SENATE BILL NO. 2692

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-9-201 THROUGH 37-9-213, 1 2 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE BEGINNING TEACHER 3 MENTORSHIP PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY THE MISSISSIPPI TEACHER CENTER 4 SHALL ALSO BE FULLY APPLICABLE TO SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS, TO 5 PROVIDE FOR MENTOR ADMINISTRATORS, TO PROVIDE THAT RETIRED TEACHERS AND ADMINISTRATORS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO BE MENTOR б 7 TEACHERS OR ADMINISTRATORS AND TO AUTHORIZE ADDITIONAL 8 COMPENSATION FOR PERFORMING THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF A MENTOR 9 TEACHER OR ADMINISTRATOR; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 SECTION 1. Section 37-9-201, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 12 13 37-9-201. As used in Sections 37-9-201 through 37-9-213: "Beginning teacher <u>or administrator</u>" means a 14 (a) 15 teacher or administrator who: 16 (i) Possesses a teaching <u>or administrator</u> license issued by the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, 17 18 Certification and Licensure and Development; (ii) Is employed at least half time, primarily as 19 a classroom teacher or administrator, by a school district; and 20 (iii) Has taught fewer than ninety (90) 21 consecutive days, or one hundred eighty (180) days total, as a 2.2 23 licensed teacher or administrator in any public school. 24 "District" means any local school district. (b) 25 (C) "Formal assistance" means a program provided by a mentor teacher or administrator to a beginning teacher or 26 administrator that includes, but is not limited to, direct 27 classroom or administrative observation and consultation; 28 assistance in instructional or administrative planning and 29 30 preparation; support in implementation and delivery of classroom

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instruction or administration and other assistance intended to 31 32 enhance the professional performance and development of the 33 beginning teacher or administrator. "Mentor teacher" or "administrator" means a teacher 34 (d) 35 or administrator who: 36 (i) Possesses a standard teaching personnel 37 service or administrative license issued by the Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, Certification and Licensure 38 39 and Development; Is employed at the time of selection under 40 (ii) contract primarily as a classroom teacher by a school district in 41 this state or is retired; 42 43 (iii) Has successfully taught for three (3) or more years as a licensed teacher or administrator in any public 44 45 school; 46 (iv) Has been selected and trained as described in Section 37-9-211; and 47 (v) Has demonstrated mastery of teaching or 48 administrative skills and subject matter knowledge. 49 50 "Teacher or administrator" means a licensed (e) employee of a local school district who has direct responsibility 51 52 for instruction, coordination of educational programs or supervision of teachers and who is compensated for services from 53 public funds. 54 Section 37-9-203, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 55 SECTION 2. amended as follows: 56 57 37-9-203. The Legislature finds that: The quality of teaching and school administration 58 (a) 59 in the public schools is of vital importance to the future of this 60 state; This state has a special interest in insuring that 61 (b) 62 the induction of beginning teachers and administrators into their profession is conducive to their professional growth and 63 64 development; and 65 (C) The formal assignment of mentor 66 teachers/administrators who have demonstrated mastery of teaching 67 skills and subject matter knowledge should substantially improve the induction and professional growth of beginning teachers and 68 S. 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69 <u>administrators</u> in this state, as well as provide mentor

70 teachers/administrators with additional and valuable opportunities

71 to enhance their own professional growth.

72 SECTION 3. Section 37-9-205, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 73 amended as follows:

37-9-205. (1) The Mississippi Teacher Center of the State
Department of Education shall establish a beginning
teacher/administrator support program to provide eligible
beginning teachers/administrators in this state with continued and
sustained support from a formally assigned mentor
teacher/administrator during the first full year of
teaching/administrating.

81 (2) After the 1992-1993 school year, any district is
82 eligible to participate in the beginning teacher/administrator
83 support program.

84 (3) Two (2) or more districts may operate jointly a
85 beginning teacher<u>/administrator</u> support program if they meet all
86 the requirements of Sections 37-9-201 through 37-9-213.

