual grant shall be Fifteen Thousand Dollars39 (\$15,000.00).

The repayment of the grants to persons is conditioned 40 (6) upon the grantees actually rendering service as certified teachers 41 42 in (a) a critical teacher shortage area or subject area of concentration, or (b) a critical teacher shortage geographic area 43 44 section of the state, as approved by the State Board of Education in Mississippi designated by the State Board of Education. 45 For each year of full-time teaching, as defined for these purposes by 46 the State Board of Education, repayment of twenty-five percent 47 (25%) of the total amounts of grants shall be forgiven. 48

49 (7) The State Board of Education shall promulgate guidelines 50 under which local superintendents of schools shall allow persons 51 accepted into the grant program to continue their employment 52 responsibilities with the school district under flexible working 53 hours, which, to the extent practicable, shall also enable the 54 person to attend college classes.

In the event that the grantee fails to perform the 55 (8) 56 conditions provided herein, then the grant shall be converted to a 57 loan and the grantee shall be responsible for repayment of the 58 grant. Persons failing to complete an appropriate program of 59 study shall immediately become liable to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning for the sum of all 60 61 outstanding loans, except in the case of a deferral of debt for cause by the board, after which period of deferral, study may be 62 63 resumed. Persons failing to meet teaching requirements in any 64 required semester shall immediately be in breach of contract and 65 become liable to the board for the amount of the corresponding 66 loan received, with interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan

No. 2691 99\SS06\R926 PAGE 2 67 rate at the time the breach occurs, except in the case of a 68 deferral of debt for cause by the board, after which period of 69 deferral teaching duties required hereunder will be resumed. If 70 the claim for payment of such loan is placed in the hands of an 71 attorney of collection after default, then the obligor shall be 72 liable for an additional amount equal to a reasonable attorney's 73 fee.

(9) A grant or loan made pursuant to this section shall not
be voidable by reason of the age of the borrower at the time of
receiving a loan.

(10) Failure to pay any loan and interest that becomes due shall be cause for the revocation of a person's teaching certificate by the State Department of Education.

80 (11) All monies repaid to the Board of Trustees of State 81 Institutions of Higher Learning hereunder shall be added to the 82 appropriations made for the purposes of this section, and said 83 appropriations shall not lapse.

84 (12) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher
85 Learning with the concurrence of the State Board of Education
86 shall jointly promulgate regulations necessary for the proper
87 administration of this section.

(13) If insufficient funds are available for the requested
grants to a qualified student during any fiscal year, the Board of
Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall make pro
rata reductions in the grants made to qualifying applicants.
Priority consideration shall be given to persons receiving
previous grants and participating in the program.

94 (14) The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 95 Learning shall make an annual report to the Legislature. Each 96 said report shall contain a complete enumeration of the board's 97 activities, grants or scholarships granted, names of persons to 98 whom granted and the institutions attended by those receiving the 99 same, the teaching location of applicants who have received their

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education and become certified teachers within this state as a 100 result of said grants and/or scholarships. The board shall make a 101 102 full report and account of receipts and expenditures for salaries 103 and expenses incurred under the provisions of this section. The 104 board shall, upon its records and any published report, 105 distinguish between those recipients who have breached their 106 contracts but with the board's permission who have paid their financial obligations in full, and those recipients who have 107 breached their contracts and remain financially indebted to the 108 109 state.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 1999.