87 (4) Educational consortia established for approved
88 teacher/administrator education programs pursuant to rules of the
89 Mississippi Teacher Center are eligible to operate a beginning
90 teacher/administrator support program to serve beginning
91 teachers/administrators in a participating school district.

92 (5) To the extent practicable, school districts may
93 coordinate with institutions of higher education in the design,
94 implementation and evaluation of mentorship programs.

95 SECTION 4. Section 37-9-207, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 96 amended as follows:

97 37-9-207. Each district that wishes to participate in the 98 beginning teacher/administrator support program shall submit a 99 formal application to the Mississippi Teacher Center no later than 100 September 15 of each school year, according to rules of the 101 Mississippi Teacher Center. By that date, districts shall inform 102 the department of:

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(a) The names of all eligible beginning

104 teachers/administrators employed by the district and a description 105 of their teaching/administering assignments and extracurricular 106 duties;

107 (b) The names of mentor teachers/administrators 108 selected by a district and a description of their 109 teaching/administrative assignments and the endorsement area in 110 which they are certified to teach/administer;

(c) A description of the content and calendar of the proposed beginning teacher/administrator support program. The program must provide a minimum of ninety (90) hours of direct contact between mentor teachers/administrators and beginning teachers/administrators, including observation of or assistance with classroom teaching <u>or administration</u>, or both, during the school day;

(d) A description of the amount and nature of each eligible beginning teacher's/administrator's classroom and extracurricular duties and assurance that these duties are not unreasonable for a beginning teacher/administrator; and

(e) A certification that no eligible beginning
teacher/administrator is or may be misassigned outside the
teacher's/administrator's endorsement area, except as provided for
by rules of the Mississippi Teacher Center.

SECTION 5. Section 37-9-209, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

37-9-209. After consulting with representatives of teachers,
administrators, school boards, schools of education, the
institutions of higher learning and such others as it considers
appropriate, the Mississippi Teacher Center shall develop or
approve workshops to provide training for mentor
teachers/administrators and beginning teachers/administrators.
SECTION 6. Section 37-9-211, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

136 37-9-211. The selection, nature and extent of duties of S. B. No. 2692 99\SS02\R961 PAGE 4 137 mentor teachers/administrators shall be determined by the school 138 district. The following guidelines shall apply:

(a) No teacher<u>/administrator</u> shall be designated as a
mentor teacher<u>/administrator</u> unless willing to perform in that
role;

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143 (b) Each mentor teacher/administrator shall complete 144 successfully a training workshop provided or approved by the 145 Mississippi Teacher Center prior to participating in the beginning 146 teacher/administrator support program;

147 (c) If a mentor teacher/administrator receives
148 additional release time to support a beginning
149 teacher/administrator, it is expected that the total workload of
150 other teachers/administrators regularly employed by the school
151 district should not increase in any substantial manner.

152 (d) To the extent of appropriations specifically made 153 by the Legislature for that purpose, mentor teachers and 154 administrators shall be awarded additional compensation for 155 performing their duties and responsibilities under this section. 156 SECTION 7. Section 37-9-213, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 157 amended as follows:

37-9-213. The Mississippi Teacher Center shall be
responsible for the regular and ongoing evaluation of the
beginning teacher/administrator support program and may contract
for such evaluation. The evaluation shall include, but not be

limited to, assessments of the following:

(a) A survey and follow-up of all eligible mentor
teachers <u>and administrators</u> and beginning teachers <u>and</u>
<u>administrators</u> and appropriate district officials, to assess
satisfaction with and the effectiveness of the beginning teacher
<u>and administrator</u> support program;

168 (b) The amount and quality of the contact time between169 mentor teachers/administrators and beginning

170 teachers/administrators;

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(c) The effectiveness of workshops and other training 171 required under Sections 37-9-201 through 37-9-211; 172 173 (d) The effectiveness of the mentor program in 174 enhancing the professional development and retention of new teachers/administrators in the district; and 175 176 (e) The desirability of extending this assistance program to students participating in graduate level 177 teacher/administrator preparation programs similar to those which 178 have been proposed by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions 179 of Higher Learning. \* \* \* 180 \* \* \* 181 182 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from

183 and after July 1, 1999.
